## BENTLEIGH

**2017 Finish:** 3rd

**Key Inclusions:** Steve Murray (Wodonga), Jack Firns (St Kevins), Tom Cunningham (St Kevins)

**Notable Departures:** Kayne O'Brien (De La Salle), Saf Balic (Oakleigh District)

The Demons' rise from a 1-5 start to a Preliminary Final was one of the stories of the season, however, upon reflection, you wonder what they could have been achieved had things panned out a little differently early in the year. Their injury toll in the first few rounds was massive, and there is no doubt Bentleigh spent a lot of petrol tickets to make up for lost ground and salvage their season. To ultimately play off for a Grand Final berth was a tremendous achievement given the circumstances, and big things are expected from the side in 2018. The team retains the majority of its starting senior 22 from last year and added several high-calibre players to its line-up, so the early indication is that Bentleigh will be a force to be reckoned with. The side already boasts an outstanding core midfield group coupled with two of the best ruckmen in the competition in Mitch Smart and Andrew Walsh, and the addition of Wodonga's Steve Murray and SKOB's Jack Firns will provide extra support at either end of the ground. Should the Demons get a clear run at it on the injury front, then the premiership cup may very well be heading to Arthur Street.

## CHELSEA HEIGHTS

**Notable Departures:** Jackson Fry (Hampton Park)

The Heighters are back in Division 1 for the first time since 2015 following their Division 2 Grand Final victory over Murrumbena. Pleasingly for the club, they have kept most of their playing group together as they make the jump back to the SFNL's top flight, with defender Jackson Fry their only glaring omission. St Kilda City stars Dylan Sloan and Harry Czarnecki and decorated key position player Daniel Campisano headline the arrivals, while the club will also regain Cal Dodson following his recovery from health issues last year. Several of their premiership stars including Phil Smith, Phil Matheson and James Robertson are entering the twilight of their glittering careers, so it will be interesting to see how their fair in Division 1, however, there is still more than enough younger talent coming through to ensure the club will be competitive this year.

## CHELTHENHAM

Last year was another season that promised much, but ultimately failed to deliver. With a swag of handy recruits coming across to Jack Barker Oval in the pre-season, the club was primed to return to finals action, however, despite several stirring wins and promising performances, the club ultimately fell short. But with another year under their belts, and the disappointment from last year spurring them on, 2018 looms as the year Cheltenham finally jumps back into the top five. Sean McLaren last year emerged as one of the Southern league's preeminent big men, finishing equal runner-up in the Ellis Medal, and again remains key to the Rosellas' chances, while Jack Barclay, Daniel Vaughan and Jack

Worrell should again prove prominent. The additions of Drew Kelly and Billy Robertson and the return of Tim Wigney from a knee injury further strengthens a side that on paper already looks capable of pushing for finals, so expect the Rosellas to take steps further forward in 2018.

The Dingley dynasty continues to have the SFNL world in awe. In an era in which equalisation measures are intended to level the playing field, the Dingo's ability to continually rejuvenate its list is nothing short of remarkable. Several champion players have hung up the boots since the club's first Division 1 premiership in 2015, and ruckman Chris Morgan and midfielder Ryan Stewart joined that illustrious list following last season's triumph. Additionally, the loss of effervescent spearhead Cal McQueen cannot be overstated. Not only has 'The Dream' topped the League goalkicking in both of the past two seasons, but his boundless energy around the playing group and penchant for breath-taking on-field feats always provided a lift for his teammates. However, in former WAFL ruckman Simon Hallsworth and Cheltenham forward Will Edmunds, the Dingo's have found adequate replacements. In addition to established stars in co-Captains Jackson Peet and Trav La Rocca, key defender Andrew Frost, gun mid Chris Horton-Milne and mercurial match-winner Daniel Farmer, the club continues to blood new players into its senior side, which has helped keep the club at the top of the League pecking order. The club begins the 2018 season vying for an unprecedented fourth straight senior premiership, and it remains a very strong chance of re-writing the history books. However, with several other clubs building strong lists in pursuit of the Division 1 title, another Dingo's flag is far from assured.

