





A big shout out to our Umpires led by Travis Thompon, Glenn Emery and our fantastic team of umpires who have again excelled this year. The one constant I seem to always see is that they love doing what they do and have fun doing it.

• Challenges off field – Mornington Peninsula Football Netball League

We had to address the fact that mid-season the Mornington Peninsula Football League (MPFNL), led by their Chair, did something unheard of and directly approached some of our clubs to join their League via an EOI for a Third Division for 2024.

It turns out that this initiative subsequently failed to launch as it;

- Did not have the proactive support of AFL Victoria
- Did not respect the hard-earned achievement of all Leagues working collaboratively together on issues that impact each other.
- 3) Was a unilateral action by the MPFNL, who are an interim Board
- 4) Was actively supported by AFL South East as the Administrator of the region
- 5) Did not at any stage have the required support of a minimum of 17 out of 22 of their clubs or 75% before it was initiated and again when it was officially voted down at a special general meeting of the MPFNL.
- 6) Did not work within the spirit of what is being contemplated in Metro Futures League Project.

CHAIR'S REPORT

The time wasted and mid-season distraction by all involved was immense, not welcomed and not appreciated.

The four (4) Southern Clubs that made an application, in what was in the end a futile process, all called out that our League was very well run and that the junior pathways including U19s, geography, and co-locating netball with football were the main attractions.

- 2) exploring the new growth corridors to the east of our current geography.

Metro Futures Project

This is the singularly most important project we will undertake in my 13 years on the Board and the last 6 years as Chair.

It has our full attention, and we are committed to ensuring we get the best outcomes for the Southern sporting community.

PROJECT SCOPE STATEMENT:

The Metro Futures Project is commissioned to study the environment and develop recommendations
that support future optimal and collaborative approaches to football in Melbourne while considering the
impact on, and influence of, neighbouring regions.

MAIN PROJECT OUTCOME:

- · Outcome by 30 June 2024 is Stage 3 AFL Victoria to League Affiliation Agreements.
- Explore AFL Victoria Affiliation Agreements with Metropolitan Leagues to implement an optimal, collaborative approach to football in Metropolitan Melbourne and neighbouring regions.

PROJECT BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE:

Metropolitan Football is evolving as Melbourne continues to experience change through the
influences of increased multi culturalism, expansion of female participation and many other social
factors, such as people's age, gender, habits, competing sports and evolving entertainment options,
technology, disability and by social groups.

CHAIR'S REPORT

- Any analysis of community football historically reveals how Leagues have expanded their footprint, others have collapsed, whilst Clubs have transferred leagues, changed their playing divisions, gone into recess and a range of other actions based on the key influences at that time.
- The Project rationale is to promote the concept of an Industry approach to broader, strategic focused approach of football in Melbourne between AFL Victoria and the 10 Metropolitan Leagues.
- Aspirational, AFL Victoria propose a collective approach, guiding principles and growth strategies supported by a collaborative affiliation model to better serve the game now and into the future.
- It is not proposed to negate the need for League or State Regulations, rather an opportunity to be ahead of trends, growth potential and the consequence of change.

PROJECT SUCCESS CRITERIA:

The project criteria and measures of success are:

- Acceptance of the Project Plan by Metropolitan Leagues.
- 2) Involvement by Metropolitan League Boards to participate willingly in the Project.
- 3) Involvement by key stakeholders during the consultation and engagement.
- 4) Access to current and relevant data (football and community specific).
- 5) Timeframes being adhered to for all Project Milestones.
- 6) Communications plan adhered to by all key stakeholders.
- 7) Presentation of Preliminary Draft Recommendations to the Control Group which reflect a collaborative approach to football in Metropolitan Melbourne and neighbouring regions.
- 8) Control Group aligning on the Recommendations which reflect a collaborative industry approach to football in metropolitan Melbourne and neighbouring regions which is endorsed by Metropolitan League Boards and AFL Victoria.
- 9) An agreed Football Industry approach to community football.



- 10) Recommendations endorsed by Metropolitan Leagues are implemented under an Implementation Plan to be developed pending adoption.
- Ensuring the future viability and vitality of football following implementation of recommendations.
- 12) The collaborative, ongoing and continuous industry analysis of football in Metropolitan Melbourne and neighbouring regions.

Pathways and Southern Juniors for 2025

We have continued to try to work collaboratively with the South Metro Junior Football League and eventually were successful in standing up an U8s and U9s team from Black Rock in 2023. Congratulations Black Rock FNC.

