SFNL announce inductees to Hall of Fame

The Southern Football Netball League is excited to announce the 22 inaugural inductees of the Hall of Fame. The SFNL Hall of Fame was launched earlier this year to recognise and celebrate people who have made significant contributions to the SFNL or its forerunners.

The inductees have been selected from their involvement in the SFNL and its ancestors being the Federal Football League, Eastern Suburbs Churches Football Association and South East Suburban Football League.

The SFNL Hall of Fame sub-committee received over 60 nominations which were carefully considered and attributed to different categories being a player, administrator, official, coach, umpire, media or life time achiever.

The quality of the nominations was outstanding making for an extremely difficult task for the SFNL. The sub-committee assessed the nominees over many areas including longevity, quality of performance, integrity, sportsmanship, good character and promoting the values of the SFNL or the forerunners FFL, ESCFA and SESFL.

The SFNL Board reviewed a recommendation from the sub-committee and approved 22 inductees into the Hall of Fame in 2015. DIVISION 1: FRONT & CENTRE / WILL HUNTER

St Kilda City blew a golden opportunity to claim a top-four scalp, going down by seven points to Mordialloc at Ben Kavanagh Reserve. The inaccurate Saints kicked themselves out of it, registering 3.8 in the first term when they had the chance to put the Bloods to the sword. Little separated the two sides all afternoon but four goals in the final term saw Mordi home, with Stefan Gregory and Beau Turner among the contributors. Henry Sullivan and Cam Hansen lead the way for City.

Meanwhile East Malvern bounced back with a 30-point win over Bentleigh at Bentleigh Reserve. The Demons, well served by Sam McGarry and Jackson Meredith, played exciting footy and kept their noses in front for much of the first half. But they eventually ran out of steam, allowing the Panthers to storm home with 10 goals to five after the long break. Mark Ryan booted six majors to claim top spot on the league goalkicking table while Callan Van Dyke was also colossal for the winners.

A gallant Cheltenham pushed East Brighton all the way in their clash at Jack Barker Oval but ultimately the Rosellas couldn't finish off the job. Chelt led by eight points at the final change and it looked like a stunning upset was on the cards. But the Vampires lifted, piling on seven goals to one in a dominant last quarter to set up a comfortable 32-point victory. Toby Mahoney was superb with four goals, while Tom Jessup and Mitch Garvey were also instrumental. For the Rosellas it was Andy Dewar and Pat Nicholls leading the resistance.

St Pauls has jumped into the top five for the first time in 2015 after disposing of Chelsea Heights by 39 points at Beazley Reserve. This was a game the Doggies never looked like losing as they led from start to finish. Travis Ridgeway was the difference, claiming best afield honours with a six-goal masterclass for the winners. His teammate Jarryd Allan continued his sizzling form while the Heighters were well served by Pat Morrissey and Joel Williams.

The final game saw a rampant Dingley outfit slaughter Clayton to the tune of 103 points at Souter Oval. An 11-goal-to-nil demolition in the third term pushed the difference beyond the triple-digit mark by three quarter time, but the Clays did well to prevent the margin blowing out further with a respectable final stanza. Big Dean Francis was back to his best with a five-goal bag, while Dan Farmer (four majors) also had a huge impact. Daniel Kirby was Clayton's best.

At the halfway point of the home and away season all sides having now had a good look at each other and from here the competition really starts to heat up.

Dingley V East Brighton (Souter Oval)

This top-of-the-table clash could well be the game of the year. Since their touch up in Round 1 the Vampires have not dropped a game, with their defence proving to be the best in the comp. The Dingoes, however, are in ominous form and possess more attacking firepower than any other side so this will be the Vampires' biggest test to date. East Brighton has shown an ability to dig deep and have found another gear when challenged this season, but will need to be at their very best to win this one. Dingley will start this game as favourites and I think they will be hard to beat at the Den.

St Pauls V East Malvern (McKinnon Reserve)

Having finally got its season back on track St Pauls turns its attention to East Malvern at the Kennel this week. Injuries have impacted on the Panthers' performances in the last few games and they will be keen prove to the rest of the comp that they still mean business. The Dogs meanwhile need a win to consolidate its spot in the five. With plenty on the line this will be a cracking game but I'm tipping East Malvern in a nail-biter.

