WHAT'S HAPPENING AT SFNL HQ?

Footy season is well and truly back, and we welcome you to the opening weekend of Divisions 2 and 4 for the 2018 Southern Football Netball League season.

On Good Friday, Hampton Park and Springvale Districts officially got the season started with two high quality matches in seniors and reserves, in front of a packed crowd on a beautiful afternoon at Robert Booth Reserve. It was Hampton Park's first match as part of the SFNL and it was great to see them get off to such a positive start.

This weekend we welcome another new club in Frankston Dolphins, who make their senior debut in the SFNL with a tricky away challenge to Dandenong. In addition, Cerberus returns to senior divisional football for the first time in eight years, having been a strong team in our Thirds competition since 2011.

It is also worth noting that it is the first time we have fielded a Division 4 competition since 1998. Once again this underlines the growth and development of the SFNL. This growth will be further demonstrated over the next few weeks as all of our men's football competitions will have started, along with our emerging women's league, which looks like it will increase from 10 to 18 teams. Numbers are also up in netball, where more than 90 teams will take to the courts in 2018. The progress the competitions are making reflects incredibly well on the work that each club is doing to not only grow and maintain strong numbers, but also play such an important role in their local community.

I am also very pleased to contribute this introduction to the season as one of my first roles as the new CEO of the SFNL. It is an honour to have been appointed to the position and to hopefully build on the good work done by David Cannizzo and the team at Keys Road.

I played my football at North Hobart and along with all of you I love our game. I've previously worked at the AFL in a commercial role and have also had the opportunity to work on different sports and events around the world. To now have the chance to make a contribution to community sport is something to which I am very much looking forward.

There is always more that the League can do to support clubs into the future and under the leadership of the Board that will be my focus as I look to support the excellent team at headquarters. As part of that support and engagement, I am looking forward to getting out to as many clubs as soon as possible.

Over the course of the season, we will be looking to do a review of Under 19 participation and pathways to our clubs to ensure the future growth of the game is strong.

The League is made up of people who are committed to their clubs and the positive impact of community sport. We want to thank everyone behind the scenes that help put the players on the field this season. We also want to thank the umpires and wish them all the very best in 2018.

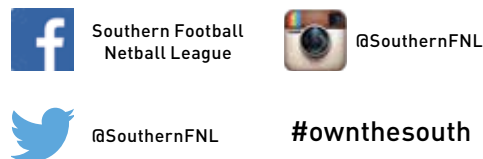


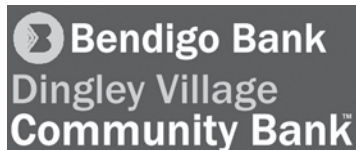

The Southern Football Netball League is gearing up for a massive year in 2018 and Division 2 looks to be particularly enticing with several clubs boasting strong chances of winning it all this year.

Whether it be Murrumbene with it's massive list of quality inclusions, relegated Division 1 club Clayton looking to get back into the top flight or an upstart Mount Waverly side that will be keen to build on some excellent performances in 2017, this year is sure to have its surprises.

CAULFIELD

2017 finish: 4th

The Bears will be looking to move on from a disappointing finish to the 2017 season, which saw them squander the double chance by bombing out of the finals in straight sets.

While the club has endured several depth players departing the club, and with the biggest loss coming from Sean Gunning's transfer to Division 1 club Port Melbourne Colts, Caulfield has enjoyed a strong off-season.

Caulfield has brought in gun defender Noah Answerth and key forward Cam Roughead to strength those two halves of the ground.

Answerth, a former junior, comes from the VAFA, but may only see a few games for the Bears this season as he spends time at TAC Cup club Oakleigh Chargers as a top age player.

Roughead, younger brother of Hawthorn star Jarryd, comes from division one side East Malvern and gives Caulfield a legitimate forward option to place alongside Chris Dove.

With Sein Clearihan mentoring the side and with a strong list, Caulfield should once again be contending for a top three spot.

