SFNL Celebrates Pride

I am delighted to advise that this weekend the Southern Football Netball League is the first community football and netball competition in Australia to formally recognise and celebrate diversity and inclusion in sport with a dedicated League-wide Pride Round.

The League announced earlier this year that it was formally including LGBTI+ communities in its Social Charter, with the themed Pride Round a practical way of reinforcing the SFNL's position on LGBTI+ inclusion.

This weekend 34 clubs, around 4000 participants from 100 football team and 32 finals netball teams have the opportunity to celebrate Pride through several initiatives across the weekend.

All Women's and Senior Men's football players, and all netballers have been provided rainbow-coloured laces to wear in their boots or runners for their matches. In addition, thanks to Council support, all SFNL football grounds in the competition have been painted with rainbow 50m arcs in a show of support for the LGBTI+ community.

The Pride Round comes following the success of last year's Pride Shield Match between St Kilda City and St Pauls Football Netball Clubs. The two clubs will again take part in a marquee match for the inaugural Pride Cup on Saturday 12 August, with a special social event at Peanut Farm Reserve before the Division 1 Senior match, where goal umpires will be waving rainbow coloured flags.

The Pride Cup social event, to be hosted by MC Leesa Catto, will feature several high-profile guest speakers and panellists, including Minister for Equality Martin Foley, LGBTI+ Advocates Jason Ball and Tynan Winmar, Stand Up Events CEO Angie Green, beyondblue

ambassador Maria Katsonis, Proud 2 Play's Emily Rowe and St Kilda Football Club star Sam Gilbert.

While on the journey of inclusion in sport, it is important that we continue to communicate why we are doing this.

Some key statistics from the Out on the Fields1 and beyondblue2 studies:

- 87% of young gay Australians who play sport feel forced to completely, or partially, hide their sexuality;¹
- 80% of all participants said they have witnessed or experienced homophobia in sport;¹
- Same-sex attracted Australians have up to 14 times higher rates of suicide attempts than their heterosexual peers;²

The SFNL is a firm believer that every individual should feel safe and welcome to be themselves within the League, and we hope that the inaugural Pride Round will further enhance the SFNL's standing as a truly inclusive community sporting organisation.

The SFNL is proud to embrace diversity and equality, including LGBTI+ communities, and acknowledges that everyone who is involved within any level of sport, either as a player, official or supporter, should be able to do so regardless of their sexuality.

In addition, we strive to create an environment throughout the League where members of the LGBTI+ community feel they are not only welcome, but have the opportunity to play key roles.

Through the adoption of this inaugural Pride Round, the aim is to help raise awareness that discrimination can have an extremely serious impact on a person's mental well-being and we are working diligently to ensure that this doesn't occur within the SFNL community.

It has been well known that the SFNL and clubs have worked hard on positive cultural change in recent times. This is another step forward to positively change the community culture and making sport more inclusive for everyone.



ROUND 15 REVIEW

Mordialloc 13.10 (88) def Bentleigh 6.6 (42)

The Bloods continued its charge towards the minor premiership with a commanding 46-point victory over the improving Bentleigh at Ben Kavanagh Reserve

Despite Mordi heading into their home clash as heavy favourites, the undermanned Demons put up a tremendous fight in the first half and especially in the opening stanza - to stay within nine points at the long break in blustery conditions.

But the hosts use the wind to full advantage in premiership quarter. booting four unanswered goals to put Bentleigh to the sword.

Ultimately the second half proved the difference, with seven goals to one seeing Mordialloc home comfortably.

Danny Nicholls continued his stellar form, botting three goals for the winners in another outstanding midfield display, while Aaron Kneebone and Justin Summons were also superb in the Bloods' victory.

Ruckman Mitch Smart continues to put forward his name as one of the recruits of the season, again being named the Demons' best ahead of Liam Hogton-Hewish and Justin Hall. Captain Tom Backman also excelled in his 150th game for the club.

East Malvern 11.15 (81) def Port Melbourne Colts 3.4 (22)

East Malvern bounced back from its disappointing loss to the Saints the previous week, thumping the Colts by 59 points at the Zoo.

