Our full season in season 2022 enables us to be able to shout out again about a celebration of our successes and all the great value we deliver to our community after we finally got to hit the fields and courts after a near 2 year hiatus.

Simply put it's all about having fun whilst playing respectfully, as I called out a few years ago we collaborate off the field and compete on the arena.

Our success this last year allows me to share with you that we have the day to day pleasure of managing;

- 39 clubs
- 11 LGAs
- 41 + community sporting venues /grounds
 - (39 home club venues & RSEA Park, SDNA)
- 5698 participants (3957 men, 1741 women (30% women)
- 208 teams, (95 men / 113 women)
- 25 divisions

Our Coaches, Volunteers, stakeholders and sponsors are acknowledged as significant contributors to our success and we thank them for their continued support this last year.

We have big plans for 2023 in developing a new Football and Netball integrated model that aims to make "Southern" a destination league for Community minded clubs.

CEO'S REPORT

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

What an outstanding year of Football and Netball. It was great to be back playing, especially returning to a very successful finals series. There have been some challenges getting back on the park, but it was great to be back. Right across the season we saw increased crowds, I think people understood what the community and what football and netball meant to them when we didn't have it. Crowds at finals are up 30% across the board.



Firstly, congratulations must also go to all the Divisional Winners in Football and Netball for 2022. Well done to Cranbourne, first year in the competition to win the Division 1 flag was a great effort, Cheltenham coming so close once again after a stellar season. Chelsea Heights winning the Division 2 premiership in a 2 point thriller with that last 5 minutes as tense as you would see, end to end with no scores, incredible, a special shout out to Doveton Doves, also their first year in the SFNL and to come so close was a credit to their club. To Black Rock taking out the 3rd Division title by 1 point over a desperately unlucky Murrumbena who had led until late in the game and to Lyndhurst in winning Division 4. Runners up in 2018 & 2019 they were due, if you thought 'Beena were unlucky, spare a thought for Frankston Dolphins, undefeated all year and to go down by 8 points was heartbreaking for them. The Women's Football Competitions this year were evenly played, where the Premiers were Endeavour Hills in Division 1 knocking off the also undefeated Casey Thunder and Black Rock in Division 2, their first ever year in Woman's football. A great effort. Dingley took out A1 & Port Melbourne Colts A2 of the Netball in a great day of netball where no fewer than 12 teams won Premierships, well done to all.

2022 has been great to be back playing footy and to have our Division 1 Grand Finals at RSEA Park Moorabbin, the home of the SFNL. It's been a long journey to get back to finals, the venue has changed a lot since 2019, mainly the scoreboard and the grandstand, but we now have a first-class facility for years to come for SFNL finals, congratulations to all involved, a special thank you to all stakeholders and contributors.

Like all we faced many challenges over the last 3 seasons. I'd like to thank the Board, led by Chair Marc Gauci with support from Garry, Paul, Gayann, Richard, Darren, Greg, Sarah & Natalie, to the SFNL staff David, Wes, Sue, Luke, Jenny and the SDNA role shared between Sophie & Belinda and to all 39 member clubs for embracing the fluid nature of it all, we could not have got through without all of your support.

I'd like to thank the League partners, in particular the Bendigo Bank, our major partner for the last 3 seasons.

To the Sandown Park Greyhounds, we thank you for your ongoing support of both our League and our Pride round, and also for hosting our League Presentation night this year on September 30th. To Blackchrome, thanks for your support with the on-field game day apparel. To Gameface for our media work and to our other partners AV Jennings, Top Notch Trophies, Ivans Pies and AFL Victoria.



FOOTBALL REPORT

DAVID JENNINGS

GENERAL MANAGER - OPERATIONS

After the disappointment of an abrupt end to the 2021 season, we all embraced the return of football with a determination to deliver a standout year for all our competitions. This is a credit to the hard work from all our Member Clubs and volunteers that have demonstrated tireless commitment on the frontline.

We were tested throughout the year with the challenges of reactivating during COVID. The Hampton Football Club moved from Division 2 to Division 4 in pre-season due to a lack of playing numbers. Furthermore, the League also experienced an unprecedented total of 53 forfeits from teams in all grades throughout the season which challenged both Clubs and the Umpiring department. We overcame these challenges together to the benefit of community football and achieved growth across the League.


The importance of local sport and being involved in the community and the benefits that it brings cannot be overstated. For everyone passionately involved in our game, your demonstrated resilience, desire and efforts to get your teams onto the field each week in a safe manner is greatly appreciated.