Cheltenham V St Kilda City (Jack Barker Oval)

Neither of these teams has set the world on fire this season, but both had their chances to win last week against top opposition. They will no doubt be disappointed with their inability to get the job done and both will come out this week with a point to prove. Despite their flaky form so far Cheltenham are still a realistic chance to make finals, but this is a game they simply cannot afford to lose. Back them in to win here.

Bentleigh V Clayton (Bentleigh Reserve)

This is another clash featuring two sides struggling for consistency. The Clays have certainly improved this season and find themselves in finals contention. Bentleigh, on the other hand, is a side full of talented kids that will no doubt be a force in the coming years. With Clayton coming off a demoralising 100-point thrashing, and playing in front of the parochial Bentleigh crowd I think the Demons will take the points.

Chelsea Heights V Mordialloc (Beazley Reserve)

The last match between these two sides was decided by 104 points but you can bet your life this one won't be a similar blowout. Chelsea Heights have overcome an abysmal start to the season and are now playing some much better footy, so there are encouraging signs there. Mordi's depth has been tested in recent weeks, but you would expect they will still be too good for the winless Heighters.

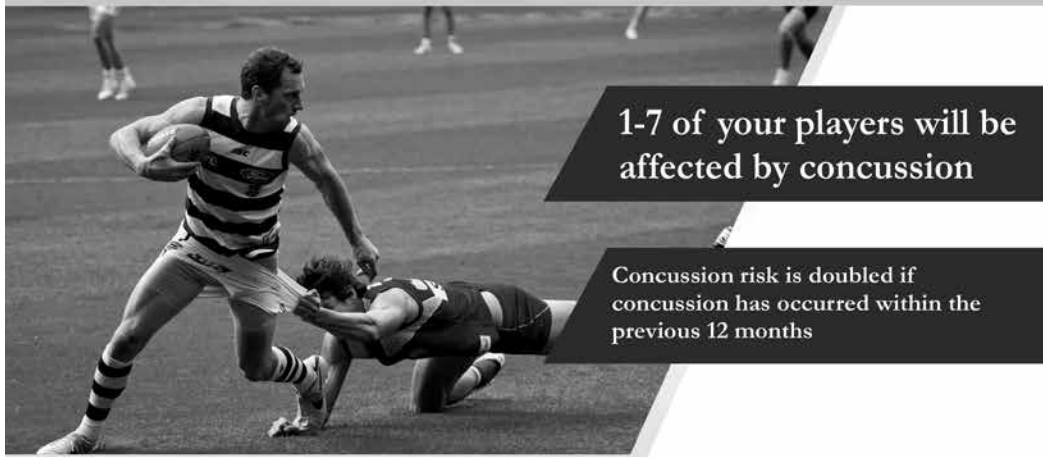

SFNL ANNOUNCE INDUCTEES TO HALL OF FAME

Every football person is charmed by the notion of the local hero who "could have made it" in the big time of League football.

Kevan "Icy" Hamilton's tale goes one step further than that. He actually did make the grade at the highest level in a major way, but suddenly fell out of favour and headed back to local footy where his impact was enormous.

He was recruited from McKinnon by the all-conquering Melbourne, but the legend has it that he was axed after arguing with famed coach Norm Smith at training. Picked up by Carlton for the 1956 season the tall rover and forward pocket made an instant impact with eight goals across his first two games, but he didn't retain his spot consistently and finished with a season total of 11 games and 22 goals. That 22 goal total was enough to earn the ranking of Carlton's leading goalkicker in a low scoring era. The Blueseum website notes that he once triumphed in a charity day kicking contest at Williamstown by roosting a footy 75 yards.

In 1957 he languished in the Carlton reserves without adding a senior game and was cleared back to McKinnon at the end of the season. At his original club he had a mercurial career winning no less than five competition best and fairests in the Federal Football league.

Now Icy Hamilton is one of 22 inaugural inductees to the Southern Football Netball League Hall of Fame. The SFNL Hall of Fame was launched earlier this year to recognise and celebrate people who have made significant contributions to the SFNL or its forerunner competitions.