It proved to be another dirty day for Port, whose deficiencies up forward were laid bare as they were kept goalless for three quarters.

The Panthers squandered several chances to build a commanding quarter time lead, and three second-term goals to the visitors allowed them back into the contest. However, East Malvern tightened the screws after the long break and conceded just two behinds for the remainder of the game.

Nathan Henley's proficiency in front of goal was highlighted by another five-goal bag, while Nathan Robinson, Luke Duffy and the diminutive Isaac McCrimmon were also influential.

The Colts, meanwhile, were well served by Jordan Cotton, Will Cardwell and co-captain Stacey Massis.

St Pauls 8.7 (55) def by Cheltenham 8.13 (61)

Cheltenham have all but ended the Dogs' hopes of claiming the minor premiership after pulling off a stunning boilover at the Kennel.

St Pauls lacked the effervescence we have come to expect from them this year, while Cheltenham played like a side with nothing to lose as it snuck home by six points in a thrilling encounter.

The Rosellas took the advantage early, slamming on four goals in the opening stanza to race to a 21-point lead at the first change, which forced the Dogs to play catch up footy for the remained of the

And it proved to be a closer contest than it perhaps should have been, with Chelt's wasteful 1.7 second term a missed opportunity to put the game beyond the reach of the third-placed Dogs by half time.

The second half proved a tough old arm-wrestle, but Cheltenham held the pressing St Pauls at bay to clinch a narrow six-point victory - their sixth win of the year.

It was the Rosella's big boys in Sean McLaren and Chris Graham that helped will their side over the line, with Ange Soldatos and Jarryd Bloink also in the thick of the action.

Nick Halliday was clearly the best for the home side, booting a gamehigh four goals, while Alex Spencer and Connor Byrne also impressed.

Oakleigh District 5.7 (37) def by Dingley 12.12 (84)

Over at Princes Highway Reserve, Dingley proved too slick for the Oaks, running out winners by 47 points.

The Dingoes' pressure around the contest ensured they held the upper hand early, booting the only goal of the first quarter and a further four in the second to put a decisive gap on their opponent in what was a low-scoring contest.

Oakleigh District fought hard to bring the margin back to just three goals at the final change, but that was as close as they could get. Dingley broke the shackles in the final term, booting 6.6 (including the first five majors of the quarter) to double its three-quarter time score and run out comfortable victors.

Co-captains Jackson Peet and Trav La Rocca led from the front to help orchestrate Dingley's win, while Chris Horton-Milne was constantly in the thick of the action. Cal McQueen, the Dingoes' only multiple goalkicker, finished with four to remain in the frame for a second straight Division 1 Superboot award.

Paul Fermanis and Luke Casey were the best for the Districts and former Dingo Jake Mullen kicked three goals in another impressive outing.

Clayton 4.9 (33) def by St Kilda City 14.12 (96)

The Saints' march to September continues to gather momentum as it dispatched Clayton by 63 points in a scrappy contest at Meade Reserve

A seven-goal-to-one first half had St Kilda City installed as 40-point leaders by half time, but a more competitive second half that yielded three goals ultimately limited the damage for the Clays.

Harry Czarnecki and Matt Runnells led the way for the winners, while Beau Runnells, who returned to the senior line up for the first time since Round 5, was one of the Saints' five multiple goalkickers.

With the top three teams all odds-on to secure the double chance, the four-way battle is heating up for the two remaining finals spots, and several games this week may go a long way to determining who will extend their season post Round 18.

Bentleigh V Oakleigh District (Bentleigh Reserve)

This week is essentially a mini-elimination final for Bentleigh as it hosts fellow finals aspirant Oakleigh District at Arthur Street.

A game and percentage behind the fifth-placed Oaks, a loss here would ensure the Demons' September fate is reliant as much on other results as it is on a win over East Malvern next week, a difficult enough task in isolation

A win here is just as important for Oakleigh with crunch matches against Mordialloc and the Panthers to close out the home and away season.