Ladder prediction: 2-4

CLAYTON

2017 finish: 10th in Division 1

Playing in Division 2 for the first time since winning the flag in 2010, Clayton will be once again a side to watch out for as it attempts to move back into the top flight.

Coach Jayden Gilmour, one of the best defenders in the entire League, not just Division 2, will lead from the front again with the club boasting several talented ins from the off season.

Josh Llerana and Peter Bell (not the former North Melbourne/Fremantle star) are the big inclusions for the Magpies in 2018.

Llerana comes from West Gippsland league club Cora Lynn, where he is a premiership player, while Bell comes from VAFA club Prahran Assumption.

The club is also welcoming back several returning players to the club including Jack Coutts, who played with Cranbourne in the South East league, and Jack Gavin who returns from Cheltenham.

Division 1 relegated clubs tend to be relatively competitive when re-joining Division 2 and Clayton should be no different and will join the fight for a finals spot.

Ladder prediction: 3-5

DOVETON EAGLES

2017 finish: Premiers in Division 3

The Eagles come back to Division 2 after two seasons in Division 3 and will attempt to entrench themselves here for the long run.

If their off-season is anything to go by they may have done that will several big-name inclusions to the club, including Nick Battle, Ryan Hendy, Josh Henry and Caleb Millman.

Battle, brother of St Kilda's Josh, joins the club after playing with the Dandenong Stingrays with Battle also playing for VFL side Casey.

Hendy was a premiership player with South East side Doveton Doves and joins the club to play alongside mate Nathan Wilson, a premiership player with the Eagles.

Henry will bolster the midfield stocks for the Eagles and joins from EFL club Ferntree Gully, while Millman is another former Dandenong Stingrays star who joins from Tarwin in the Alberton FL.

Ladder prediction: 5-8

EAST BRIGHTON

2017 finish: 7th

East Brighton was unable to convert a strong start to 2017 into a finals appearance and will look to right that wrong in 2018.

It may prove to be a difficult task for the Vampires however, as they look to run out a youth laden side this year.

Peter Larsen's side will look to find their feet early in the season, but with experienced players in Barry Hope, Andrew Jansen, Mitch Backman and Mark Jamieson still running around, the learning curves could be few or far between.

Still, a young list could revitalise the club's veteran players and it wouldn't be surprising to see East Brighton contending for a finals spot, but the premiership window may be closed for now.

Ladder prediction: 5-9

HAMPTON

2017 finish: 9th

Don't let Hampton's final place on the 2017 ladder fool you into thinking the Hammers aren't going to be contending for finals this year.

The Hammers were one of several clubs in a logjam for fifth spot for the better part of the second half of the season and with a few handy inclusions, this year could be the year for the toolbox faithful.

While the club has lost a chunk of experience in the form of Chris Grove and James Feather, who have crossed to Ashwood, the Hammers have more than made up for it.

Joining the club is ruckman Matt Thorneycroft who makes the switch from division one side Cheltenham to play with last year's recruit Pat Bolger, another ex-Rosella.

While Thorneycroft played a key role in the Rosella's reserves premiership last year, he has plenty of senior experience to his name and will be a key player for Hampton this season.

The club has also brought in plenty of depth players, which should create plenty of competition for spots, a problem every coach, including Craig McIndoe I'm sure, dreams of.

Ladder prediction: 5-9

HIGHETT

2017 finish: 8th

Division 2's perennial Jekyll and Hyde club once again proved they have what it takes to mount a run for the finals, but were unsuccessful in doing so.

The Dogs have been able to maintain the bulk of its list for 2018, a key factor finally making a finals run, while also bringing in plenty of experience to bolster the stocks.

Chris Langdon is a big get for the Kennel, after playing 14 games for Division 1 grand finalist Mordialloc last year, he will lead the way through the midfield and add plenty of class.

Ed Turner, coming in from Hampton Rovers, is another who adds polish to the club and is a big game player and has been named best on ground in two grand final appearances.

Will this year finally be the year the Dogs return to September action, or will Sam Hecker's squad once again fail to live up to its capabilities?