Another club that over promised and under delivered in 2017, the Panthers will be out to make amends this season. The club picked up several high-profile recruits last year, with many pundits expecting East Malvern to be a bona fide flag contender, but despite the hype, the side failed to capitalise on their potential and bombed out in the Elimination Final. The club has also lost several talented players during the recent off-season, including SFNL Interleague reps Matt Terech, Ed Sim and Jimmy Dowling, while one of last year's boom recruits Nathan Henley will likely miss the season with an achilles injury. Nevertheless, the additions of ex-Port Melbourne champ Steve Brewer, North Heidelberg big man Marc Lonergan (brother of Geelong's Tom) and Strathfieldsay premiership star Brad Stringer (brother of Bomber Jake) ensures there is enough talent in the side to remain competitive. With midfield ace Nathan Robinson at the helm for 2018, and superstars Ryan Mullett and Dean Milthouse continuing, expect the Panthers to be right in the mix for another finals berth.

Mordialloc are no strangers to the big dance, having featured in four grand finals in the last five years across Divisions 1 and 2. However, a Division 1 Senior premiership still eludes the powerhouse SFNL club, with two grand final defeats to the Dingo's in three years still burning deep. Last year, Mordi entered the big dance as the favourite, having belted their Dingley rivals by 10 goals in the Second Semi Final, but their lacklustre performance on the big stage a fortnight later, albeit in difficult conditions, will no doubt still burn in their psyche. To that end, expect Mordialloc to feature prominently at the pointy end as they look to atone for last season's disappointment and claim a maiden Div 1 flag. Despite the losses of senior players Simon Fragiaco and Chris Langdon, the Bloods midfield remains one of the strongest in the competition, with Danny Nicholls, Todd Bastion, Jordan Drbyshire and Aaron Kneebone leading the charge. Their forward line also presents a formidable challenge for opposition defences, with Matt Moore joining Steve Tolongs and James Morris to form a potent three-pronged attack. Barring another horrific run of injuries a la 2016 (touch wood!), it is hard to see this year's Grand Final not again featuring the red and whites.

## OAKLEIGH DISTRICT

Following a stunning Division 1 debut in 2016 that saw the Oaks reach a Preliminary Final, the club took a slide down to seventh last year. Granted the club wasn't helped by the unavailability of key personnel at times during the season, but the Districts nevertheless dropped several winnable games throughout the season. Unfortunately, the club has lost several key players during the off-season, including Andrew Howison, Dave Velardo and the Carroll brothers, which it will find hard to replace. However, Oakleigh, under new coach Phil Harvey, has addressed a glaring need by luring young Bentleigh ruckman Saf Balic across to Princes Highway, while Ryan Pearson, Jake Mullen and Paul Fermanis will continue to lead from the front. While on paper it's hard to see Oakleigh District making finals, it does have enough match-winners on its list to claim some scalps along the way.

## PORT MELBOURNE COLTS

Some stunning home upsets over higher-ranked opponents were the highlights of an otherwise dismal season for the Colts, which was in stark contrast to their stunning undefeated debut season in Division 2 the previous year. However, the club has added several stars to its list in 2018 to lead the charge up the Division 1 ladder. Mercurial Bulldog and Sandringham Zebras-listed Cal Cathcart joins the club, and with the abolition of the VFL Development competition looks set to see

more game time in the Southern League. A notable ball-winner and goal-kicker, Cathcart has the ability to turn a game in minutes. Former Essendon speedster Andrew Lovett and ex-Caulfield Bear Sean Gunning will also provide extra midfield support, alongside established stars Lew Mildenhall and Jake Wood, while De La Salle forward Tom Nicholls is set to bolster the club's offensive stocks. Meanwhile young gun Max Mitchell-Russell, who enjoyed a breakout season last year, is a chance to debut with Coburg Lions this weekend and may spend a bit of time with the VFL club in 2018. But few clubs enjoy a stronger home ground advantage than the Colts at the Portress, so we may again see Port claim several big scalps as it chases a finals berth.