We will continue to work alongside the SMJFL to present a clear pathway to clubs to assist their current and prospective junior programs. Transparency is something that we can improve and will endeavour to provide clubs with clear action and timelines that are easy to follow and understood which encourage our Senior Clubs to invest in their own programs.

We are hopeful this is just the beginning.

Practically, success is a Pathway that covers;

- Pathways Junior School to Auskick to Juniors to Youth to Seniors
- 2) Football and Netball
- All codes
- 4) All ages
- 5) All genders
- 6) The highest possible acquisition rate
- 7) The highest possible retention rate

Our relationship with the St Kilda Football Club is one of strength, we are now working with them on Community initiatives, Commercial Opportunities and sharing services such as IT, Coaching and Trainers opportunities and our successful Development programming, giving league participants the opportunity to participate in the program that gives them a first hand look inside an AFL club with both on and off the field education over a period of 8 weeks. We would like more commitment from clubs towards this program which will kick off in March 2024 again

I am pleased to say we have been working very hard in the Under 19 space with the help of AFL Victoria. We're optimistic in our U19 growth for 2024 with several clubs in the position of returning to this competition. We hope to increase the women's football teams and netball teams again in 2024.

I look forward to seeing you all at the football and netball in 2024, enjoy the off season and thanks again for making our league a strong and prosperous one.

The SFNL 2023 financial result achieved a surplus of \$3,600 which was lower than our 2022 surplus of \$37,172. Our underlying operating result remained healthy with our 2023 result being affected by RSEA Park costs and a netball cost that was backdated to 2022.

Highlights of our 2023 results are set out below:

Our turnover of \$2,237,560 was an increase of \$203,268 from \$2,034,292 in 2022. The main factors were:

- There was a significant increase in merchandise turnover of \$143k or 35%. The net margin for apparel increased by \$32k. There were increases in sales across all lines of apparel.
- We had another record year for finals income of \$377k, an increase of \$33k over 2022 which itself was a record year.
- Umpiring income increased by \$60k on 2022 levels which was in line with the increase in umpiring costs.
- Club insurance revenue increased by \$35k in line with the increased cost of insurance. The AFL
 reduced insurance costs in 2022 to assist in the recovery from Covid. Insurance revenue and cost
 returned to normal levels in 2023.
- Grants were \$55k which was \$62k lower than 2022. Grants in 2022 included covid related grants no longer available.
- Netball Income rose by \$31k due to an increase of teams and umpire fees from 2022.
- Affiliation fees, netball fees, sponsorship, media income, function income were in line with expectations and 2022 levels.







There was a corresponding increase in the League's expenses to \$2,233,960 in 2023 which was an increase of \$236,840 from 2022. Some of the items of note are:

- . The cost of merchandise increased by \$111k in line with increased sales.
- Insurance costs increased by \$33k returning to normal levels after the cost reduction in 2022.
- Umpiring costs increased by \$65k mainly due to a 5% increase in umpiring rates in 2023, no byes and a greater level of umpiring appointments fulfilled in 2023.
- Netball expenses increased by \$41k primarily due to \$21k of court maintenance fees being paid to SDNA in 2023 which included the 2022 amount as well. The 2022 SDNA costs of \$11k were invoiced in March 2023. Umpiring expenses increased by \$17k.
- Finance and admin costs increased by \$31k primarily due to \$18k of RSEA oval maintenance costs being charged in 2023 which related to both the 2022 and 2023 years. There were also one-off club rebates paid in 2023 totalling \$14k.
- Media costs were lower by \$19k than in 2022 due to fewer reserves games being filmed (which were then on invoiced to clubs).
- Employment, function costs, finals costs, filming of games expenses, development costs, depreciation costs moved in line with the previous year and expectations.

Our strong net asset position continued to improve as the Financial Strategies implemented over recent years deliver a more consistent and reliable business outcome.

Importantly our club receivables continue to be a challenge by some member clubs to manage their finances. The improvement in this area is critical for the sustainability of the SFNL and congratulations to those clubs that continue to meet the payments on time.



After an uninterrupted season in 2022 and completing our first finals series since 2019, the league was thrilled to have another full season including finals in 2023.


It certainly hasn't been an easy couple of years for community sport. This year saw a lot more normality as clubs getting back into the rhythm of week-to-week football. It was fantastic to visit a lot of the clubs throughout the year and feel the passion that they bring to their club and community sport. A lot of hard work goes into the season by all of our clubs, volunteers & umpires which ensured the running of a smooth and successful season.

Competition Growth

The league saw Hallam depart prior to the 2023 season for AFL Outer East whilst we welcomed Heatherhill into the Thirds competition for their first year as a football club.