Both sides appear pretty evenly matched, which means we will likely see a hard-fought, thrilling contest, Bentleigh would be acutely aware of the situation that confronts them, and if they can get close to a full-strength side out on the park, they will be good enough to keep their season well and truly alive with a narrow victory at home.



The victory was their second over a top-three opponent, with the Rosellas shock winners in their previous encounter with Mordialloc back in Round 7.

So much has transpired for both clubs since that fateful afternoon, and the Bloods would be champing at the bit to exact revenge on Chelt. Sitting pretty atop the Division 1 ladder, and in the box seat to claim the minor premiership, Mordi are very well placed to do just that.

Through the agency of their hard-bodied ball winners, Mordialloc should get the chocolates, but the Rosellas will make them earn it.

Port Melbourne Colts V Clayton (JL Murphy Reserve)

Port but will be looking to snap a seven-match losing streak on Saturday when the winless Clayton comes to town.

The Colts have averaged just 40 points for per game in that time, and have sorely missed star goalkicker Mitch Clarke, who injured his ACL in Round 3.

The Saints are knocking on the door of the top five, and need to continue to win games to keep the pressure on the sides above it. With the third-placed St Pauls entering this clash on the back of two straight losses, City will no doubt feel it is a massive chance to cause another upset here.

St Pauls, meanwhile, have performed so well throughout the season, it's hard to envisage them dropping three in a row. The Dogs will have too much class through the midfield for their Saints counterparts, and should sneak home in a close one.

Dingley V East Malvern (Souter Oval)

Despite several star players still to return to the senior line up, Dingley continues to get the job done week in, week out as it chases

While its performances throughout the year have again been of the exemplary standard we have come to expect from the Dingoes, its form over the last few weeks has been devastating, winning its last six games by an average of nearly 10 goals.

East Malvern, meanwhile, clings to fourth spot on the back of its healthy percentage, but needs to keep the wins coming to ensure it sees September action.

- All players must play a minimum FIVE UNDER 19S HOME AND AWAY MATCHES to qualify for UNDER 19S grade finals
- A player eligible to play Senior, Reserve, Thirds or Under 19s grade finals may only play ONE MATCH per finals round.

Player Qualification for SFNL Finals Series THIRDS GRADE

- All players must play a minimum SIX HOME AND AWAY MATCHES (in six separate scheduled rounds), of which at least FOUR have been in the THIRDS competition, to qualify for THIRDS grade finals.
- A player who plays in 10 OR MORE Senior and/or Reserve (added or separate) matches is INELIGIBLE to play THIRDS grade finals.
- A player can be selected in SENIOR, RESERVE or THIRDS grade in ALL DIVISIONS if all grades are playing on the same weekend provided they have played SIX HOME AND AWAY MATCHES (in six separate scheduled rounds).
- A player eligible to play Senior, Reserve, Thirds or Under 19s grade finals may only play ONE MATCH per finals round.

Player Qualification for SFNL Finals Series SENIOR/RESERVE GRADE

 A player must play a minimum SIX HOME AND AWAY MATCHES (in six separate scheduled rounds), to qualify for SENIOR or RESERVE grade finals in ALL DIVISIONS.

- A player must play FOUR of the SIX HOME AND AWAY MATCHES (in separate scheduled rounds), in the Reserves and/or Thirds to be ELIGIBLE to play RESERVE grade finals in ALL DIVISIONS.

Player Qualification for SFNL Finals Series WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT COMPETITION

- A player must play a minimum THREE HOME AND AWAY MATCHES (in three separate scheduled rounds), to qualify for Women's finals.
- A player who plays in SEVEN OR MORE matches in a higher grade is INELIGIBLE to play WOMEN'S finals.
- o A player may only play in ONE MATCH per finals round.

2017 SFNL FINALS -RULES AND CONDITIONS

FALCONS JET SUPPORTING PRIDE / WILL HUNTER

This weekend, the Southern Football Netball League will break new ground as it becomes the first organisation in Australia to extend a celebration of pride across an entire league of football.