After a period of success at the turn of the decade, the Saints have spent the last four seasons languishing in the bottom three of the SFNL ladder. Not even a bevy of big-name recruits could lift the club above eighth last season and, unfortunately for St Kilda City, the majority of these recruits have moved on for 2018, including Harry Czarnecki (second in the club B&F), Ray Lengyel, Troy Kelm, Thomas Motlop and the Runnalls brothers. However, their list of inclusions is almost as lengthy as the departures and includes a couple of familiar faces in Cameron Hanson and former SFNL Division 1 B&F winner Aaron Purvis. Big-bodied midfielder Mark Griffiths and ex-Heatherston coach Chris Keenan will also call the Peanut Farm home this season, however, another season of treading water is forecast for St Kilda City.

One of the reals surprise packets of the 2017 season, St Pauls shocked the competition to finish third on the ladder behind Grand Finalists Dingley and Mordialloc by percentage alone. They played an exciting, run-and-gun brand of football that caught many opposition sides unawares. And the improvement didn't come from a glut of external recruits, but rather from the development of its young kids from the Under 19s. Unfortunately, their inexperience found them out in the end, with a straight-sets finals exit a disappointing end to an impressive season. Fast forward six months and the excitement is building ahead of 2018, with further improvement expected from the young pups. Sandringham VFL-listed players Cal Cathcart and James Sziller have moved on, and while they would be incredibly handy to have in the side, they played just two senior games each last season, so it would unfair to suggest the Dogs would be too adversely affected by their omission based on their contributions last season. However, captain Harley Ambrose, who made the shock switch to St Pauls during the summer, leaves a much bigger hole to fill. Meanwhile, former Dogs Matt Herbstreit and Brendan Dawes return to the Kennel, bringing with them valuable Division 1 Senior premiership experience to the young side. While it is hard to get a read on St Pauls in 2018, expect them to again be up around the mark and building towards a premiership in the next couple of years.

### ROUND 1 PREVIEW

#### Port Melbourne Colts V St Kilda City (JL Murphy Reserve)

The two old SESFL rivals will lock horns under Friday night lights to usher in the 2018 season at JL Murphy Reserve.

It is a match of much significance, with the two clubs playing for the Bird Cup in honour of former Colts player Marcel Bouchard, who passed away from brain cancer before the start of the 2017 season.

Fittingly, this tribute takes place on the SFNL's annual Remembrance Round.

Both teams fought out an absolutely better in this corresponding fixture last year, with the Colts holding off a fast-finishing City by under two kicks to claim the Bird Cup and the four points in an absorbing and emotion-charged contest.

Unfortunately, 2017 ultimate proved to be a lean year for both clubs, and as they look to make amends in 2018, a first-up win is vitally important.

The bigger bodies of returning star Aaron Purvis and fellow recruit Mark Griffiths through the midfield will be vital, especially on the narrow confines of the infinitesimal Murphy Reserve where space is at a premium.

However, the Colts have also added class to its midfield in the form of Cal Cathcart and former Bomber Andy Lovett, with Cartcart especially a proven match winner, booting five goals in a best afield performance in his last outing against the Saints in last year's Pride Cup.

This should be a terrific battle to start the season, but it's difficult to tip against Port at home.

#### Chelsea Heights V Cheltenham (Beazley Reserve)

The Heighers will unfurl their 2017 Division 2 premiers flag before their home fans on Saturday, with a large crowd expected at Beazley Reserve.

Clearly the standout team in Div 2 last season, it will be interesting to see how they make the transition back to the top grade, especially given they have kept the majority of their side together. Some of their star players may be entering the twilight of their glittering careers, including prolific goalkicker Phil Smith, but there is still more than enough young talent to ensure the side will be competitive in the top grade.

Meanwhile Cheltenham fell just short of their expected finals berth last season, but with a couple of very handy additions in Billy Robertson and Drew Kelly, they will only be stronger in 2018 and hungrier than ever to bridge that gap and return to the top five.

This will also be an interesting contest, but the Rosellas should have too much class for the Heighers, with ruckman Sean McLaren to play a massive part in the result.

The Demons have added some quality players to its list for 2018 and are one of the clubs firmly in the premiership window. The Doggies, meanwhile, should see some significant improvement from its crop of young pups as it looks to consolidate an impressive 2017 campaign.