The SFNL provided the opportunity for 4,284 registered participants across 39 member clubs to be involved in organised community football in season 2023. This was made up of 3,853 male players from 93 teams and 431 female players from 12 teams from and 11 member clubs. Overall participation numbers were slightly up from 2022, however we saw a small decrease in team numbers. Our Under 19's competition went from 13 to ten teams and Women's competition from 15 to 12, whilst our Thirds competition increased from ten to 14 teams.

The league is looking forward to the continued growth of all competitions going into season 2024. Overall team numbers in football were slightly down from 2023.



Development Squad

In partnership with the St Kilda Football Club, the League delivered the third year of the SFNL Development Squad. The Development Squad provided our competitions most up and coming male and female players with the opportunity to be trained and educated by some of the industry's elite professionals.

The program was delivered by Coaches, Brad Crouch and Selena Karlson over 6-8 weeks and consisted of a mixture of on-field drills and off field presentations from experts in the AFL industry including St Kilda AFLW Captain Hannah Priest.

The League was thrilled to be able to use RSEA Park for the on-field sessions and for the off-field sessions the group was lucky enough to use the Danny Frawley Centre facility such as the lane pools for recovery sessions and the meeting rooms for the off-field development sessions.

Below are some of the on-field skills and off-field presentations that the group went through during the program.

On-Field Skills & Development

- Body work technique
- Handballing craft

Club Sustainability Program

In order to maintain, support and grow Australian football at the community football level it is important that teams fielded by community Clubs are as strong and well matched as possible.

The 2023 season marked the eighth year of the state-wide Community Club Sustainability Program (CCSP) with the enforcement of both the Player Points System (PPS) and Player Payment Rules for all Senior Men's grade competitions.

Player Points

Each Senior male player is allocated a points value between 1 and 6 which is objectively determined by the level of football that player has played over the current and previous three seasons. The League continued to assess and enter all player points values in GameDay.

The total player points budget per Senior team remained at 46 points from the (2022) season. The below table outlined the averages for all Senior teams by division in 2023.

Player Payments

The support for community football competitions and participating Clubs and the opportunity for players to develop and display their skills depends upon those competitions being conducted between evenly matched and financially viable Clubs. The pursuit of these objective assists in attracting and maintaining the interest of players, supporters, officeholders, sponsors and volunteers, all of whom are essential for community football competitions and Clubs.

To assist in achieving these objectives, the Southern Football Netball League (SFNL) has Adopted the Player Payment Rule (PPR) in which the player payment allowance (salary caps) outlined below were enforced in 2023 to ensure each Club could compete equitably and sustainably.

Division 1- \$110,00 (maximum cap for all Metro Leagues)

Division 2- \$80,000

Division 3-\$40,000

Division 4- \$30,000

AFL Victoria in conjunction with the League completed several reviews of SFNL Member Clubs throughout the season to ensure the Player Payment Rules were being adhered to and that all submissions were accurate and timely. I would like to thank all Member Clubs that were selected to participate in the audits for their cooperation and assistance in facilitating this process.

I would also like to thank the AFL, the appointed Integrity Officer and all Member Clubs for submitting the budget and player declarations as per the requirements with the Player Payment Rules & Guidelines Policy.

Tribunal and MRP

The League continued with its robust Independent Tribunal and Match Review Panel (MRP) procedures for 2023. This was underpinned by the invaluable return of key appointments to ensure consistent outcomes were achieved and met with community football expectations.

On-field behaviour was once again outstanding and was certainly an improvement from the previous season. Any incidents throughout the year were addressed quickly by the League with the cooperation and full support of the Member Clubs involved when it came to Set Penalties, MRP & Tribunal.

The Independent Tribunal was again led by Chair Andrew Lefebvre and was ably supported by seven Panel Members over the course of the season. Iain Findlay continued in his role as the Appeals Chair and Kim Brimelow commenced his fourth year with the SFNL as the League Prosecutor. All appointments once again demonstrated their immense experience and professionalism in support of the League's disciplinary procedures which is highlighted by the achievements below.

The SFNL made a total of 102 reports under the Laws of Australian Football and the League By-Laws of players and officials during the year which was a 4% improvement on last season. Of the total 102 reports, this accumulated a total of 177 matches in suspensions being handed down, which was a 38% improvement from last season which shows the behaviour within the league is certainly increasing.

There was a total of 25 Independent Tribunal Hearings in which 21 of the cases were found guilty resulting in 64 matches in suspensions. The Match Review Panel (MRP) laid 29 charges in which 21 set penalties were accepted and 8 were sent to the tribunal in which all were found guilty and resulted in 52 matches of suspension. The League brought in a new multiple card rule for 2023, where if a player received 3 Yellow or Red cards in the same season, they were automatically given a 1 match suspension.