The inductees have been selected from their involvement in the SFNL and its ancestors – the Federal Football League, Eastern Suburbs Churches Football Association and South East Suburban Football League.

The SFNL Hall of Fame sub-committee received over 60 nominations which were carefully considered and attributed to different categories of player, administrator, official, coach, umpire, media or life time achiever.

The quality of the nominations was outstanding and made for an extremely difficult task for the SFNL. The sub-committee assessed the nominees over many areas including longevity, quality of performance, integrity, sportsmanship, good character and promoting the values of the SFNL or the forerunners FFL, ESCFA and SESFL.

The SFNL Board reviewed a recommendation from the sub-committee and approved 22 inductees into the Hall of Fame in 2015. The inductees have been selected from the Federal Football League (4), Eastern Suburbs Churches Football Association (4), South East Suburban Football League (4) and Southern Football Netball League (10).

SFNL Board Chairman Mark Seymour believes the inductees selected are a wonderful representation of all the volunteers in community football in the last 60 years.

"The SFNL very much look forward to celebrating and recognising the 22 inductees at the inaugural Hall of Fame function in July," Mark explained.

"Volunteers are the lifeblood of community sport and the SFNL are delighted we have the ability to honour these outstanding contributors to the SFNL and its forerunners."

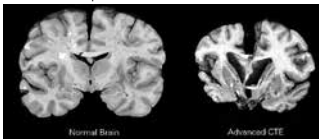

Have you ever wondered how AFL players who have a concussion one week can play the next?

In an ideal world, every single community club would have a medical doctor associated with it. In reality this is not going to happen- but by following the correct concussion protocols players can return to play safely in as little as 6 days after a minor concussion. Concussion requires careful monitoring, which can be performed by a sports trainer or coach who has been trained in best practice concussion management with the support of a healthcare practitioner.



Neurocognitive baseline testing sounds intimidating but in reality it is a 25 minute computer test that feels more like a computer game. The test measures things like speed of reaction, memory recall and impulse control - functionalities of the brain that are affected by concussion. If a player takes a hit hard enough to cause a suspected concussion then a second test is conducted and results from post injury to baseline are analysed and provided to a doctor. Having this data is key in order to identify if you have a suspected concussion. MRI's and CT scans are fantastic to show high risk brain bleeds but they CANNOT diagnose concussion.

Graduated Return to Play programs are a 5-step process where monitoring of symptoms over a period of increased physical activity can determine symptom flare-ups. If you are symptom free, you, your team and your coaches can be confident that you'll be cleared to play safely.

The SFNL have been extremely proactive this season by ensuring their senior rep squad have been baseline tested. GETTING TO KNOW THE HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES / JAMES RAKNES

Darrell Molloy – Federal Football League



Dedicated, committed, demanding, genuine – the characteristics of Darrell Molloy. A man that gave 49-years service to the Federal League, Black Rock FC, Highett FC and Superules leagues.

Football meant more to Darrell than a game; it was a massive part of his life. Nothing was ever too much trouble

when it came to helping the team. Molloy considered his time with the various clubs and leagues as a privilege over everything else.

Darrell shifted into coaching straight after finishing his playing career. He never wanted to miss a beat. He led his Black Rock FC under 18/s to the premiership in 1956. Black Rock were down by seven goals heading into the forth. Mentone had begun baking the cake to celebrate, too soon as it would be, Molloy's kids came back to snatch victory and the cup.

Garry Cranny – Southern Football Netball League



Garry Cranny has been involved with the local football community his entire life. Caulfield, Glenhuntingly and St. Kevin's Ormond to name a few. His career from playing into coaching is storied enough but Cranny is most proud of to his administrating.

Cranny is being inducted into the Hall of Fame based on his devotion to local football. With

this, he carries a strong passion for the football community in Melbourne's southeast.

As soon as he left the sidelines for the boardroom, Cranny's impact was evident. He oversaw the St Kevin's - Gardenvale merger forming Caulfield FC in 1993, acting as president until '99. He's a life member of the club he helped build, encapsulating the kind of person Garry Cranny is and the character the Hall of Fame is hoping to reveal.