Ladder prediction: 4-8

KEYSBOROUGH

2017 finish: 3rd

The Burra were so close for the second time in three years in Division 2 to making a grand final, but like they were in 2015, Murrumbene proved to be their downfall, defeating them in the preliminary final.

This year Keysborough has been active in recruiting a number of players to the club in order to make that much desired grand final appearance.

One of the biggest inclusions is key forward Matt Carnelley, a player capable of kicking 100 goals, a feat he achieved while playing for EFL club Forest Hill.

Also joining the club are Mt Eliza duo James Anwyll, a former VFL defender with Frankston, and Aaron McLroy who should provide a bit of X factor.

While Jacob Bakes looms as the club's biggest loss, departing for Springvale Districts, the Burra has plenty of experience to rely upon.

No doubt the Burra will be back up the pointy end of the ladder this season and are a legitimate premiership contender.

Ladder prediction: 1-3

MOUNT WAVERLEY

2017 finish: 6th

The Mountain Lions were the big surprise packet in 2017, coming up from Division 3 and causing quite a stir in finishing just outside the top five.

While Bennett Medallist Jackson Smith, moving to Werribee Centrals, Andy Mathers, transferring to Karingal, and James Gough, moving to EFL club Fairpark Lions, are big losses, the club has plenty of experience still on the list.

The inclusion of Ben McLeod from Sebastopol in the Ballarat league is a handy inclusion for the Mount with Stuart Pike also coming in from Heidelberg West.

Michael Keem, one of the toughest nuts in the SFNL, will take the reigns at Mayfield Reserve and will have his charges geared up for a finals run.

Ladder prediction: 5-9

MURRUMBEENA

2017 finish: Runners-up

Runners-up of two of the last three grand finals, this year might finally be the year Murrumbene takes the big prize, enjoying arguably one of the best off-season recruitment jobs the SFL has seen in recent years.

Coming in to the club is a host of players who are more than capable of playing Division 1 football and should have the Beena as the team to beat.

At the top of the list are former St Pauls premiership players Jay Bruno, Luke James, Owen Lewis and Harley Ambrose who cross to join former Dog star Liam Wilson and coach Paul Howroyd.

James is a goal kicking machine who has topped 90 goals in a season five times and will be sure to have the crowd gasping in anticipation.

Bruno, Ambrose and Lewis add more class to an already dangerous midfield which includes star Jake Semmel and Wilson.

While the club has lost some experience in the form of Josh Wright and Lachlan Batt, the Beena Arena will be a fortress in 2018.

Ladder prediction: 1-3

SKYE

2017 finish: 5th

The Bombers have endured a tough off-season in the wake of a rough finish to the 2017 season, with former captain Aaron Pacey taking up a coaching position with Tyabb in the Mornington Peninsula league.

Well, what an eventful off-season it has been for the Southern Football Netball League, highlighted by the reinstatement of a fourth senior football division, the addition of several new clubs and several high-profile players changing colours.

For those who may be unfamiliar, a restructure of the SFNL competition was undertaken following the conclusion of last year's finals series. This not only assisted the accommodation of new clubs and teams, but also provided existing clubs – and particularly those that have finished in the bottom half of the Division 3 ladder – with a fairer level of competition.

Cerberus have been the powerhouse team in the Thirds competition for several years, competing in the last three Grand Finals and winning the flag in 2016, and we look forward to seeing what the side from the Navy base has in store for season 2018.

And completing the eight-team Division 4 competition are the Frankston Dolphins, who will make their senior football debut on Saturday. Like Lyndhurst in 2016, the Dolphins were previously only a junior entity that has recently established a senior team for the first time, and we are delighted to welcome them into the SFNL. Congratulations to President Mal Lewis and his team for their outstanding efforts in getting their inaugural side off the ground.

The off-season is now behind us and Round 1 has finally arrived, so without further ado, let's get stuck into a big opening weekend of Division 4 footy!

ROUND 1 PREVIEW

Lyndhurst V Sandown Cobras (Marriott Waters Reserve)

Round 1 is always a time for optimism, and so it is with Sandown who, after a couple of lean years, will fancy their chances of improving their wins tally this season. So too, Lyndhurst, with the club setting their sights on a maiden finals appearance in just their third season of competition.

