CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

MARC GAUCI

CHAIRMAN

It is with pleasure that I present my report to the SFNL members in what has been a challenging year for us all.

Living our Values

One key initiative we established this season was to ensure we live our values as an organisation.

In the 2019 Strategic Plan 2020-2022 we established the cores values of the League as:

- Trust
- Accountability
- Inclusiveness
- Innovation

During 2020, we have introduced a topic of "Living our Values" as a standing item in our Board agenda to ensure we do in fact discuss them and work with our stakeholders to make



sure we uphold them.

In what was very much a virtual season, I am pleased to report we lived our values through:

- 12 SFNL Board meetings during the year plus in every other week we were meeting via Zoom technology to stay across the fluid nature of what was happening in our efforts to maintain a competition in 2020
- The 6 Metro Leagues of AFL Victoria (SFNL, VAFA, EFNL, EDFL, WRFL, NFL), met almost weekly and worked collaboratively in their discussions on Season 2020 and in their negotiations with AFL Victoria.
- The significant increased effort in the frequency of direct Club consultations during the year to provide feedback and gain soundings on what might be possible
- The use of Zoom meeting technology to accommodate all participants required when face to face meetings were not allowed
- The 1 to 1 calls by Board member calls with the President of each Club
- The increased communications from the League to our Clubs sharing updates and options as they became known. Our Social football 9-a-side competition was launched

Last League Standing

In our 28th year, it was a great challenge for us all at the League to work efficiently with our 38 clubs, including our Umpires, approximately 6000 participants (Senior Men,

Under 19 and Women's Football, Netball and our 450 umpires), AFL Victoria, our RSEA Park co-tenants and our 11 Local Government Authorities (LGAs) to produce what, in the end, was our busiest season ever, yet a non-operational year.

It is acknowledged by all that the SFNL held out the longest ahead of all other Senior Leagues in Victoria and was the last League standing in the drive and strength of conviction to find a workable path to stand up an U19s, Women's Football and Women's Netball competition.

We should all be very proud of our collaborative and collegiate approach and I feel we gained great respect for each other as a result.

Achievements against our strategic plan 2020-2022

I'm sure you will appreciate and as I have mentioned above, whilst there were many positives to come out of the year just gone, you will also appreciate that many of the objectives of a physical nature within our current strategic plan could not be actioned or achieved.

To share again, the four pillars of the plan are:

- League and Club Sustainability
- Participation
- Facilities
- Governance and Our People

We will always remain focused on delivery of the core promise in "Providing football and netball participation to the Southern community" and this year we have particularly



focussed positive efforts on our League and Club sustainability and Governance and Our People.

I would like at this point to make a particular call out to our League CEO Lee Hartman and staff on their leadership and resilience in very trying conditions. In particular, Lee has maintained positive engagement and respect of the staff and also spent an inordinate amount of time in talking with our Clubs and stakeholders to update and keep them focused on finding the positives of what was happening around us.

From a Board perspective, what changed of note was:

- The cadence of board meetings changed significantly
- Virtual meetings flourished and are likely to continue into our future
- Our Board members are now deeper in the business of the League
- Our Board gained a deeper appreciation

of the League management and administration.

The year ahead

If I have learnt anything this year through COVID 19 and as we head into 2021, it is clear to me that the role and influence of our Board leadership has never been more important.

I am confident we currently have the right balance of backgrounds and skills on the Board to make sure we have a focus looking forward on performance standards, community expectations and the skills required to navigate change as it continues to evolve.

Going forward, Inclusion, Environmental, Social and Corporate Governance (ESG), Risk and Digital Literacy are among many emerging challenges we will need to consider.

St Kilda Football Club (StKFC)

2021 will be a very exciting year with the very strong relationship we already have with StKFC due in a very large part to the effort over the last 8 years of Vice Chairman Garry Cranny. We appreciate the ongoing support from StKFC in many areas and look forward to realising the full value of RSEA Park in harmony with them in 2021.

Thanks

A big thanks to my fellow board members and in particular to Vice Chairman Garry Cranny and League Treasurer Paul Shoebridge on the many hours we spent together with Richard Smith, Darren McLeod, Gayann Walker and Greg Ryan to guide our League through 2020. We can't wait to return to the fields and courts in 2021 and do an even better job next year.

FINANCE REPORT



PAUL SHOEBRIDGE TREASURER

The 2020 season, that never happened due to the COVID-19 pandemic, consumed significant effort and resources to get to the final decision of not to play. The focus of the Board and Administration during this time was to ensure the Balance Sheet remained strong to withstand a season of no on-field activity, whilst continuing to meet our obligations to our stakeholders. To do this, there was particular focus on cash management and cost control within the demanding environment.

The SFNL 2020 financial result was a loss of \$115,057 which was a decrease of \$116,370 from our 2019 result.

The significant items which shaped our results were:

- Our turnover was significantly impacted in 2020 with the cancellation of the season. Our turnover of \$629,702 was 65% down from 2019.