Cranny's ties to the local football scene go back 40 years. Playing in the Federal League as young as 11. Described as a tough competition with incredible talent it produced many league footballers, disproportionate to the size of the area

Molloy is a Life member at Black Rock although he is most known for his dedication and development of the Federal League. He was secretary from 1960-79 then president in 1980. Darrell was honored that he was able to help develop the league. He loved to be in charge and always strived for things to be done the right way.

Molloy was demanding, devoted and fearless. In the committee meetings he would carry a thick briefcase, filled with a dozen pieces of paper. He laid them on the desk as the commander at the head of the table. The catch? He never actually had anything written down and the briefcase was empty. But that didn't matter; Darrell Molloy was a leader.

A few leadership tricks aside, Molloy was incredibly genuine and sympathetic. His youngest brother, Ivan went blind at age 15. Darrell would often take Ivan behind the goals at local federal league games and commentate the play by play. Not for the praise or admiration, because he loved his family and always wanted the best for them.

Molloy devoted time to supporting the Superules Leagues; he loved to promote the competition for the older players. Compassionate for their cause just as was tough in everything else he supported. Molloy's decades of efforts in the administration of the Federal League are now being acknowledged. His induction into the Hall of Fame is a tribute to a lifetime of relentless service.

Cranny remembers traveling to Federal games in the back of a furniture truck, where the boys would sit on bench seats with the back door half open. Some things may have changed - but community football is still about mateship. The reason Garry is still involved today.

A short break overseas, a time Cranny describes as his life after footy, didn't last long. The SFNL was in trouble and needed help. Reluctant at first, Garry raised his hand and in 2006 joined the league's board.

"Footy had been my life in this area. I wanted to play my part in keeping the Southern Footy League alive," said Cranny. Now, nearly 10 years later, Garry has seen the resurrection of the league.

"Thanks to a succession of good board people, great presidents, we've managed to thrive again."

With 33 clubs and nearly \$1.5million in turnover, the league has never been stronger. "Our business is people ... creating an environment where they can prosper, becoming a family," says Cranny. "The clubs add value to their community, that's what they're there for... that's most important."

Cranny believes the league gives its players and all involved a sense of belonging. "The power of footy clubs is in the support that they can give people in difficult times," explained Cranny. "We face so many issues in the community and local footy clubs provide a place where people feel wanted, and encouraged."

Wally Beckwith – Federal Football League



Wally Beckwith loved his sport, a key drive for this Australian sportsman. Consistently involved with football and athletics, Wally was a keen runner, umpire and joined every committee that would have him.

A well respected, people person, Wally made

the list for one Fitzroy FC game in 1918. After a career ending ankle injury, the debutant never lost his team's spirit. Decades later he could still be found pre-game in the Fitzroy rooms, often with his young son John.

There isn't an individual with more dedication to the league and sport community than Wally Beckwith.

His passion for athletic running spanned three decades. The 17-year-old Wally ran for 30 years in the Victorian Athletic League, sprinting up until 1930. Wally won a host of handicapped races. His best result, a third place finish at the Stawell Gift in 1915.

A life member of the Stawell Athletic Club, Wally was no stranger to athletic events in the area. He and the gents' would often take several days, sometimes three, to drive the to the states west. Wally said that it was because of the 'bad roads' that made the drive so long, and definitely wasn't the various nightspots that delayed them.

Wally always wanted to be involved. The nature of prowess didn't matter – Wally was going to succeed at everything possible. When football wasn't an option he turned to umpiring. His quick feet and running ability made him perfect for the boundary, officiating in the VFL in the winter while running professionally in summer up until 1930.

Turning his attention to his son, Wally followed John to Black Rock FC in 1946. Part of the Federal League, Wally became so involved with John's blossoming football career; he joined the clubs committee sparking his true legacy.

From the committee to the President of the Federal League in which many said Wally pioneered. He was a true people person, passionate about others and incredibly skilled at record keeping were the cornerstones of his success. His induction to the Hall of Fame is a true testament to his character and work ethic towards the league he loved so dearly.

Another major contributor for the Magpies was Frank Martinicchio who booted four majors. With half the home and away season now completed, a number of teams are in with a shot at the premiership.