This could go either way, but the home ground advantage should see the Demons home.

#### East Malvern V Oakleigh District (Dunlop Reserve)

Dingoes Jackson Peet, Lucas Walsmley and Chris Horton-Milne and Bloods Todd Bastion, Danny Nicholls and Aaron Kneebone are all genuine stars should all have an impact on the match.

But a key will be in the ruck and the ability of either side to provide the onballers with first use. Former WAFL ruckman Simon Hallsworth should play his first game in Dingley colours, and it will be intriguing to see how he goes against Mordi star Tom McMahon.

There will be little in it come the final siren, but the reigning premiers will get their campaign for a record-breaking fourth consecutive flag off to a bright start with a thrilling victory.

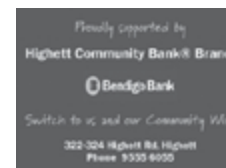

# DIVISION 3: GOOD FRIDAY REVIEW / ANDREW PALOCZI @Apaloczi

A passionate rendition of Spiderland rang out in the Hampton Park rooms after the Redbacks entered the SFNL competition in ideal fashion.

They recorded a 15-point triumph in a hotly contested match against fellow Division 3 newcomer Springvale Districts.

It wasn't only the footy that was hot on a glorious sunny day.

The action took place in a finals-like atmosphere, with a large and enthusiastic crowd in attendance.

Good Friday always brings the importance of the Royal Children's Hospital into sharp focus.

Hampton Park held a raffle for the Good Friday Appeal and painted the appeal logo on the field.

Robert Booth Reserve is a picturesque addition to SFNL competition, and an excellent surface helped facilitate entertaining footy.

Off the field, a shiny red Ferrari attracted attention, but fortunately for its owner was not a magnet for the Sherrin.

In contrast, Cory Phillips was.

He was a terrific performer for the victorious Redbacks, earning praise from the SFNL radio team.

His penetrating left foot kicks were a major factor in his side's win and he finished with a couple of goals to his name.

The commentators agreed Phillips was the player of the day, and this scribe concurs.

Hampton Park coach Jason Chapple offered a surprising piece of information when chatting on air post-game about the best on ground performance.

"Cory Phillips did his ACL on New Year's Eve and decided not to have the operation, and he was running round without an ACL. It was just an amazing effort," Chapple said.

Another Redback to catch the eye was Reece Smart who won plenty of the footy and used it efficiently.

For the conquered, but competitive Demons, the tireless and impressive work of Daniel Wilson in the ruck led to him being named his side's best contributor.

Stefan Feehan was the most prolific goal scorer of the game, with the Springvale Districts' player booting four majors.

Although not listed in his side's best, Feehan showed promising signs for the season ahead.

One highlight was his strong contested mark early in the third term, from which he goaled, putting the Demons ahead.

However, after Hampton Park edged in front nine minutes into that quarter, the Redbacks began to take charge.

At one stage they marched to a 33-point lead in the final term, before three late goals added respectability for the Demons.

It seemed fitting the final margin was a small one, given the closeness of the scores throughout an absorbing first half.

A blowout would have been disappointing.

At the major break just a point separated the combatants, with Hampton Park holding the slender advantage.

The Redbacks were hampered by inaccurate kicking, registering 4.7 in the first half. In contrast, the Demons managed an efficient five goals straight in that period.

Players from both sides must have already been feeling the pinch on such a hot day. However, despite a large number of players cramping in the second half, the game continued to be an entertaining spectacle.

"I think it was a pretty good standard game," Chapple told the radio crew.

"I don't think these two teams would look out of place even a couple of divisions higher."

He was delighted for Redbacks' supporters, who have enjoyed very few wins in their torrid recent years of SEFNL footy.

It is a little disappointing having to wait a couple of weeks for more SFNL Division 3 action, after such an exquisite appetiser.

But, for the players of Hampton Park and Springvale Districts, it is a well-earned rest after an arduous game.

With the Good Friday match originally scheduled for Round 13, Round 1 for all Division 3 teams arrives on 14 April.

A new season is always eagerly anticipated, but 2018 comes with the added intrigue of a restructured Division 3 competition.