The Cobras have endured some tough times in the last two seasons, but with a renewed buzz around Edinburgh Reserve throughout the preseason, they will be out to make a statement in Division 4 this season. However, the natural improvement in the Lightning's young side will also continue in 2018, and you would expect them to begin the new year with a victory at home.

Lyndhurst by 34 points.

Cerberus V Carrum Patterson Lakes (McAuliffe Oval)

While Cerberus has been by far the standout team in the Thirds over the last few seasons, it is hard to know how they will fair after making the jump up to senior football. The

Dogs have traditionally had some big bodies in their sides and will not shirk an issue, but senior football is a different proposition. They should nevertheless be quite competitive this season, but we will know plenty more about this side come 5pm on Saturday.

CPL, on the other hand, have recruited particularly well through the off-season, snaring Division 2 Reserve MVP Shane Dunn from Keysborough, as well as his brother Jake, which strengthens the club's key position stocks. Additionally, former Black Rock star Brent Rafferty adds a fair bit of class to the side, and the Lions look, on paper at least, one of the teams to beat this year.

Carrum Patterson Lakes by 20 points.

Dandenong V Frankston Dolphins (Greaves Reserve)

Like Cerberus, the Dolphins are a bit of an unknown quantity, but would no doubt be keen to make an impression in its debut season. In addition to its crop of talented youngsters, the club has bolstered its top end with experienced senior players, including former Mordialloc spearhead Luke Kirkland and Bentleigh veteran Andy Lee, that should make a significant impact at this level.

Meanwhile it has been a difficult couple of seasons for the Redlegs in Division 3, but a new year brings renewed optimism, so expect a much more competitive Dandenong side in the lower grade in 2018.

This is an intriguing match-up, and it could go either way, but I'm tipping the SFNL newcomers to salute on debut in a thriller.

Frankston Dolphins by three points.

Lyndale V Moorabbin Kangaroos (Barry Powell Reserve)

A tremendous match-up between two of the higher ranked sides from last year. Lyndale were the highest-placed of all the Div 4 teams last season, finishing seventh on the Division 3 ladder with a 9-9 record, while Moorabbin finished two rungs below with five wins, so expect big things from both teams in 2018.

New Pumas coach Brett Robinson has brought across several of his former charges from Masala, while livewire forward Shane Thomas moves across from Hallam and big man Alex Kerr returns to the club after a stint at Kilcunda Bass. However, the losses of the Toole brothers (Jordan and Liam), the Rainey boys (Taylor and Shannon), Jake Rech and Mitch Robinson are all significant outs.

It has been quieter on the transfer front for Moorabbin, who showed very promising signs throughout 2017, including an upset victory over South Yarra at home. However, they are a different proposition away from Widdop Crescent and on that basis Lyndale should take the chocolates in this one.

Welcome to season 2018. Our umpiring group trains at Bricker Reserve, Moorabbin East, at 6pm every Tuesday and Thursday and we encourage any former footballers to stay involved in the game by joining us. Contact the SFNL office for more information about becoming an umpire.

Congratulations to Jack Cannon, Shannon Kirkby, Jake Rositani and Darcy Trewarn who are training with the VFL umpires at Victoria Park each fortnight as members of the AFL Vic Rookie Squad, and James Aitken and Kaitlin Barr are our VFL Bound Rookie nominations for 2018 and will train with the VFL squad at Victoria Park one a month. Tom McKinley is training with the VFL Goal Umpires each month as part of the goal umpire Rookie Squad.

Campbell James, Chris Menara and Nick Ritchie are working with AFL umpire Rob O'Gorman as part of the Umpiring Mates Program. Ryan Mann, Michael Moore, and Michael Whelan are umpiring the Under 16 State Championships in April. As you can see, there are great opportunities for young people umpiring in the SFNL.

