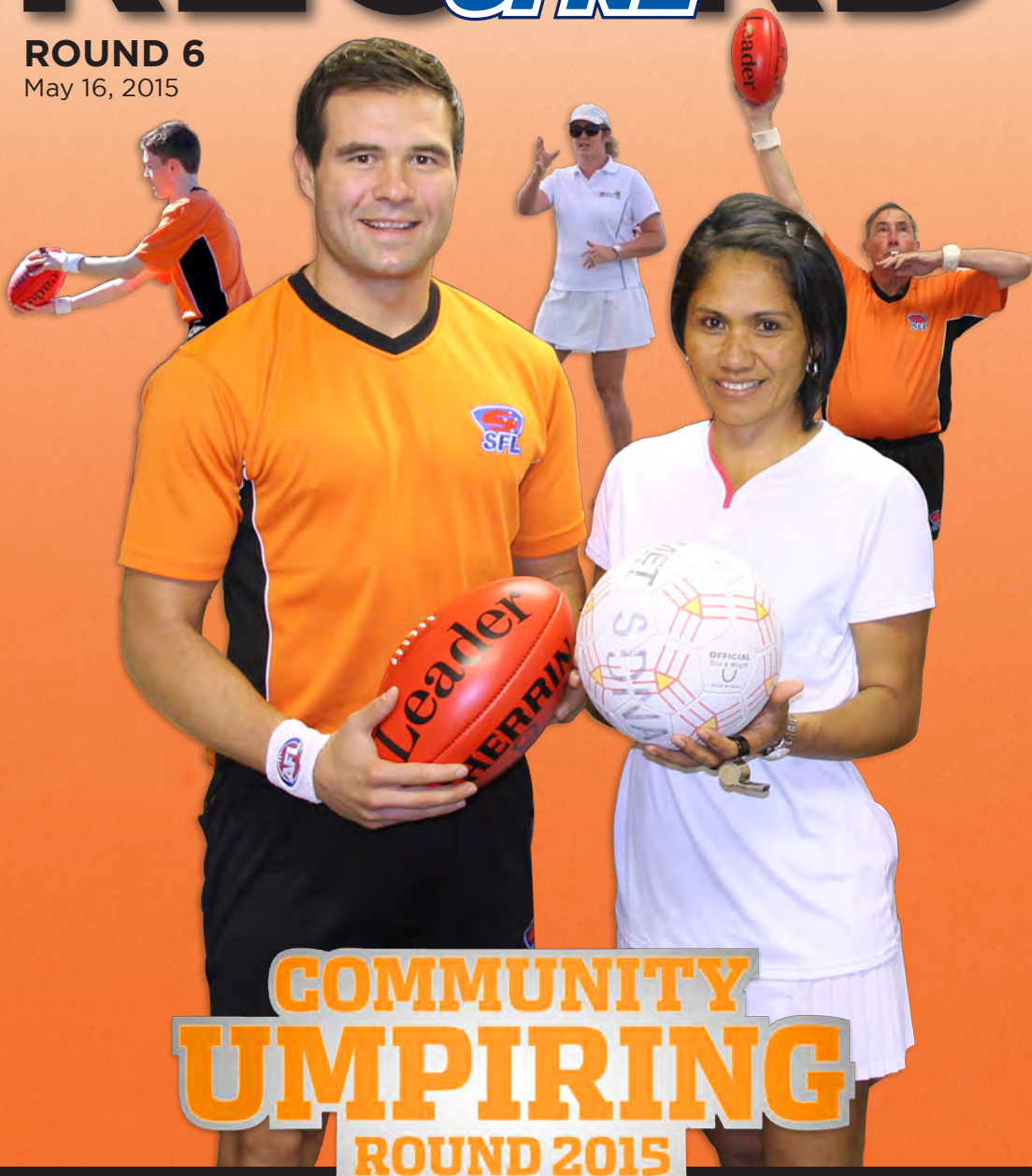

Cerberus FC name oval after McAuliffe family

DIVISION 1: FRONT & CENTRE / WILL HUNTER

Bentleigh has done coach Paul Dimattina's ticker no favours as they played out their third nail-biting finish in as many weeks. Unfortunately they were on the wrong side of the ledger this time, going down by three points to Cheltenham at Jack Barker Oval. The game was a good, old-fashioned scrap for four quarters but the Rosellas managed to take control of the game in the third term with Daniel Vaughan again instrumental. Two late goals to the Demons made the game interesting, but it wasn't enough as the home side held on for a nail-biting win. Jackson Meredith was among the best for the Demons.

Over at Ben Kavanagh Reserve, Mordialloc continued its stunning start to the season, knocking off St Pauls by nine points in another thrilling, albeit low-scoring encounter. The Dogs led for most of the first half before three third-term goals got the Bloods' noses in front. From there they held the visitors at bay, despite the best efforts of Harley Ambrose. James Keighley and Simon Fragiacomio were the standouts for Mordi.