Before analysing that new look, congratulations once again to Doveton on its superb performance in the 2017 Grand Final. The Eagles earned promotion to Division 2 with a final-term comeback win over a valiant Endeavour Hills' side.

The other clubs that made up last season's top six remain in Division 3, with two relegated sides and a club new to our League joining them.

One of the relegated clubs, Heatherton, has no reason to feel aggrieved, having won just a solitary senior game last season. However, Springvale Districts is decidedly unlucky to be demoted, winning six senior games in 2017 and going close in several others.

The SFNL welcomes Hampton Park to its ranks, with the Redbacks crossing from the South East Football Netball League (SEFNL).

Here's an overview of the eight Div 3 combatants, including key recruits, major departures, and forecast ladder positions.

**ASHWOOD:** (FINISHED 4TH AFTER 2017 FINALS)

**Coach:** Mick Rossborough (ongoing)

Ashwood set the early pace in this division last year, and finished second in the home and away season, before running out of steam in the finals.

Injuries played their part, along with an ageing list and a lack of pace.

Coach Mick Rossborough is confident he has recruited strongly, putting the Magpies in the finals picture again. However, he makes no secret of the magnitude of the task required to win the flag.

"Springvale (Districts) and Hampton Park are closer to divvy 1 clubs than divvy 3," Rossborough indicates emphatically.

But let's look at what the experienced coach has done to give his side the best chance to compete with these perceived powerhouses.

Reliable Magpies' big-man Dale Carroll is well established at the club and is joined by brothers Patrick and Ryan. Both have crossed from division 1 side Oakleigh District.

Patrick is willing to take on opponents and can pull in a screamer as he demonstrated in an SFNL Interleague appearance.

"Paddy's a champ. He'll play utility for me," Rossborough says.

As for Ryan, expect him to win the footy on the inside and distribute it to teammates.

A handy trio has joined Ashwood from Hampton Hammers, with James Feather a strong key defender, Chris Grove a pacy wingman, and David Masson a skilful halfback flanker.

There were no off-season losses that are likely to hurt the Magpies, although the services of departing veteran Michael Langford deserve mention.

Expect Ashwood to be a strong contender for fourth place and a chance for another taste of finals action.

**Predicted finish:** 4th

**BLACK ROCK:** (FINISHED 5TH AFTER 2017 FINALS)

**Coach:** Lachie Batt (new playing coach)

The Jets mounted a charge to the 2017 finals under the coaching of Jay Williams.

With Williams and his family relocating, another young coach has taken over.

Lachie Batt has only just hit the age of 30 but brings significant experience to the role.

Last season he was a playing assistant coach at Murrumbena, having previously coached Hampton Hammers Under 19s as well as being an assistant coach for the seniors.

The club environment at Black Rock impresses Batt.

"They're looking to improve and they've got a young, enthusiastic committee on board," he says.

Batt is confident he can combine his responsibility as senior coach with his onfield job as a player.

Club president and premiership coach, John Burke will help out from the bench, as will assistant coaches Paddy Irons and Jeremy Starke.

A couple of handy players have arrived from NSW. One is Jesse Lawrence who quickly impressed Batt and has been appointed joint vice captain.

"He seems to have just natural leadership ability. He probably would have the

highest training attendance out of anyone. And he's fit as well."

Lawrence will spend lots of time in the midfield.

The other addition from NSW is Kenny Simpson, a skilful midfielder.

Tom Dewar is no stranger to the club, but will significantly boost the Jets' forward firepower as he returns from injury.

A couple of notable departures in the off-season are big American Michael 'Buddy' Spohn and small livewire forward Brenton Rafferty.

Expect the Jets to be competitive in 2018.

First up is a tough challenge on Black Rock's stomping ground against Ashwood, a possible rival for the last finals spot.

**Predicted finish:** 6th

**ENDEAVOUR HILLS:** (FINISHED RUNNER UP IN 2017)

**Coach:** Rob Dipper (ongoing)

Endeavour Hills was desperately close to a premiership in 2017, and coach Rob Dipper has his side in a position to be a genuine contender again this year.