Competition Growth

We welcomed the Cranbourne Eagles and the Doveton Doves to the League who have made an immediate positive impact after completing successful seasons. The League also experienced growth in Women's and Under 19's football with new teams and increased participation.

The SFNL provided the opportunity for 4,258 registered participants across 39 Member Clubs to be involved in organised community football in season 2022. This was made up of 3,737 male players from 110 teams and 521 female players from 15 teams from and 15 Member clubs (including the combined Moorabbin and St Paul's McKinnon team).

Overall team numbers in football were up from 2021.



Development Squad

In partnership with the St Kilda Football Club, the League delivered the second year of the SFNL Development Squad. The Development Squad provided our competitions most up and coming male and female players with the opportunity to be trained and educated by some of the industry's elite professionals.

The program was delivered by Coaches Trent Dennis-Lane, Chris McKay and Selena Karlson over 6-8 weeks and consisted of a mixture of on-field drills and off field presentations from experts in the AFL industry. Below are some of the on-field skills and off-field presentations that the group went through during the program.

On-Field Skills & Development

- Kicking biomechanics
- Ground balls technique

I would like to thank the Trent, Chris and Selena for their invaluable contributions to the development of our SFNL talent. Furthermore, I would like to extend a thank you to Matthew Crozier, Cam Roberts and Brad Crouch from the St Kilda Football Club for their support of the program.

Club Sustainability Program

In order to maintain, support and grow Australian football at the community football level it is important that teams fielded by community Clubs are as strong and well matched as possible.

The 2022 season marked the seventh year of the state-wide Community Club Sustainability Program (CCSP) with the enforcement of both the Player Points System (PPS) and Player Payment Rules for all Senior Men's grade competitions.

Player Points

The League assessed a total of 3,628 male participants and allocated a player points value between one and six which is determined by the level of football that player has played over the current and previous three seasons. Each senior team in the SFNL were allocated a maximum player points cap of 46 per match for the season which remains unchanged from 2018. The below table outlined the averages for all senior men's teams by division and final ladder positions for the 2021 season.

Player Payments

The support for community football competitions and participating Clubs and the opportunity for players to develop and display their skills depends upon those competitions being conducted between evenly matched and financially viable Clubs. The pursuit of these objective assists in attracting and maintaining the interest of players, supporters, officeholders, sponsors and volunteers, all of whom are essential for community football competitions and Clubs.

To assist in achieving these objectives, the Southern Football Netball League (SFNL) has Adopted the Player Payment Rule (PPR) in which the player payment allowance (salary caps) outlined below were enforced in 2022 to ensure each Club could compete equitably and sustainably.

- Division 1 - \$100,000 (maximum cap for all Metro Leagues)
- Division 2 - \$75,000
- Division 3 - \$40,000
- Division 4 - \$30,000

AFL Victoria in conjunction with the League completed several reviews of SFNL Member Clubs throughout the season to ensure the Player Payment Rules were being adhered to and that all submissions were accurate and timely. I would like to thank all Member Clubs that were selected to participate in the audits for their cooperation and assistance in facilitating this process.

I would also like to thank the AFL, the appointed Integrity Officer and all Member Clubs for submitting the budget and player declarations as per the requirements with the Player Payment Rules & Guidelines Policy.



Tribunal and MRP

The League continued with its robust Independent Tribunal and Match Review Panel (MRP) procedures for 2022. This was underpinned by the invaluable return of key appointments to ensure consistent outcomes were achieved and met with community football expectations.

On-field behaviour had once again been outstanding. Whilst a couple of serious incidents had created headlines throughout the season, these incidents remain isolated and were addressed quickly by the League with the cooperation and full support of the Member Clubs involved.

We were delighted by the return of Andrew Lefebvre as the Chair of the Independent Tribunal and was ably supported by eight Panel Members over the course of the season. Iain Findlay continued in his role as the Appeals Chair and Kim Brimelow commenced his fourth year with the SFNL as the League Prosecutor. All appointments once again demonstrated their immense experience and professionalism in support of the League's disciplinary procedures which is highlighted by the achievements below.