East Malvern, meanwhile, held off a fast-finishing St Kilda City to claim a 12-point win at Peanut Farm. The Panthers flexed its muscle in the first half and by three quarter time had extended their lead to 40 points. But instead of rolling over, the Saints showed some real fight, attacking with the wind in the final stanza and piling on five goals to drastically reduce the final margin. Alan Purvis was again City's best, while Matt Fife and Michael Cooke did the damage for East Malvern.

As expected, Dingley cruised to a comfortable nine-goal win over Chelsea Heights at Beazley Reserve. The Heighters, to their credit, fought hard to stay in the contest, with Callum Dodson leading the resistance, but Dingley managed to up the ante and pull away in the second half. Andrew Stock and Dean Francis were the main contributors for the winners, dominating up forward with four goals each.

The final game saw East Brighton dish out a 135-point hiding to Clayton at Hurlingham Reserve. It was simply one-way traffic as the Vampires piled on 9.4 to 0.0 in a devastating opening quarter that had all but decided the result by the first change. Andrew Jansen continued his purple patch with another best-a-field performance for the home side while up forward Phil Smith booted five majors. Chris Morrison was one of a select few that could hold their head high for the Clays.

The top four sides are all sitting pretty with a 4-1 record and they are beginning to put a bit of gap on the rest of the competition. This it will make for some interesting matches in Round 6.

East Malvern V Mordialloc – Dunlop Reserve

This will be the clash of the round between second and third on the ladder. There is much at stake here as the loser could potentially drop as low as sixth depending on other results. Mordialloc have proved to be a real surprise packet in Division One so far, pulling off a couple of terrific wins against the odds in a dream start to the year. But with every win the Panthers look more like premiership contenders and I think they will be hard to beat at home.

St Pauls V Cheltenham – McKinnon Reserve

Cheltenham showed tremendous resilience to bounce back with a win after Dingley pantsed them the previous week. That said they didn't exactly set the world on fire against Bentleigh. The Dogs seem to have dropped off from the pace-setters this season, but are still talented enough to see September action.

A loss here may make it difficult for them to claw their way back into finals contention, so with that on their minds I'll back them to win a close one at the Kennel.

Clayton V St Kilda City – Meade Reserve

I reckon St Kilda City are playing much better footy than their 1-4 record suggests, given their losses have all been relatively close ones. The Clays' defence, meanwhile, has been an area for concern as they've conceded the second most points in the comp, despite winning two matches. It's difficult to see the Clays getting up in this one, especially after last week's massacre.

Bentleigh V Dingley – Bentleigh Reserve

Both these teams play an exciting brand of football, so this could be a cracking game to watch. The Demons play Bentleigh Reserve really well, and their kids are always willing to have a dip, so I'd expect a commendable performance from them. However, on form it's hard to go past the top-of-the-table Dingoes.

East Brighton V Chelsea Heights – Hurlingham Reserve

Not sure if this will be much of a contest. East Brighton were back to their devastating best last week while their opponents sit bottom of the table without a win. This could get ugly for the Heighters.

OPTIMUS CONCUSSION MANAGEMENT

With 1 in 7 players in the football codes affected by concussion the question is how much do players and parents really understand about the long-term affects of concussion?

CONCUSSION AND DEPRESSION: IS THERE AN ESTABLISHED LINK?

Concussion and depression are two medical conditions that are spoken of frequently in the community. They are not always spoken of in relation to each other, however as more is discovered about both medical conditions the question is being raised as to whether there is a causal link.

Google defines concussion as (1) temporary unconsciousness or confusion and other symptoms caused by a blow to the head. As a medical practitioner, working with the VFL, combat sports and Melbourne City FC, I define concussion according to the medical definition of 'a traumatic brain injury that alters the way your brain functions. Effects are usually temporary but can include headaches and problems with concentration, memory, balance and coordination' (Mayo Clinic).

The World Health Organisation states that depression is 'a common mental disorder, characterized by sadness, loss of interest or pleasure, feelings of guilt or low self-worth, disturbed sleep or appetite, feelings of tiredness, and poor concentration. Depression can be long lasting or recurrent, substantially impairing an individual's ability to function at work or school or cope with daily life' (WHO).

For many years now the importance of recognising, and correctly treating concussion has become paramount in all sporting arenas. Since the development of the first sideline-screening tool (SCAT) in 2005, recognition of concussion has improved. The sideline tool includes the testing of balance, in what is known as the Balance Error Scoring System, which can be easily performed after the player is removed from play. More recently in 2012 the SCAT3 was released, at the same time as the Child-SCAT3 was released.

Concussion management has also drastically improved with the advent of preseason baseline cognitive screening. This empowers the physician to safely return the player to training and contact sport at a time that is medically safe for the player.

Interestingly as the research and knowledge surrounding concussion has drastically increased, the link with depression has been forged. The research is largely in ex-American Footballers but there is a suggestion that the prevalence of depression increases with the increased number of concussions in their playing history. Dr K M Guskiewicz and colleagues have published that in ex-players with more than three concussions they had a three-fold increase in depressive episodes. For one or two concussions the increase was 1.5 fold. They commented that it is important that we understand the potential neurological consequences of recurrent concussion.