There have been no major departures and an abundance of accomplished arrivals.

A group of mates transferred from Narre Warren and Dipper outlines what they will offer.

Sam McLean is a key position player expected to play at centre half back.

Nathan Reid is a "classy halfback, wingman".

Andrew Vella is a "dominant midfielder", and Daniel Cann provides versatility, being able to shift between midfield and half forward.

Alex Cann is a ruckman, as is Ben Holland.

Another newbie is Tom Gillies who transferred from Berwick and should feature at centre half forward or full forward.

The club has an experienced and extensive leadership group led by captain Nate Strom and joint vice captains Byron Hoe and Jayson Bruce.

Dipper has worked his squad hard over the preseason.

"We know we've got to go to another level. So we've trained a bit harder and (done) a bit more fitness and strengthening over the off season," he indicates.

Expect the Falcons to be a significantly improved side and for their already imposing fitness to go up a notch.

Whether or not this will be enough to knock off the fancied div 3 new boys, Hampton Park and Springvale Districts will be fascinating to observe.

You'd be mad to write Endeavour Hills off, though.

**Predicted finish:** runner up

**HALLAM** (FINISHED 3RD AFTER 2017 FINALS)

**Coach:** Ash Allen (new)

Hallam topped the ladder last season, before a disappointing straight-sets finals exit.

A player exodus has many outside the club forecasting a dire season for the team.

New Hawks' coach Ash Allen assumed the role after the recent departure of Scott Slater.

He hasn't coached previously and has taken on a largely inexperienced squad, but sees a bright future for Hallam.

Overall the club is in a healthy position with its netball and girls' footy sides attracting strong numbers.

Underdog status sits well with Allen. He acknowledges his team will be inconsistent at this stage of its development, however, he expects the Hawks to make life tough for some of the division's more fancied sides.

"We've got a very young group, but I still think we're capable of winning quite a few games," he says.

His team lacks size, but has pace.

There is still some experience around, such as captain Jonathan Daly and the big-bodied Brandon Nolan.

There have been some exciting arrivals at the Hawks' nest. A highlight is Billy Athanasopoulos from Narre Warren.

"He'll be a key part in our forward line. He'll be a centre half forward I'd say. He'll be a massive asset," says Allen.

David Mullins is a recent signing, venturing from Bunyip in West Gippsland.

"He's a very good goal-sneak. He'll definitely kick some goals this year," the coach enthuses.

A number who have previously played Under 19s footy at Hallam will play seniors this season.

It will be a sharp learning curve for a rookie coach and young team, but expect the Hawks to provide some entertaining footy during the year.

**Predicted finish:** 8th

**HAMPTON PARK:** (FINISHED LAST IN SEFNL IN 2017)

**Coach:** Jason Chapple (second stint at the club)

After two winless seasons in SEFNL competition, Hampton Park tasted victory in its SFNL debut.

The Redbacks won a tight contest against Springvale Districts on Good Friday.

Jason Chapple is back in charge at Hampton Park after a long absence, having most recently coached Mordialloc.

He isn't keen to speculate on what his recruits will deliver until he has sufficient chance to see them perform under pressure.

However, Chapple concedes Michael Henry has experience at a higher level of footy and is expected to play well, whilst guiding the midfield group.

Jackson Fry offers versatility, being able to play at either end and coming from a high-quality Chelsea Heights' outfit.

A flock of Doveton Doves and a trio of ex-Lyndale players have joined the Redbacks.

Henry is perhaps the most notable of the Doves, and Lyndale's 2016 Best & Fairest winner Taylor Rainey is likely to be prominent.

Hampton Park's squad looks imposing, but Chapple realises potential alone is not enough.

"Paper's a fantastic thing, but let's see who puts their hand up," he says.

In the Good Friday clash, Cory Phillips, a new arrival from Officer in the SEFNL, was one to thrust up his hand.

His raking left-foot kicks, ability to gather heaps of possessions, and the fact he chimed in with a couple of goals saw him named the SFNL radio team's player of the day.

Expect the Redbacks to get into the habit of winning and to be a serious flag prospect.