The SFNL made a total of 107 reports under the Laws of Australian Football and the League By-Laws of players and officials during the year. Of the total reports, 98.13% (105) received a suspension via an accepted Set Penalty or guilty finding at the Independent Tribunal with a combined total of 246 matches in suspensions being handed down. A total of 76 Set Penalties were offered by the officiating Umpires, MRP and the League, in which were 93.4% (71) were accepted. Thirty-four out of 36 (94.4%) of Independent Tribunal hearings returned a guilty verdict. These statistics indicate we are making the right reports in which the charges are being correctly prosecuted to ensure the League remains a safe and enjoyable place for our participants.

The League would like to thank the entire Independent Tribunal, the MRP, Kim Brimelow and Iain Findlay for their dedication of time, efforts and commitment League.



Finals

It had been 1,051 days between the final siren of the 2019 SFNL Division 1 Grand Final and the return of the SFNL Final Series with the first bounce of the Women's Semi Final at Clayton. The Finals is undoubtedly the most exciting time to be a part of our great game.

A total of sixty-four matches were played over seven weeks at 5 venues which was understandably a test of endurance for everyone involved. An incredible amount of work is required to successfully deliver a Final Series. On behalf of the League, I would like to thank the St Kilda Football Club and the following host Clubs and volunteers that worked tirelessly over the six weeks of football Finals –

- Cheltenham Football Netball Club
- Clayton Football Netball Club
- Doveton Eagles Football Club
- Mordialloc Football Netball Club

Twenty-eight out of our 39 Member Clubs competed in the 2022 SFNL Finals Series across the 13 grades of football which is a great representation of the League. What is pleasing to highlight was the competitiveness of all matches as teams were evenly matched throughout the Final Series. The average winning margin for the entire Final Series was 25.7 points and for the Grand Finals it was even closer at 16.15 points.

NETBALL REPORT

NETBALL OPERATIONS COORDINATOR

The growing SFNL netball competition saw us bounce back from 2021 with 98 teams from 30 clubs competing in 2022 over 12 divisions.

New clubs to enter teams came from Cranbourne, Doveton Doves and East Malvern with Aspendale Arrows expansion to include Edi-Asp NC players. Once again grading was conducted over the first 2 weekends with mini matches being played, leaving a 14 week home and away fixture. With the majority of divisions having 8 teams this ensured everyone played each other twice.



The season was quite difficult to manage for club co-ordinators and match day personnel, with Covid still affecting player and umpire numbers. If you were lucky to stay healthy then you were off on holidays so there was a lot of fill ins playing throughout the year. This in itself, caused some concerns and the new netball system, Netball Connect, was not so easy to navigate. During the year we had 1381 registered players which included 322 fill-ins.

This season we had access to Olive Road Eumemmering courts and scheduled between 2 and 4 games there every Saturday. This venue is run by Casey NA and I thank Cindy for her assistance in setting up the courts for us. Thank you also to our new courtside supervisor, Tracie Battye, who controlled the timing and scoresheets for those games. Many matches were played at home courts alongside the football matches and this was a focus for the League in the fixturing of games. With more clubs having home courts this will open up more venues as we currently use all 16 courts at Rowan Rd Dingley.

Showcase games were played on a cold Thursday night in May at Dales Park South Oakleigh when Cheltenham played Dingley in all 4 x A grade divisions.

Pride Cup round was hosted by Parkdale Vultures who played Murrumbeena in their A4 match. The result saw Parkdale Vulture win their first piece of silverware in netball.

Murrumbeena FNC also celebrated NAIDOC week with their A2 team sporting an eye catching designed uniform and was the talk of the courts that week.

We are very proud of the collaboration between SFNL netball clubs. The way they support each other with rescheduling of games so that clubs can celebrate organised functions when the footy is being played at home. Every week there were matches played midweek or early Saturday mornings.



Thank you also to our wonderful Team White – the ladies and gents in white that officiate on all our matches.

The SFNL development fund was used to increase our umpire list and have regular mentors available each week. We had 128 umpires this season with many doing 2 to 3 games per week. Congratulations to the following ladies who achieved their C badge this year – Sinem Ibrahim (Bentleigh), Marley Haenga, Charlotte Fox and Kyana Gordon (Dingley), Olivia Bruce (St Kilda City), Olivia Wilksch (Parkdale Vultures), Kelsey Smith (Springvale Districts) and Bridgette Gilley (AANC).

With 2 B badge awards going to Holly Guthrie (St Pauls McKinnon) and Georgie Whittle (Cheltenham) we are looking to further develop the League through our umpires in 2023. After the Home and Away games had been completed the ladders were set for a competitive finals series with 25 of the 30 clubs being represented. Well done to Narre South Saints, Parkdale Vultures, Port Melbourne Colts and Skye playing in their first finals series with East Malvern and Doveton Doves playing in finals in their inaugural year in SFNL competition.