The inaugural SFNL Pride Round is another step forward in the League's desire to stamp out homophobia in sport, and create an environment where members of the LGBTI+ community feel they are not only welcome, but have the opportunity to play key roles within the SFNL.

And it is a cause with particular resonance for Endeavour Hills midfield are Ashlee Ladson

The bubbly, charismatic and down to earth 26-year-old is one of many gay female footballers around the country, and throughout her career, she has witnessed first-hand not only the gradual cultural shift in general attitudes towards female footballers, but also the acceptance of players of non-hetero and gender diverse backgrounds within the sphere of women's football.

Ladson has been involved in football for close to 20 years, and admits the sport has always been a big passion of hers from a very young age.

"I grew up around (footy with) my cousins, my dad, my brother, kind of always been around footy clubs and realised pretty quickly that they were a great place to be," Ladson said.

"I always had a footy in my hand and it was pretty natural for me to choose to play football. I played soccer for a little bit, but always, always wanted to play football competitively."

Ladson began kicking a footy around with her cousins at the tender age of six, but it wasn't until high school that she was given the opportunity to play football at a competitive level. She played school football with Mount Lilydale from Year 9 to Year 12, a stint that included two narrow grand final losses to rivals Luther.

She commenced her senior football career with St John's Old Collegians in 2010, starting out on a wing before transferring across Hallam in 2013. Ladson joined Endeavour Hills in 2015 and quickly established herself as a key component in the Falcons' midfield.



Initially drawn to the uniqueness and competitive aspects of football, it was the comradery and friendships she has made during her career that has ensured her long-term involvement in the game.

And Ladson has preserved with her career, despite some raised eyebrows and judgements from narrow-minded sections of the community.

Ladson recalled several past instances where people, often complete strangers, would give her odd looks and make sly comments when they learned of her chosen sporting pursuit, which she attributed to the stigma that was previously attached to senior women's football.

"(There was) the stigma of women's footy, if you play women's footy then that must mean that you've got short hair, you've got tattoos, and you must be a lesbian or something, and they make assumptions of how I live my life, and how my friends live their lives when in actual fact, all we are doing is playing football," Ladson explained.

"Yeah, it's not great, but it definitely teaches you how to be a positive person and not judge other people.

"To be honest, I wasn't surprised (by it). I think I was old enough to, not expect it, but not be completely blow out of the water by it."

Ladson believes the introduction of the AFLW has gone a long way to changing both the prejudices and perceptions of women's football, as well as long-held traditional stereotypes of female players.

The elite women's league has also done so much for members of LBBTI+ community, with many stories of several openly gay AFLW players being shared through mainstream media channels, and Ladson hopes that this level of openness and acceptance can transcend into the realms of men's football sooner rather than later.

For Ladson personally, her sexuality is not a topic of discussion that gets much air time. That's not because she deliberated seeks to hide it, but because she doesn't view it as an important enough aspect of her life to be regularly brought up in conversation.

"I wouldn't say I am openly gay or anything like that, but the important people in my life know, my parents, a few cousins I've told, my brother, a few best friends here at the club. And then after that I don't tell everybody because it's just who I am so I don't make it a big deal," Ladson said.

"(My sexuality) is not 100% who I am, it's only a part of who I am, so it's not a big deal."

Ladson struggles to recall the moment she came out to the key people in her life with any clarity, further highlighting the little relevance she attaches to her sexuality, although she reveals that her parents had placed a greater emphasis on her happiness than her sexual preference.

However, she does recall grappling with initial thoughts of confusion and uncertainty around her sexuality, a relatable experience for many in the LGBTI+ community, and particularly those in their teenage years.

Ladson credits her closest friends, to whom she came out first, for helping her process her "muddled" thoughts and alleviate a lot of her stress

"I didn't know (my sexuality) until a late stage of my life, maybe five years ago or something like that," she revealed

"Some people know when they are five years old, and I didn't know how everybody is different. That's what threw me a lot, because I was 19, 20 and I was like, well, what the hell has been going on for 20 years? I don't understand.