**Predicted finish:** 3rd

**HEATHERTON:** (FINISHED LAST IN DIVISION 2 IN 2017)

**Coach:** Shayne Sheedy (new)

Heatherton started its 2017 season with a win, but the joy ended there, with the Tonners failing to sing their song again during a dismal campaign.

An injection of fresh faces brings new hope at Ross Street Reserve.

One of those new arrivals is experienced coach Shayne Sheedy who shifted from Division 1 club Oakleigh District.

"They're starting from behind the eight ball, having lost 17 games in a row," Sheedy says of Heatherton's players.

But, he points out that in a practice match against Tyabb approximately 15 blokes were new to the club.

Sheedy and Heatherton football director Andrew Coffey employed a networking approach to bolster the Tonners' depth.

The success of this strategy is highlighted by the arrival of Sheedy's 2015 Oakleigh District premiership star, Khaled Kandakji.

The electrifying small forward was the leading goal kicker for Cranbourne last season in a side that made the preliminary final.

Mark Stevens, a recruit from Rockbank in the RDFL impressed at full back in the Tyabb practice match.

A group of players has arrived from DWWWW in the Alberton League including former Hallam utility Travis Walker. Another from that group is John Mentiplay, described by Sheedy as "a small inside midfielder".

Some notable departures from Heatherton are Jesse Stone, Chris Keenan, and Regan Maddaford.

Sheedy believes the club's recruiting will offset its losses and provide sufficient depth.

Finals seem a realistic goal for Heatherton, although it may find itself in a tight battle for fourth spot on the ladder.

**Predicted finish:** 5th

**SOUTH YARRA:** (FINISHED 6TH IN 2017)

**Coach:** Darren Stegehuis (ongoing)

South Yarra joint skipper Scott Stegehuis expects an improved standard of football in the new eight-team division 3 competition.

He is happy with the Yarras' recruiting efforts and the club's ability to retain all its existing senior players from last season.

One recruit sure to attract attention is recent SFNL CEO David Cannizzo. Stegehuis makes it clear that Cannizzo's playing ability and physique should see him play a prominent role in the team, when free from Sandringham CEO commitments.

"The weeks that he's available I'd be pretty surprised if he wasn't in the seniors. He's a pretty solid boy, key position player."

Cannizzo is adaptable, being able to play up forward or down back.

Another key position arrival is Nick Wilcox, from Mansfield in the GVL. Expect him to play in the forward line initially.

Blake Mios has transferred from the Adelaide Football League, bringing plenty to the Yarras besides what Stegehuis describes as "a nice Adelaide moustache".

"He's a winger, half back type. So he's a pretty handy player," notes the skipper.

Small forward Luke Delloraso isn't actually a new recruit, but returns from a lengthy injury layoff.

Stegehuis indicates South Yarra expects to match it with all the sides in the division and has set a goal of playing finals.

The side is renowned for its competitiveness, particularly on the tight confines of Fritsch Holzer Park.

However, given last year's squad missed finals and only a small number of recruits have been added, a presence beyond the home and away season appears unlikely with the increased standard of competition.

**Predicted finish:** 7th

**SPRINGVALE DISTRICTS:** (10TH IN DIVISION 2 IN 2017)

**Coach:** Kris Thompson (ongoing)

Long-term Springvale Districts' player, Kris Thompson assumed the coaching reins part way through last season, shortly after breaking his leg.

The injury put an end to his playing days.

He considers his experience as an assistant coach at Frankston in the VFL as a key to his ability to take on his current role.

"I wouldn't be a senior coach if I didn't spend time with Patrick Hill (senior coach at Frankston) and in the VFL system," says Thompson.

A strong understanding of onfield structures is an important piece of knowledge he picked up during his time with the VFL Dolphins.

His players will need to heed the importance he places on this facet of the game.

"If you don't play within the structures you won't find yourself in the side," Thompson says of his organised approach.

The influx of polished recruits to the Demons has been well documented.

However, experienced Springvale Districts' ruckman Daniel Wilson demonstrated his importance in the Good Friday clash with Hampton Park.

He was a standout performer in a beaten side and is sure to be important in providing the likes of George Angetopoulos and Sam Raru with first use of the footy.