In the lead up to the Grand Finals we held the Women's Finals Series Breakfast where the 2022 Team of the Year was presented. Aj Ballantyne (Dingley) was named Coach of the Year again and was also the successful winning coach of the A1 match in the Big Dance.

Congratulations to all the winning clubs with Dingley, Port Melbourne Colts, South Yarra and Hampton Park winning multiple Grand Finals. Teams were presented their winning cups and flags on the podium in front of their adoring supporters, in what was a resplendent day at Dingley to cap off a terrific season.

The online vote count was well received with all 12 divisions covered over the last 4 rounds, along with announcing the leading goal shooters. This then enabled the winning recipients to accept their trophy or medal at the League Award Night.

The award for Netball Administrator of the Year was also presented on the night and went to Marjorie Quiambao (Springvale Districts FNC) as she led her band of merry ladies all year, managing over 100 players for their 8 teams entered.

Thanks must also go to my right hand ladies, Kim Pentreath (Umpire Supervisor) and Lyn Wilkosz (Court Supervisor) for supporting the League and myself throughout this season. With help also from SDNA committee, Peta Young and Shannon Fox and the most popular lady, Canteen manager, Loretta Gent.

I expect 2023 to be even bigger again if that's possible. More clubs are looking to introduce netball to cater for their female members and grow their clubs.



UMPIRING REPORT

PETE MARSHALL DIRECTOR OF UMPIRING

I firstly want to acknowledge Marc Gauci, Garry Cranny, Lee Hartman, David Jennings and Luke Henry from the League and thank them for their support and efforts throughout the season - I couldn't have asked for anymore assistance or support. Also, thank you to all Member Clubs, Presidents, Coaches and lastly, the Players.

COVID tested all of us and the match day experience and environment has done a full circle in the SFNL for the better. Acknowledged and appreciated. I truly believe the SFNL is good place to both play and umpire.

The Year

The year was interesting to say the least and at times challenging for all of us in community football for clubs, players and the League included. COVID decimated our numbers, however, with the diligence shown by our Coaches and Umpires we filled 92% of our appointments and the Clubs supported us like never before.

The one constant in Finals is that we are always there. We make the Finals every year, but don't win a flag or drink out of the cup. Maybe some do but the satisfaction we get knowing we have played our role on putting on a good show and ensure the right team wins is enough. That goes week in week out, and for many, the season started way back in February. Straight into pre-season games which were numerous and spread, Good Friday, Anzac Day and Friday night games etc. And of course, the Women's competition is growing, so our effort to fill all games each week was certainly challenged. No doubt we were under the pump from the word go and I'm so proud of our achievements.

The role of our Umpire's must be recognised and respected by the Coaches, Players, Officials and Spectators. The Umpire has complete authority over Players and Coaches from the moment that he or she walks onto the football field until the game is over. This year I have no doubt the football world in our neck of the woods took this on board and the degree of acceptability and respect was grateful and accepted.

It is an important reminder to everyone involved in our game of the consequences if you abuse an Umpire. Over two and a half thousand Umpires in Victoria leave the game each year with 50% of those Umpires citing 'abuse' as the main reason for giving it away. These types of actions can have a much greater impact than what you think, and we need to treat Umpires with absolute respect, as much as we need also to command respect. The League has supported us in this area and our Umpire abuse was at an all-time low.

Our People

I would like to thank our coaching team which included Glenn Emery, Pete Bailey, Mark Mounsey, David Smith, Jason McNeice, Mitch Lea, Craig Davenport and Brett Marriott for an amazing effort this season. And to Les Stuart for his outstanding contribution many thanks. On the bench in the finals we have the best seat in the house almost.

The SFNL Umpiring fraternity remain an inclusive group -

- We have umpires from 14 to 78 years of age from diverse backgrounds and encourage female participation in all disciplines of umpiring;
- The Umpires travel from Gippsland, Footscray, Peninsula and the CBD to umpire in the SFNL (they are not just locals);
- Nearly the entire SMJFL Coaching group is comprised of SFNL Umpires who give up their time on a Sunday to develop young talent. So well done to the team at the SMJFL.

