Preliminary final day often proves to be the day that provides the greatest fare for the spectator. The quality is high amongst the competitors without the matches having quite the stress that one attaches to grand final day. And so it proved on season 2017's penultimate day, with some of the netball produced being of the sort that it was hard to know where to look next.

There were few better spectacles than that provided between the Division 1 combatants, as Dingley and Caulfield moved to end the argument as to what would be the game of the year. Dingley threw down the gauntlet from the opening centre pass, with Laura Piper taking the opening shot after just 10 seconds, but a minute was to elapse before Bridget Furphy put the first score on the board. Dingley had three goals on the board before Caulfield's first shot, and with Piper giving Phoebe Naughton a torrid start to the game got out to a 5-2 lead before the Bears began to roar. The Makayla Bulte-led mid-court began to get a foothold and fed Sophie O'Shea and Beth Miller to the extent that Caulfield led 10-8 at the first change. The second quarter was compulsory viewing as both sides thrust and parried with an intent that reflected the fact that the victor would get the chance to play off for the ultimate prize. Experience often counts for much in these situations. Shae Wonnacott and Alicia Wise worked their socks off for the Dingoes, pulling down numerous interceptions, but Caulfield had a real sniff of the kill and at 18-all at half time, no-one could pick a winner.

It was here that Caulfield started to make positional changes in an attempt to throw Dingley off their stride and break the game open. It would be sheer folly to speculate as to what would have happened had the formations remained as they were, but Tayla Fiddes began to run the show at wing attack and with Bridget Furphy playing the game of her life at goal attack. Dingley embarked on a run of goals from which Caulfield were never to recover. The further the quarter went. the more dominant the Dingoes looked and a 33-24 margin at the last change looked decisive. The large crowd started to get behind Caulfield as they threw all they had at Dingley, but for all their excellence Dingley kept their own score moving, and a final score of 48-38 was enough to send Dingley through with the faith that they can match the much-vaunted Heatherton Black in the competition decider.

Caulfield were able to exact some measure of revenge against Dingley in Division 2. It wasn't always this way as Dingley looked like the favourites that they were in the first guarter, leading 10-6 at the first change. The first five centre passes were converted but it was Dingley that were able to create the first break to get the score back to 12-10. Brie Cooper started completely running the match from wing attack and with Caitlyn Ashby and Hannah Shilling converting more shots than they missed Caulfield took the lead and got out as far as 15-13. Two goals from Penny Byers-Timms regained parity and some composure for Dingley but they were never to head Caulfield again.

The Bears led 19-16 at the half and completely dominated the third guarter. They started the guarter well to establish a solid lead and while Dingley had their share of possession. the shots refused to drop and the Caulfield defence were good enough to counter. Caulfield goal keeper Megan Ellett was putting together a best-on-court performance in collecting a series of rebounds and setting up numerous attacks of her own, and Caulfield had one foot in the Grand Final with a 32-19 three guarter time lead. With Jessica Haslem and Amber McHenry giving everything they had in the goal circle, Dingley scored the first three goals of the last term to briefly threaten an unlikely comeback, but the lead was too great and Caulfield were able to steady to record a 41-32 victory, and earn a shot at Heatherton for the title.

Few watchers thought that they would be watching Clayton play on Preliminary Final day. Their dominance this season led many to believe that they would remain an unstoppable force throughout the finals series. Player shortages cut deep at the worst possible time, but more so than that, they ran into a Keysborough combination on a huge roll and believing that they are a match for any side. Clayton began moving the ball with diagonal passes whilst Keysborough moved the ball in straight lines up the flanks, creating good opportunities for themselves and being very efficient around the perimeter of the goal circle. On the other hand, Keysborough's tight defence constantly pressured Clayton into error to the point that they conceded one solitary goal in the first term. It all further unravelled for Clayton in the second guarter as they could not convert the ball that they enjoyed into goals, despite looking like their old selves when moving the ball quickly. Keysborough kept their passes short and accurate. and went to the main break ahead by 15-7. Clayton needed to make their move in the third quarter, but could only square the term at seven goals each, and that was the end of the Clays as Keysborough dominated the final term to complete their fourth straight sudden-death victory by 39-18.

The all-Heatherton Division 4 encounter had none of the lack of intensity that so many intra-club clashes are marred by. Neither side showed any inclination to want to surrender to the other and, for the first time in the 2017 finals series, extra time was needed to separate the combatants. The early exchanges gave no clue as to the fare that was to follow as the battle-hardened White combination took a 14-9 quarter time lead over their young counterparts. The Black machine kicked into gear in the second term as they moved the ball through the mid-court with speed and precision, and Chelsev McAndrew and Sonina Terrakore were unerring in converting their deficit to a one-goal lead. White lacked drive into the goal ring in the third quarter, but began to steady late in the stanza as their mid-court started to gain some traction. A five-goal deficit was less than it might have been. and the hope that this gave White drove them through the last guarter. The younger Black side refused to be rattled

however, and when the final siren rang out there was still no resolution as the scoresheet read 45-all. It was Black that began extra-time stronger, but led by the indefatigable Yvonne McMillan the White mid-court would not be bowed, and will face Dingley Gold next week after a 54-53 victory.