Through correct recognition, diagnosis and management of concussion, long-term sequelae can be minimised. Safe return to play is paramount in the medical management of all people with concussion, regardless of their level of physical activity. Concussion in a junior player is as important as concussion in the older recreational player. If you are at all suspicious that someone you know is playing whilst concussed, or training whilst concussed, it is imperative that this is brought to the attention of the coaching or medical staff. If in doubt please contact your local GP, a sports physician or your local hospital.

FIELD UMP FRIDMAN LEADING THE WAY



Australian football has been littered with heart-breaking stories of star players who, through the cruel fate of chronic injury, could never reach their true potential. Names like Matthew Egan, Max Bailey, Sean Rusling and Scott Gumbleton are all synonymous with unfulfilled talent, having burst on to the big stage only to be cut down in their prime and fade from the public consciousness. But one local footy star has refused to let his horrific run with injury end his involvement in the sport he loves.

Last year Ilya Fridman turned to umpiring as a way to regain his fitness and core strength after long stints on the sidelines. But what started off initially as a rehab and fitness program has now become his passion and he is relishing the opportunity to continue his on-field involvement in community football.

"You've got the best seat on the ground; you're in the middle of the action the whole time... It's absolutely fantastic," Fridman enthused on the eve of the SFNL's Community Umpiring Round.

The 27-year-old is now in his second year of umpiring after previously experiencing the highs and lows of footy during his playing career, which began with the Bentleigh Under 17's in 2004.

After impressing with the Demons' Under 19's side, he joined the Casey Scorpions in the VFL where he was taught valuable lessons about the game within a professional environment. But when work commitments forced a reluctant return to local football after just one season, he resumed playing with his mates at Bentleigh and helped the senior team claim the VAFA D3 premiership in 2009.

He then crossed to Dingley which was where his injury curse began. He had a delayed start to his debut year at Souter Oval with glandular fever and then a collar bone injury, before a dislocated knee and broken patella suffered in the final two minutes of his return match ended his season.

In a bid to fast-track his return to football, Fridman began running prematurely, and in the process suffered lower back and spinal injuries from over compensation and once again found himself back at square one.

It was then that a couple of his workmates suggested he consider getting involved with umpiring in a bid to help him through his injury rehabilitation.

"I thought I'll at least try to keep my fitness up by still staying involved in local footy and then I enjoyed it last year and I thought I might keep going with it," Fridman explained.

Fridman has no doubt that his playing experience has helped him make a successful transition to umpiring. He remembers the qualities he appreciated in a whistle-blower from his perspective as a player, and has since tried to incorporate those same qualities into his own umpiring, not only try to earn the respect of the players in the matches he officiates, but also to ensure that everybody involved enjoys the game as much as he does.

"I really appreciated the umpires that had the time to talk to you as a player on the field when the decision's been made, umpires that really took that extra step and explained their decision and would be really approachable... and that's something I try to do with my umpiring," Fridman said.

"When I go out there to umpire I go out there to enjoy it and at the same time make sure that the blokes that go out there to play enjoy the game as well.

"We're all involved in local footy and so we've gotta treat each another with respect so that's what I try to do on the field."

Fridman isn't the first former footballer to make the transition to officiating. Of the current crop of AFL umpires, Leigh Fisher and Jordan Bannister have both played over 50 games of AFL footy. These two are men that Fridman really admires, given he understands from his own experience what is required to succeed at the elite level.

"(These) blokes have come through the ranks of playing and have taken that side step (while) at the same time keeping the professionalism and doing what it takes to stay at that level, which is phenomenal. They're the sort of blokes you look up to," Fridman said.

However, unlike many of his contemporaries, Fridman harbours no burning desire to progress his officiating career to a higher level. Instead, he prefers to "stay local" while honing his skills.

There have been challenges along the way for Fridman, including trying to overcome the mental scarring associated with his succession of serious injuries. But he says it's the fitness aspect of the job that he finds the most difficult.

It's a sign of the strength of his character, too, that he uses this difficulty as motivation to better himself and get himself into the best possible physical condition.

"The challenge every week is making sure that you're looking after yourself and you're constantly keeping that fitness up coz as soon as that starts to drop off, I guess the umpiring and your ability to keep up with the game will drop off as well," he said.

Fridman's dedication and passion for umpiring is obvious and he encourages young people to get involved in it as he believes it's a pursuit that has a multitude of benefits.

"Give it a go. Even if you just get down to training, have a run, get a feel for it. It's absolutely fantastic," Fridman said.

"For anyone – young boys or girls who are at school who are thinking of having a part-time job, umpiring would definitely be one of the things I'd encourage).

"It teaches you a lot of life skills in terms of building your confidence, your ability to communicate... you're always keeping fit. And then there's a bit of the monetary side of things as well. You actually get paid to do it!

"I wish I got into it a lot earlier."