Thank you to the SFNL Umpires Association led by Travis Thompson and Tony Levett for their wonderful efforts to ensure things ran smoothly at the tribunals, after training gatherings, clothing and the Umpire's well-being - many thanks to you and the Committee.

The Numbers

- 236 registered SFNL Umpires which we look forward to building back up. What a resolute group to get the job done with an average of 27.5 games umpired by each in season 2022.
- The 'three umpire system' has become the norm and we must continue to push for this.
- Weekly basis 50 games played with over 3,500 participants including Umpires, Players, Officials and support staff.
- Nearly 300 appointments weekly.
- 38 Club's venues from Port Melbourne to Cerberus, across to Cranbourne and up to Balwyn - a big area to cover.



The Pathway and Representation of the SFNL

As you can appreciate, an enormous amount of work goes into the continual development of the Umpires in our League and in turn the standard of which they hold themselves too. The SFNL has set the benchmark in many areas which is a testament to the SFNL Umpiring fraternity.

The relationship with the SMJFL must be recognized and must continue to develop. The SFNL is the progression for the young Umpires to develop and feel safe.

- The SFNL currently have 14 Umpires officiating in the State League.
- Early season a number of our development umpires officiated in NAB League Under 16 and 18's Boys and Girls games and VFLW games. Great experience.
- AFL Victoria Umpiring Academies were offered to our group and we had 13 Umpires participate in the program with some Umpiring in the VLine Championships in April in Shepparton.
- A number of the VLine Umpires were selected to the Accelerator Squads where they trained with the VFL Umpires at Collingwood and were included in Coaching sessions.



From this experience and development of our Umpires, they have a good chance of being offered a spot on the VFL list for next season. Our future is looking bright. I would like to acknowledge and thank Andrew Talbot AFL VIC UMP DEV Officer for his support and the opportunity he gives our group.

To all Umpires who signed up, I only hope you all enjoyed their experience, made new friends and look forward to returning in 2023. Many thanks for your commitment.

FINANCE REPORT

PAUL SHOEBRIDGE TREASURER

The SFNL had a successful full season return to the fields and courts after the COVID interruptions and the off-field strategies continued to deliver positive results.

The SFNL 2022 financial results achieved a surplus of \$37,172 whilst being lower than the surplus for 2021 of \$48,306, was in line with expectations for a full season of operations.

During COVID, Government grants helped the income to remain operational during that time, grants were less in number post-COVID once we returned to normal operations.

Highlights of our 2022 results are:

- Our turnover of \$2,034,292 was an increase from \$1,416,940 in 2021. In 2022 we were able to complete a full season for the first time in three years.
- Affiliation fees increased by \$11k over 2021 as we were able to complete the full season and did not have to issue credits for cancelled games as we did in 2021.
- We had a record year for finals income of \$344k, Also there were no finals in 2021.
- The turnover for apparel increased by \$113k from 2021. The net margin for apparel increased by \$15k
- Umpiring income increased by \$77k on 2021 levels due no credits being issued for cancelled games as per 2021
- Netball income increased by \$27k due to some rounds being cancelled in 2021.
- Our sponsorship income increased by \$11k from 2021 due increased ball sponsorship from St Kilda and some new smaller partners.
- Other income decreased by \$30k due to no Job Keeper and fewer Government grants this year. We also received an additional \$40k of income with a new service contract to provide the operational requirements of Springvale District Netball Association. Grants from AFL also increased by \$34k to assist in the provision of club development services.

There was a corresponding increase in the League's expenses to \$1,997,120 in 2022 which was an increase of \$628,486 from 2021. Some of the items of note are:

- Finals costs were \$38k over budget partly due to the use of professional gate keeping services and increased security & catering costs to match increased sales.
- Umpiring, filming of games expenses, netball costs and other game costs moved in line with the related income reflecting the increased number of rounds played in 2022.
- The cost of merchandise increased by \$97k in line with increased sales.
- Insurance costs decreased by \$31k as the AFL waived the cost of Public Liability and Asset protection this year. The charge to clubs reduced by the same amount.
- Club Development expenses increased by \$40k in line with the increased funding from AFL.

Our strong net asset position continues to improve as the Financial Strategies implemented over the recent years deliver a more consistent and reliable business outcome. The emergence from the post COVID environment in a stable position places the League well to handle any challenges ahead. Importantly our club receivables continue to be reflective of the great effort put in by our clubs to manage their finances. The improvement in this area is critical for the sustainability of the SFNL and congratulations to those clubs that continue to do better.