The Division 5 Preliminary Final see-sawed throughout the day. Caulfield's attacking threat was evident early while Lyndhurst were prepared to be patient and pick the right pass, and after turning a four-goal quarter time deficit into a 22-20 half time lead, the Lightning will have been confident of finishing this final in front. The second half was a pulsating affair with first Melissa Mair and Narelle Hammond seizing the initiative for Lyndhurst, then Barb Traeger and Jodie Brown returning serve for Caulfield. At 39-all at the final change we were no closer to finding the winners than we were an hour earlier, and the last quarter saw one side then the other look the likely winners. However, at the last, Jude Glenny stepped up with a clutch of key interceptions for Caulfield, and they converted the last four goals of the match to deliver the Mumma Bears into the grand final via a 44-41 victory over a brave and unlucky Lyndhurst.

Heatherton were very disappointed by their showing in the Division 6 having been thoroughly beaten by Dingley Red. Here they were determined to take out their frustration out on Dingley Gold, and this was to prove a game too far for Alicia Wise's young charges. Heatherton took control early, working the ball from one end of the court to the other using quick hands and accurate passes whist being sure of shot.

Dingley had their moments, but were never able to head their Heatherton opponents, and they led at every change to complete a 44-32 victory to earn another shot at Dingley Red next week

Dingley were shocked by a fast-finishing Oakleigh District side in week one of the finals. Here they were in no mood to take any prisoners against Lyndhurst in an occasionally feisty Preliminary Final. Lyndhurst had as much ball as Dingley in the first quarter, but the Dingoes took their chances while the Lightning did not to trail 10-2 at guarter time. Dingley continued to move the ball quicker through the mid-court and their defensive strength caused doubt in the Lyndhurst attack, to lead 18-7 at half time and 27-10 at the last change. Lyndhurst played with more freedom in the final term, but the bird had flown, and Dingley scored a comfortable 33-19 win.

Mordialloc took on Dingley in Division 8, and in an open start Molly Stackpole took control of the mid-court for Mordialloc. Their shooters were fed a plethora of opportunities, and despite the efforts of a Mary Bose-led Dingley defence they took a 10-5 lead out of the first quarter. A cagey, defensive encounter ensued in the second and third guarters with goals at a premium, with the same five-goal margin being taken into the final stanza. The game opened up in the last quarter as both sides attacked knowing there would be no next week for the loser, but as strongly as Dingley performed, Mordialloc were able to score often enough to be comfortable. It was the ladies in red that were able to close out a 29-24 victory to give Mordialloc a Grand Final berth.

Division 1: Heatherton Black v Dingley

Meetings This Season: Second Semi Final [Heatherton Black 49-35] Round 13 (Heatherton Black 47-31) Round 3 (draw 52-52)

Dingley finished the regular season in pole position, but the one side they have been unable to defeat is Heatherton Black. Indeed, their draw in Round 3 this year is the only time they've been able to avoid defeat in the last seven meetings between the two competition heavyweights. Dingley will feel that this will count for little in the pressure cooker atmosphere that a grand final brings, and will take great confidence from their victory over Caulfield in a classic preliminary final. Their makeshift shooting combination stood up well against Caulfield's elite defenders, and Laura Piper and Bridget Furphy will need to play similar games if Dingley are to salute here.

Heatherton Black appear to have few weaknesses across the court. At each end of the court they have solidity and class: Rahni Samason and Nat Billings have been unstoppable on occasions in attack while in defence Kirsten Daley provides the solidity that gives their whole court faith. The Mifsud sisters have shepherded an at times young and inexperienced mid-court, and given them the solid base on which they have been able to thrive. This battle is likely to be decided in the middle. Taylah Fiddes and Nikki Tulley have both had excellent seasons playing around the experienced axis provided by Dingley stars Alicia Wise, Shae Wonnacott and Sara Merkus; they will need to be at their best to give their shooters enough ball to post a winning score.

Dingley won the Preliminary Final with 48 goals. They will need at least that many to avenge last season's grand final defeat and be crowned premiers. Can they do this? I'm not so sure, and will tip Heatherton Black to go back-to-back.





Division 2: Heatherton v Caulfield

Heatherton come into the Grand Final undefeated, while Caulfield have tasted defeat six times in their 15 outings. This may sound like a David v Goliath style battle, but don't be fooled, for if Caulfield can bring the intensity and sharpness that they showed in disposing of Dingley in the Preliminary Final, they can match any team. The first half of the Second Semi Final against Dingley showed up cracks in the Heatherton armour that hadn't been seen in matches past, and whilst the system

was able to be reset in the second half of that match the win was not Heatherton's most convincing.