There were 390 yellow cards given out on matchday which resulted in 12 players being suspended under this new League rule.

The League would like to thank the entire Independent Tribunal, the MRP, Kim Brimelow and Iain Findlay for their dedication of time, efforts and commitment League.

Finals

After a successful finals series in 2022 the first one since 2019, the League was again looking forward to another successful finals series for all clubs, players, coaches, umpires & volunteers involved.

The League was blessed with incredible weather over the seven weeks of finals which was based across 5 venues. The League saw some fantastic numbers come through the gates throughout the 5 venues.

We saw over 10,000 people over the 6 days at RSEA Park which just showed the incredible support for our participating clubs and the League. An incredible amount of work is required to successfully deliver a Final Series. On behalf of the League, I would like to thank the St Kilda Football Club and the following host Clubs and volunteers that worked tirelessly over the seven weeks of football Finals

- Mordialloc Football Netball Club Division 2 & Thirds Finals
- Skye Football Netball Club Division 3 Finals
- Heatherton Football Netball Club Division 4 Finals
- Endeavour Hills Senior Football Club Women's Division 1 & 2 Finals

Twenty-six out of our 39 Member Clubs competed in the 2023 SFNL Finals Series across the 12 grades of football which is a great representation of the League. What is pleasing to highlight was the competitiveness of all matches as teams were evenly matched throughout the Final Series. The average winning margin for the entire Final Series was 28.1 points.

A special congratulations to the 8 Member Clubs and 12 teams that achieved the ultimate success in season 2023.

To all the committees and wonderful volunteers who contribute so much value at your Club, our competition and wider community, thank you once again for your unwavering support. Your demonstrated commitment and effort that ensures each year is a continued success is truly appreciated.

I would like to thank the SFNL team. To my colleagues Lee Hartman, Caitlin Walsh, Wes Garth, Travis Switzer, Jenny Mouat & James Mouat. Thank you for support and congratulations on a very successful year. To Glenn Emery, Adam Marrow & Peter Marshall thank you for support & leadership of our Umpires for another year.

A special thank you to David Jennings who departed the SFNL mid-season to take up the role of WRFL CEO. Thank you for being a great mentor and for helping me grow in the role.

I look forward to an exciting and to a bigger and better year in 2024.

We had over 100 teams entered for this season, leading to the development of our 13th division. We welcomed entries from 33 Clubs and for the first time,

teams from South Mornington FNC and Noble Park NC. In what must be a first nation wide, we did not cancel any games this season due to the weather, and even managed some relatively sunny afternoons late in the season. The league had a record 1465 registered participants, including our players, coaches, umpires and Club committee members.

Carrum Patterson Lakes and Lyndhurst hosted games for the first time at their new home courts. They join St Kilda City, Keysborough, Mordialloc, Hampton Park, Port Melbourne Colts, Cranbourne, Edithvale-Aspendale and Doveton Doves in being able to host matches at their home ground.

Following the updated Netball Australia Uniform Guidelines, our Clubs were encouraged to include other uniform items in Club colours besides their playing dress. We saw many pairs of leggings and long sleeve tops during the Winter months, particularly during some of our fixtured night games. In particular, Edithvale Aspendale NC included a full suite of items for their players to choose from including shorts and singlets.

Murrumbeena once again celebrated NAIDOC week by hosting their Round 12 match ups against Springvale Districts (A2), St Kilda City (B1) and Skye (C3) at Duncan McKinnon Reserve. The evening included the competing teams and umpires gathering for a smoking ceremony and recognition of the Bunurong people, on who's land we were gathered on.

Our Annual Pride round was celebrated in Round 8 between St Kilda City and Dingley in A2. Both teams were commemorative bibs to signify the inclusion opportunities that the league provides in our netball competition. South Yarra also hosted their Pride Round during Round 10.

At our Women's Grand Final Breakfast we saw the A1 Team of the Year, and for the first time, A2 Team of the Year awarded to our netballers, voted by the coaches of each division. Nine different Clubs were represented, with AJ Ballantyne (Dingley) and Rod Tatter (Murrumbeena) named as coaches of each respective team. It was fantastic to hear from special guest, Australian Diamond and Queensland Firebird player, Kim Ravaillion and her daughter Georgie.