"It was really confusing. And then it was like, what am I supposed to do? Who do I even tell? Are people going to think I am crazy?

"I tried to figure it out myself, but I had really good people around me that have different experiences in life and I kind of spoke to them because I was pretty stressed about it.

"They calmed me down and said, 'you don't have to put yourself into a box and be that person for the rest of your life. How you feel now, you could feel differently later, (so) don't stress'. That was really, really helpful."

Homophobic slurs have been identified as a key reason why members of the LGBTI+ community are reluctant to engage in sporting activities. And while its use is not as common on the field in women's football, it has been traditionally prevalent in the male sporting vernacular.

Off-field, too, its impact is widespread. Ladson herself has been the recipient of homophobic language, and although it was used to a large extend out of ignorance more than malice, she hopes the community can be further educated about its negative effects.

"The word, gay, is it a bad thing to use that word? It shouldn't be, but unfortunately people do use it in a bad way," Ladson said.

"And I've snapped at people before and told them to stop using that word, because it's stupid, and they didn't know that I was gay."

The inaugural season of the AFLW was a resounding success in terms of helping bring about wider acceptance of non-hetero and gender diverse people, and Ladson believes if the AFL can lend their visible support to the cause, then it will go a long way towards normalising homosexuality within the community and ensuring members of the LGBTI+ community feel welcomed in sport.



In the interim, Ladson has lent her support to this weekend's history SFNL Pride Round and sees it having a massive impact at a grassroots level, particularly in terms of breaking down homophobic barriers in male-dominated sports.

"(The SFNL Pride Round) will be huge for a number of reasons, but the biggest perspective I would notice is going to a footy match or anything in community and seeing someone hold their partner's hand or kiss on the cheek and not (having anyone) say anything unless it's positive," she said.

"I think it will give more people the courage to turn around and be like, 'why are you making these statements, they are just people?' Seeing it in everyday life, like a football match, I think it would be huge, absolutely huge."

Disappointingly, the Falcons' star midfielder will likely miss the opportunity to take the field this weekend as she is scheduled to undergo a knee reconstruction on Monday. However, Ladson will instead look to contribute off the field, having immersed herself in an assistant coaching role since rupturing her ACL earlier in the season.

The Endeavour Hills Senior Football Club has been a massive supporter of the SFNL Pride Round since day one, with the Falcons' Women's Football Coordinator, Gail Worsley, leading the charge.

And the club's stance is yet another example of the unity and support that football can provide and has filled Ladson with a great deal of pride.

"Gail's been great, everyone else has been great... It makes me proud because it shows me personally that I have got good people around me and there's good people at the club," Ladson said.





The composition of the 2017 finals has been determined. For the elite of the eight divisions the battle for glory over the next three weeks commences in earnest. For the rest, it is time to retreat to the caves and begin hibernation until April rolls around once more.

In Division 1, Keysborough and Heatherton White were the two sides that could take fourth place, starting the round on equal points and separated by 6.69%. Keysborough held the percentage advantage but also had the trickier match against the improving St Pauls, and this game on the Friday night contained guite a few twists and turns. The Burras took the early initiative, and looked for all the world as though they wanted to ensure that the contest was put to bed before the Heatherton girls even took to the court. However, from an 11-goal deficit the St Pauls machine kicked into gear. Grace Healey and Alice Williams had each enjoyed a fine second half to the season. Here they found their shooting range and fired their side into a two goal lead, but just when Keysborough looked like they were toast they found their second wind and steadied to take a win by 42-37.

This left Heatherton White needing to beat Bentleigh by something in the order of 42 goals to unseat the Burras, and at half time this looked a definite possibility. Bentleigh had several regulars missing and, though as game as they come, the game was done as a contest very early in the piece. It was only the margin that was in question, and when White extended their eight-goal guarter time lead to 29-12 at the half, they will have felt as though they were on course. White set about scoring as many as they could, but as so often happens when all-out attack is the aim, there are goals at the other end. White may have scored 17 goals in the third guarter but Bentleigh responded with 10 of their own. Everything had to go right in the last term if White were to have a future, and despite the efforts of the excellent Kate Moffitt and Maggie Carlon in mid-court, and Mia McMillan and Taylor Butterworth in attack, every goal that went in at the other end made the task more difficult. A White win by 60-32 meant that Keysborough take on Caulfield in next week's elimination final.