To get over the top of the black and whites. Caulfield will need to put a lot of work into quelling the force of Sophie Bartlett, who has netted more goals on her own than the entire Caulfield side this season. The likes of captain Mandy Quinn and Jaime Regnier have done an excellent job in feeding her the opportunities to score; while a solid defence led by Kirsty Mann and Belinda Kay have been the tightest of any side in the division. Caulfield will pose a threat of their own, with Brie Cooper an imposing and creative wing attack, Caitlyn Ashby and Hannah Shilling in good shooting form, and Megan Ellett in fine fettle in defence.

Coach Sue Kimber will be looking for revenge here after Caulfield's loss in the Division 1 Preliminary Final. They will try and give Heatherton plenty to think about in attack, but I feel that posting a winning score in this match may be just beyond them. Heatherton to win here.





Division 3: Dingley v Keysborough

Dingley and Keysborough come into this decider having both defeated ladder leader Clayton. Dingley only took second spot on the ladder after Heatherton were eclipsed in the last round, while Keysborough needed to remain unbeaten after Round 12 just to play finals. This they duly did, and their bond as a team has only grown through playing, and winning, four virtual elimination finals. Neither of these sides rely on a particular star player, but have achieved success through each player doing their job and doing it well. The outcome of the game may depend on which shooter has the better day, with Alana Cooper for Dingley and Bianca Robinson for Keysborough having the responsibility of finishing the good work further up the court.

Keysborough have made a habit of proving me wrong as I've tipped against them right throughout the back end of this season. I can't help feeling that the run will end and that Dingley will take the prize here, but this Keysborough side has the momentum going with it, and I'm sure they'll be quick to tell me that I'm wrong again should they emerge victorious, and it would not come as the greatest shock if they did.

There is very little between these two sides as they meet again on the final day of the 2017 season. Dingley Gold took an early lead in their recent Semi Final, which Heatherton White could not pull back, but I wouldn't be taking too much notice of the margin in that encounter. This Heatherton White side is rich in experience and resilient in attitude, and they needed all of that poise and guile in requiring extra time to see off their Heatherton Black counterparts last week. The amount of petrol that this has taken out of the Heatherton tank could be a key factor here; another one will be the ability to stop Dingley's star shooter Bianca Waras-Carstenson and her sidekick Shannon Bailey. I'm not so sure that Heatherton can do this effectively enough to prevent a Dingley



victory here.

Dingley's Semi Final victory over Caulfield was a shock to many watchers of this division. Caulfield then needed all their experience and nous to defeat a valiant Lyndhurst in the Preliminary Final - if they are to annex the premiership it will certainly have been well-earned! That Semi Final was a very close affair all day, with Dingley only prevailing as a result of a withering burst in the last quarter. I'm not sure that Caulfield will allow that to happen this time around, and if Dingley are to win this one I feel that they will need to assert their authority far earlier in the contest. The key to doing that will be dampening the influence of the clever Tanya Hiscock. The likes of Madelyn Ades and Nicole Carmeni may hold the key to the match for Dingley, but I'm tipping the Mumma Bears from Caulfield to take the title of division five premiers.

Division 6 was one in which only two points separated first place from fourth. As is so often the case in such close competitions it is the top two sides which have won through to the Grand Final. Dingley Red have dominated the two meetings between these sides this year, but their defeat of Heatherton in the semi-final is the only loss that either has suffered in the past five weeks, so the form line is strong for both sides. The game pits the competition's strongest attack in Dingley against the strongest defence in Heatherton. Heatherton have thus far been unable to impose their defensive will on their Dingley, but I feel that the tension of a Grand Final may allow them to do this somewhat more easily this time around. This game will be a lot closer than the previous meetings between the two opponents, but the ingredients of this match up all point to a Dingley victory for me.

ROUND 18 REVIEW

Caldwell is convinced his side can beat anyone, but considers all sides in the top five serious premiership contenders.

It is a tough one to pick, but Black Rock's ability to handle so many pressure games to make the finals will prove significant.

The Jets will win a close one.

- A player eligible to play Senior, Reserve, Thirds or Under 19s grade finals may only play ONE MATCH per finals

Player Qualification for SFNL Finals Series THIRDS GRADE

- All players must play a minimum SIX HOME AND AWAY MATCHES (in six separate scheduled rounds), of which at least FOUR have been in the THIRDS competition, to qualify for THIRDS grade finals.
- A player who plays in 10 OR MORE Senior and/or Reserve (added or separate) matches is INELIGIBLE to play THIRDS grade finals.
- A player can be selected in SENIOR, RESERVE or THIRDS grade in ALL DIVISIONS if all grades are playing on the same weekend provided they have played SIX HOME AND AWAY MATCHES (in six separate scheduled rounds).
- A player eligible to play Senior, Reserve, Thirds or Under 19s grade finals may only play ONE MATCH per finals round.

Player Qualification for SFNL Finals Series SENIOR/RESERVE GRADE

 A player must play a minimum SIX HOME AND AWAY MATCHES (in six separate scheduled rounds), to qualify for SENIOR or RESERVE grade finals in ALL DIVISIONS.



ROUND 17 REVIEW

East Malvern 6.13 (49) def by Bentleigh 13.7 (85)

With close to its best side out on the park, the visitors took the lead early with four goals in the first quarter and never relinquished it.