Some of our recent SFNL graduates to the VFL are doing very well with Annie Mirabile umpiring the AFL Women's Grand Final in March (Annie had umpired the very first AFL Women's match early last year), while Cam Watts and Matt Mahoney were in action together in Round 1 of the TAC Cup at Punt Rd. Cam and Luke Porter are trialling for places on this year's VFL senior list, while Matt Crowley, Nathan Guy and Sam Rogers are trialling to join the Development Squad.

After the 2017 season, SFNL CEO David Cannizzo resigned to take on the CEO role at the Sandringham Dragons. David was a great supporter of our umpires and has even been known to umpire the occasional game himself. He is not lost completely to the SFNL however, and is making a comeback at his old club, South Yarra. One of our umpires welcomed him back with a very soft free in front of goal in a praccie match but Dave's left boot wasn't quite up to the task!

There have been few changes over the summer to the SFNL umpire coaching panel. Peter Marshall will remain as the Director of Umpiring and Field Umpire coach where he will again be assisted by Jonathon Auditore and Brett Chard. Craig Davenport remains as Head Coach of the goal umpires and will continue to be supported by Robin Epstein, Brett McGeorge and Jeff Mark. Pete Bailey will continue the Boundary Umpire Coach and will be assisted Mitch Lea. Pete will also continue as our video analyst. Our match day coaches are Rodd Johnson, Clayton Pressley and Dave Smith (field umpires) and Harry Stamos (goal umpires).

Jake Rositani is our Fitness Co-ordinator, Glenn Emery continues as our First Year Umpire Mentor, and Hannah Bailes continues as our female ambassador. She will be assist and represent all female umpires within the group.

In a recruiting coup, Luke Walker, who has goal umpired in SEVEN AFL Grand Finals (equalling the record) and 37 AFL finals all-up, as well as being All-Australian Goal Umpire on five occasions, is joining our ranks both as a field umpire and to run a mentor program for our younger umpires who

wish to head to the VFL/AFL. Luke will assist our young guns with match preparation, diet, time management, goal setting and fitness requirements, as he helps them navigate the pathways that lead to umpiring at the highest level. He will assist them both at training and on match days providing written and verbal feedback. We are extremely fortunate to have someone with Luke's background and experience to take on this new and exciting role.

Marshie is very passionate about supporting our umpiring group and was prepared to debate a former Irish Kick-boxing Champion about the importance of Bricker Reserve as our training facility recently. Chris Hughes is another umpire with an interest in martial arts, and, on a recent trip to Thailand, with his judgement clouded by medications, he entered the MMA ring at a local pub to demonstrate his MMA skills against an opponent nearly twice his size. Fortunately, he lived to tell the tale.

At Committee level, Alan Manning continues as President, with Rodd Johnson as Secretary, John Borg as Treasurer and Kevin Mitchell as Property Steward. Other committee members are Paul Creedon, Hannah Faulkes, Thomas Grundy, Kaye Johnson, Tony Levitt, Kevin Mitchell and Anthony Steward.

There are no changes to rule interpretations in the SFNL this year. The deliberate rushed behind is NOT paid in the SFNL. However, deliberate out of bounds IS paid.

Once the goal umpire has been given the all clear and signalled the decision (but before the flag is waved), the defender may bring the ball back into play.

If a player knocks a ball out of play on the full after a ball up or throw in the free kick shall be awarded to the opposition. This includes if the ball hits the point post on the full.

In ruck contests, the Third Man Up rule applies. However, a poor throw in by the boundary umpire will result in a throw up by field umpire 10m to 15m inside the boundary line. Deliberate interference by a player other than the nominated ruckman will result in free kick awarded against offending player in both ball ups and throw ins. There must be at least a one metre separation between the nominated ruckman until the ball leaves the umpire's hands.

A free kick may be paid against the coaches box for abuse. The free kick will be awarded against the offending team where play is stopped or, after a goal, in the centre instead of a ball up.

Next Thursday, April 12, all umpires are expected to attend our season opening First Supper which will be held after training at Bricker Reserve. The cost of the night is included in your membership fee, which will be deducted from you first on-line match payment.