Caulfield didn't give Heatherton Black everything their own way, especially early in the piece. Their mid-court were desperate and hungry, their shooters accurate and Phoebe Naughton gave Rahni Samason one of her more difficult afternoons of this year's campaign. Black recovered from their initial shock and tuned up for the finals with a 48-39 win. Dingley thus needed to beat St Kilda City to make sure of the minor premiership, and whilst City were keen to ensure that they gave their last match a big shake, this never really appeared likely. It was an even contest for most of the first half, but Dingley had too much at stake to drop this one and as the match wore on, they pulled away to win by 37-21.

Dingley therefore end the season at the summit of the Division 1 table on 54 points, from Heatherton Black on 50 and Caulfield 40. Keysborough finish on 28 points, shading Heatherton White, also on 28, via percentage. St Kilda City were a threat for long periods, but faded to lose their last five matches and end on 20 points. Conversely, St Pauls improved greatly as the season wore on to finish with 16 points, while Bentleigh recorded just the one win whilst pushing many higher credentialled opponents, and finished with four.

The Division 2 top four has been apparent now for some weeks. Heatherton have taken all before them, and their 49-31 defeat of Bentleigh completes their unbeaten season whilst consigning Bentleigh to seventh place. Dingley kept second spot and left Mordialloc second last with their 40-22 victory, while St Kilda City's 20-17 eclipse of South Yarra ensured that they finish their season on a high while not being able to catch South Yarra for fourth spot. Third-placed Caulfield's bye allows them to hit the first week of finals rested and ready.

Division 3 came down to the last round of the season. St Kilda City played a white-hot Clayton side and were up against it from the jump, in deficit by six goals at guarter time and a decisive eighteen at the half. Although they won the second half it was only enough to reduce the final margin to 38-21. Sadly this cost City their spot in the finals. Keysborough had no trouble with CPL in winning by 49-22, and their 28 points from 13 games was enough to unseat St Kilda City (30 points from 14 games), by the barest possible margin - 2.15 points per match against 2.14. Meanwhile, Black Rock turned around a 22-16 half time deficit to defeat Heatherton by 33-31. This means that Dingley, who had the bye, took second spot from Heatherton despite not setting foot on the court, their 3.23 points per game eclipsing Heatherton's 3.14. In the weekend's other match, Lyndale completed their season in a positive fashion, being too good for Caulfield by 27-22.

Division 4 has been dominated by the two Dingley teams and the two from Heatherton, with these teams playing musical chairs in constantly changing position within the top four. However, when the music stopped this week it was Heatherton White that took top spot, relegating Dingley Gold to second spot by defeating them by 47-43. Dingley Red's 33-24 win over 10th-placed Caulfield kept Heatherton Black at bay despite their comfortable 40-17 win over South Yarra. Keysborough completed their commitments by walloping Black Rock by 45-10, while Mordialloc and St Kilda City can spend their summers reflecting on a thrilling 40-all draw.

Caulfield have been the dominant force in Division 5, and they were able to see off the challenge of a gallant Cheltenham outfit in Round 15 by 50-31. Main challengers Dingley were way too polished for Bentleigh in a 46-17 victory, while Lyndhurst mastered the tricky winds in their 60-23 win over Highett. This meant that Heatherton's 47-40 win over St Kilda City was not enough to take third spot. Skye's 36-29 win over East Brighton could not give them finals action but saw them finishing a creditable fifth, while St Pauls did not need to take the court, defeating Dandenong by forfeit.