In terms of individual accolades, for the third straight season, Bella Hodgson was our A1 Leading Goal Scorer. We had 3 division leading goal scorers with 500 or more goals – Sam Gabriel (A2 Springvale Districts), Felicity Joe (A4 East Brighton) and Tegan Ryan (C1 Springvale Districts). Paris Tatter (A2 Murrumbeena) and Natahlia Poli (C2 Dandenong) were named Best & Fairest for the second year running.

On Grand Final day we celebrated first time Premiers, St Paul's McKinnon, Bentleigh, Skye and Springvale Districts. As well as first time Grand Final winner, Frankston Dolphins (minor premiers in 2021 due to the shortened season). We had 20 different Clubs represented on Grand Final day, the most we have ever had and it is a great sign of how our league has developed. Hampton Park and South Yarra felt that winning feeling twice on the day, taking away 2 Premierships each. Cheltenham become the 4th Club in the league's history to win an A1 Premiership, defeating Dingley in the Grand Final, in what was a repeat match up from 2022.

Our A2 Grand Final played into over time with St Paul's upsetting Murrumbeena in the final minutes. Our Netball Club Administrator of the Year was awarded to Kristal Kitto, St Kilda City FNC Netball President. Kristal is a great leader of her Club and manages all aspects of netball for St Kilda City. St Kilda City entered 4 teams into our competition this year and tick all the boxes in regards to competition requirements. The Club enjoys hosting home games and go above and beyond in regards to umpires supplied. Kristal, and Head Coach, Mel Starr, are always seeking to better their netball program and develop their players.

This year there was a major focus on supporting our Club's requirements to provide umpires for our competition, which resulted in 15 brand new umpires. Led by our senior mentors, Marilyn Myszka, Amy Gifford, Chelsea Smith, Caitlin Myzska, Emily Myszka and Caitlin Rodwell, a comprehensive introductory program was developed and implemented across the season to support and guide our beginner umpires. Umpire coaching was also significantly increased with the help of our more experienced umpires this season. We worked very closely with the Springvale District Netball Association to provide opportunities for their junior umpires to work towards and achieve their C Badges, congratulations to Milly Hughes, Charlie Hughes, Alice Gough, Leighton Miller, Neriah Foster Jonassen, Leila Tebb, Charlie Wilson, Tahlia Roberts and Poppi Sherlock. We also awarded Sarah Kennedy (St Kilda City) her C Badge during the season.

I firstly want to acknowledge Lee Hartman, David Jennings, Travis Switzer, Luke Henry and Wes Garth from the League and thank them for all their support and efforts throughout the season. They were always available to provide advice and make my job easier which was greatly appreciated.

The year was highly successful with our group showing tremendous growth in our numbers in all facets of field, boundary and goal umpires. This resulted in all field umpire appointments being filled 100% for the entire year as well as in the boundary, for the first time in many years.

In numbers our field group increased to 102 (78 in 2022), Boundary umpires 91 (43 in 2022) and Goal Umpires 52 (42 in 2022). In addition we sent the most field umpires of any group in Victoria (6) to the VFL and (1) Goal Umpire. Whilst this left a significant hole in our numbers at the elite end of our group it also provided significant opportunity for the next tier to train hard and be rewarded with quality opportunities within the season and in finals.

We also achieved significant growth in our female umpiring numbers in 2023 in both the field and boundary. We had a record number of female umpires be appointed to Grand Finals (3) in the Field,(3) in the Boundary and a further (2) as Goal Umpires. The AFL recognised this growth by approaching me during the season and offering the league a AFL funded Female Liaison Manager role which was taken up by Kaye Johnson to focus on umpire recruitment, retention and support. We also provided an opportunity to all clubs to be visited by the leadership of our group at preseason training which was taken up by a number of clubs and hopefully provided clarity around rules and improved their relationship with the umpiring group.



UNDIRES REPORT

I would like to thank all my coaching team for all their efforts throughout the season. At times it can be a very intense role which requires significant time and effort to ensure the correct message is being passed on to our group. All coaches applied themselves without question to the numerous expectations of the role which started back in the first week on February with the commencement of training

I want to also acknowledge the significant efforts of the SFNL Umpires Association led by Travis Thompson and Tony Levett and the committee. I found my dealings with Travis and Tony were always positive thoughtful and supportive and made my job so much easier throughout the year.

The relationship with the SMJFL must be recognized and must continue to develop. The SMJFL is the progression for the young Umpires to develop and feel safe before moving into senior football. Without question our connection with the SMJFL and providing that step to senior football will determine the size \alpha and health of our senior group for years to come. If we do not strive to maintain this connection in e.g. using the same training venue this will have an impact over the ensuing years.