- The most significant and important share of our revenue this year was from Government support totalling \$247,939. This took the form of Job Keeper, the ATO Cash Flow Boost and Victorian government business grants.

- The only affiliation fee charged to the clubs in the 2020 season was the December 2019 instalment totalling \$45,954. This assisted in covering the office costs of the preseason work. The League was also charged a portion of the AFL insurance fees for the year, which was on charged to clubs.

- There was also a reasonable level of merchandise sales which had been ordered prior to the COVID-19 lockdowns. We achieved a margin of \$16,008 this year but this was well short of \$53,862 in 2019. We were still able to achieve good sponsorship income of \$106,364 compared to \$121,593 in 2019. This is in part due to the generous support of the Bayside Cluster of the Bendigo Community Bank.

- There was a corresponding fall of 58% in the League's expenses of \$744,759 which reflects the cancellation of the season.

Administration costs were lower by 5% in 2020. Much of the administration costs are fixed in nature but were reduced where they were able to be. Staff salary levels were at normal levels during the first five months of the year but were reduced for the remainder of the year in line with the Job Keeper subsidy.

Despite the setback of this year's loss, the Balance Sheet is in a healthy net asset position. Our club receivables improved by \$18,010 from last year. Clubs carrying debt from 2019 made significant inroads into the amounts they owe in a year which was financially difficult for all Clubs. A portion of receivables includes clubs who purchased merchandise prior to the COVID-19 lockdowns that due to limited revenue earning opportunities for the year have deferred payment to the 2021 season. Congratulations to those clubs that were able to improve their financial positions during this time.

Moving into the 2021 season, the League will continue to work with clubs to improve their financial sustainability. This important partnership underpins the League Strategic Plan and Balance Sheet.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2020

1. Significant Accounting Policies

a. Incorporation

Southern Football Netball League Inc. was incorporated on 5 January 2009.

b. Basis of preparation

The financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Interpretations and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Associations Incorporations Reform Act 2012.

The financial report of Southern Football Netball League Inc. as an individual entity complies with Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards. Compliance with Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards ensures that the financial statements and notes comply with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

Although all preparations for the 2020 season had been completed, shortly before the scheduled commencement date restrictions imposed by the State Government of Victoria to deal with the Covid – 19 pandemic required that the commencement date be deferred and subsequently the cancellation of the season. As a consequence the operations of Southern Football League Inc. were effectively placed in hibernation. These matters have had a significant impact on the results of the Association for the 2020 financial Year. In view of recent easing of restrictions and the possibility of vaccines becoming available in early 2021 it is assumed that the 2021 season will occur, possibly with some modifications.

The financial report has been prepared under the historical cost convention modified by revaluations of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the association in the preparation and presentation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

c. Accounting policies

i. Revenue

Affiliation fees and sponsorships are recognised as revenue on a time proportional basis. Football Affiliations Fees for 2020 were significantly reduced following the cancellation of the season.

Revenue from the sale of goods, principally comprising footballs, uniforms, equipment and records to member clubs is recognized when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods have passed to the buyer and the costs incurred or to be incurred in respect of the transaction can be measured reliably. Risks and rewards of ownership are considered as having passed to the buyer upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Revenues from the provision of services are recognised upon delivery of the service.

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when it is controlled. When there are conditions attached to grant revenue relating to the use of those grants for specific purposes it is recognised in the balance sheet as a liability until such conditions are met or services provided.

Job Keeper revenue is recognised on an accrual basis in order to match the revenue with the employee pays it relates to.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets

ii. Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

iii. Inventories

Inventories primarily comprise stocks of football equipment and uniforms held for resale and are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

iv. Financial instruments

Receivables

Trade and other receivables when initially recognised are measured at fair value, which normally approximates their nominal value.

Subsequently they are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Payables

Trade and other accounts payable are recognised when the association becomes obliged to make future payments resulting from the purchase of goods or services. When initially recognised they are measured at fair value, which normally approximates their nominal value. Subsequently they are measured at amortised cost.

d. Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Depreciation and amortisation

The depreciable amount of items of property, plant and equipment are depreciated on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The assets' residual values and useful lives of assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted if appropriate. The following estimated useful lives are used in the calculation of depreciation and amortisation:

Defibrillators	10 years
Furniture and equipment	3 to 5 years

e. Intangibles

The Southern Football Netball League Inc. as one of the stakeholder parties contributed \$260,000 to the development of state-of-the-art sports training, administration and match facilities at the Linton Street Moorabbin Reserve.

Under these arrangements League has the right for the use of an area of the new pavilion for an administrative office as well as rights of access to various other facilities at the premises for 25 years.

The amount contributed has been recognised in the financial statements as an Intangible Asset and is being amortised over 25 years.

f. Employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period.

Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs.

Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the entity to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses when incurred.

g. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amount required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

h. Income tax

No Provision for Income Tax has been raised, as the entity is exempt from Income Tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

i. Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF SOUTHERN FOOTBALL NETBALL LEAGUE INC.

We have reviewed the annual financial report of Southern Football Netball League Inc., which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 October 2020, the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the Statement by Members of the Board.