When Heatherton's Division 6 side drew with Mount Waverley in Round 5, they were not to know that the two competition points gained would be enough to give them top spot when one less goal on the day would have relegated them to fourth. That is how close this division was at the top. Heatherton retained first place on 50 points with their 23-20 win over South Yarra. The other places in the top four were decided by percentage with the three other sides all finishing with 48 points. Dingley Red beat Mordialloc by 32-22 and take second, Dingley Gold's 44-19 win over Mount Waverley sees them in third, while Doveton take fourth after beating Lyndale by 43-22. Clayton's 34-30 loss to Aspendale does not stop them from being the best of the rest, while Hallam finished on an up-beat note by beating St Kilda City by 46-17.

Dingley have looked the team to beat in Division 7 from the jump, having only tasted defeat once. Fourth-placed Lyndhurst pushed them all the way in this round before finally succumbing by 23-20. Second-placed Oakleigh District tuned up for the big games to come with a crushing 52-19 defeat of

St Kilda City, while third placed CPL hit August running after seeing off Doveton by 43-34. Hampton can look forward to their end-of-season trip after their 21-9 eclipse of Chelsea Heights, while Murrumbeena were forced to forfeit, handing the four points in their match to East Brighton.

Keysborough's 39-17 win over fourth-placed Lyndhurst mean that they become the second side to complete the season without the bitter scent of defeat. Closest challengers Mordialloc had a comfortable 26-12 victory over Mount Waverley, while Dingley's surprise 26-24 reverse against a resurgent Caulfield was not enough to cost them third place. Hallam beat South Yarra by 37-19 to head the chasing pack. while Heatherton beat Black Rock by 21-17 and Dandenong had a 37-29 victory over Lyndale to complete their programme for season 2017.

The Cut and Drive bids all teams still in contention a successful finals campaign, whilst wishing all other teams and players a happy and safe off-season. We hope to see you all back in 2018

Fifteen rounds of cut and thrust is now done, and finals are among us. And as if to prove the theory that the more things change the more they stay the same, the Division 1 match-ups are exactly the same as in 2016: Dingley v Heatherton Black in the qualifying final, Caulfield v Keysborough in the elimination.

Dingley finished the regular season four points clear of the chasing pack, but it's important to note that the only team to take points from the Dingoes this season was the leading Heatherton side, a Round 3 draw being followed by a 47-31 Heatherton win in Round 13. It's obvious to say that to stop Heatherton you need to stop Rahni Samason and Nat Billings from scoring, but unless Dingley can restrict supply by getting over the Mifsuds and Steph Peacock in the mid-court, then Britt Goldsmith, Chloe Sinclair and Alicia Wise are in for a long afternoon. The work rate and creativity of Shae Wonnacott, Sara Merkus and Taylah Fiddes will need to be strong to give Jess Payne and Bridget Furphy enough opportunities for Dingley. Will the injured Sarah Fischer be back to help their cause? As always this will be a great clash but I can't go past Heatherton to go into the grand final first.

Keysborough needed extra time to end Caulfield's season on this day in 2016. Since then Keysborough have struggled to get their best side on the court, but have strengthened at the right time of the season. They will need all their key players firing if they are to trouble a Caulfield side that has recruited well and developed their younger players. The battles between Caulfield's Makayla Bulte and Keysborough's ultraconsistent Amy Burns; and the perpetual motion of Caulfield's Fotini Stavrou and Steph Clemons against Keysborough's Megan Kennedy and Courtney Nash will be worth watching, but it could be the premier defensive partnership of Alice Pohlner and Phoebe Naughton that tips the scales in Caulfield's favour. However, I expect this one to be in the balance right until the final siren.

Division 2 sees Heatherton looking to parlay an unbeaten regular season into a second successive Division 2 premiership. Dingley too have been unbeaten save for two reverses against Heatherton, and scorelines of 54-23 in Round 4 and 40-28 in Round 11 only serve to underline Heatherton's dominance. Sophie Bartlett's 507 goals have her outscoring all other sides in the division on her own (except for Dingley who are only four in front), but

the defensive axis of Belinda Kay and Kirsty Mann is every bit as important. Dingley's best bet is to hurt Heatherton going the other way, but it's hard not to see a Heatherton win here. The elimination final sees Division 2 newcomers Caulfield and South Yarra square off in a fascinating clash that is much harder to pick. Caulfield have a considerably stronger record than the Yarras in both attack and defence, and have won both encounters between the two sides this season with both games being played in particularly strong wind. Neither side comes into the game with particularly strong recent form behind them, but all things considered Caulfield look slightly the stronger here.

Dingley snatched second place in Division 3 with the aid of a surprise Black Rock win over Heatherton, and will fancy their chances of upsetting Clayton this week. They come in fresh from a Round 15 bye, and coach Mel Ades has them trained to the minute. Clayton, however, looks like a side with very few weaknesses. The Collins girls combine brilliantly and in Penny Townley and Taylah Mackie they possess two shooters that can hurt you from anywhere in the circle. Clayton may be a little too good here. Heatherton play Keysborough in the elimination final with the injustice of losing the double chance flaring their nostrils whilst their opponents needed to pull out all the stops to clinch fourth place in the last round. Keysborough may have momentum but they will need everything to go right to go to the second week of the play-offs. Heatherton won by 47-38 in their only clash this season, and I see a similar result here.

Division 4 has been dominated by the two Heatherton and the two Dingley sides. Heatherton White took top spot by beating Dingley Gold in the final round by 47-43. Heidi Samason put on a shooting masterclass in that game, netting 36 goals herself in a tricky wind. She may need to do the same again if the result is to be repeated. Dingley Red play Heatherton Black in the elimination final, with the free-scoring Heatherton side contrasting with the tighter, more miserly Dingley combination. Defensive strength tends to be paramount in the big matches, and I think Dingley Red may be in a good position to repeat their Round 13 victory over Heatherton Black.

Caulfield take on Dingley in the Division 5 qualifying final having lost but once in 2017, and that to a Dandenong side that are now nowhere to be seen back in Round 2. Barb Traeger leads a side with plenty of experience but still the speed and agility to trouble the

best sides in the division. Dingley come in on the back of four straight wins and will be confident that their best will be good enough, but it will take their very best to claim the win here. The loser will have the attacking forces of either Heatherton or Lyndhurst snapping at their heels. Key shooters Verity Sheppard and Melissa Mair both have over 500 goals to their credit this season for their respective sides - the team that feeds their shooters the best will get the chocolates here.

Division 6 is the tightest in the league, with all four sides being able to make a claim for competition favouritism. Heatherton and Dingley Red have won the right to take the crucial double chance. While Heatherton took top spot by two points, Dingley Red have often looked the most fluent side in the division. and won the only match between the two sides handsomely in Round 8. Dingley Red may have the game to win this one. There's no tomorrow for the loser between Dingley Gold and Doveton, nor is there a struck match between these two sides. They've not seen each other since Round 5 - even that was close with the Dingoes winning by two goals. With both sides having similar recent form, I'll toss a coin and say Dingley Gold.

Division 7 is one of the more interesting affairs in the SFNL. Dingley have led all the way and yet regular

division seven watchers still have queries about them. Oakleigh District are the main challengers - they have finished just short in both meetings this season but have looked very solid aside from that, and if there is an upset it might be here that it happens. The elimination final is between Carrum Patterson Lakes and Lyndhurst, with many analysts thinking that CPL could go all the way in the next three weeks. CPL has won their last four matches but their last loss was to a Lyndhurst side that have been around the mark all year. With little confidence, I'll tip CPL.

Division 8 sees Keysborough having been an impregnable force. They haven't looked like losing a match, with no side having got within 14 goals of them all season. They face Mordialloc having been the only side to beat the ladies in red all season. Of course, finals are a completely different game but it's hard to go past the Burras here. Dingley play Lyndhurst in the minor final with both club's seasons charting a similar course. Both sides started the season like rockets but their form in the second half of their season has been somewhat more shaky. Dingley appear to have the happy knack of winning the close games, and given that this is likely to be tight, they'll be my tip.