Thompson is confident the Demons have the necessary off-field structure in place to provide its playing list with the required support.

He mentions footy manager Greg Scott, who was previously footy manager at Frankston VFL, and club president Sean Francis.

Despite a first up loss to Hampton Park, expect big things from Springvale Districts this season.

It next takes on South Yarra on the wide expanses of Springvale Reserve.

**Predicted finish:** premiers

**2018 Season Preview**

Over the six years of the SFNL netball competition, Dingley and Heatherton have dominated proceedings in the top division; their three premierships apiece not leaving much room for success for any other club. It took the efforts of a plucky and improving Caulfield outfit on preliminary final day to give the rest of the competition hope that there could yet be more than two horses in the finish of this race.

Caulfield were not to defeat Dingley on this day, meaning that the two aforementioned power clubs fought out the grand final for the fifth time in six years, but they did not give up without one heck of a fight in what was the match of the year.

Heatherton were much too powerful for Dingley in a rain-soaked grand final the following weekend, as they were in a somewhat drier encounter the year before. Winning three grand finals in a row takes some doing, but the Tunners are a proud bunch, and are committed to retaining their seat at the top of the table. 2018 however shapes as the most interesting season yet, as at least six sides have genuine designs on a spot in the top four, or even the top two.

Heatherton have been beset by the significant loss of star shooter Rahni Samason, who seeks pastures greener with the Melbourne Vixens. However, the axis of the championship teams in the Mifsud sisters, Nat Billings, Kirsten Daley and Ella Batish still remain. The addition of Leah Seeto in a full-time capacity, and exciting youngsters Jaya Blanthorn (Swan Hill) and Maggie Carlon (intra-club promotion), means that it would still take a brave person to tip against Heatherton going deep into August once more.

Dingley are a club that are not renowned for being content to play second fiddle, and have taken steps over the summer to bolster their squad in an attempt to go one step further than in 2017. The loss of the deadly accurate Bridgette Furphy has been offset by Monash VNL sharp-shooter Monique Lenehan-Moustafa. Dingley have also added height and speed to their defensive stocks in the shape of 18-year old Southern Saints representative Kirsty Clark, and having star goaler Sarah Fischer back from an ankle injury that kept her out for half of 2017 further adds to their strength. The running power and versatility of their mid-court means that there will be plenty of opportunities to score coming Dingley's way.

Caulfield again look the most likely of the chasing pack to mount a challenge. There has been a bit of change in the air in this squad, but this change has mostly been positive as twenty new players come into the top three sides. Major losses include goal keeper Alice Pohner to Albury, and Georgia Heenan and Jemima Price to VNL and study commitments, but the Bears have been able to add the creativity and experience of ex-Queensland state leaguer Domica Wescombe, and the solidity of Geelong defender Tiffany McConnell. Brodie Aumont and Megan Ellett are also promoted from the Division 2 side to join the likes of Makayla Bulte and Fotini Stavrou in feeding a goal circle led by crack shooter Sophie O'Shea.

Keysborough were the other members of the final four last year, as they have been each season since joining the SFNL. The Burras have maintained a very solid squad throughout this time, and the bulk of this squad remains to take on 2018. Samantha Downie steps into the role of non-playing coach and Bec MacInnes lends her experience to the Division 2 side, but key players such as attacker Laura Agius, and mid-courtiers Megan Kennedy, Courtney Nash and Amy Burns provide the strength to show that Keysborough will still be a force to be reckoned with this year. Keysborough are one side that can be relied upon to give a consistent performance week after week. They were a match for any side in 2017 despite rarely being able to field their best squad, and any measure of good fortune will see them right in the mix come August.

St Pauls and St Kilda City may be in for rebuilding seasons in 2018. Both clubs have seen multiple players head for the exit door, with City in particular only able to retain Chloe Ballard and Sarah Jackson from the 2017 side. The recruitment of Katarina Mary Lundkvist to provide much needed experience, and the promotion of several promising youngsters from lower divisions will yet give them much to be excited about. St Pauls have also had their task made more difficult by the loss of much experience, but as with City it enables them to showcase the next wave of players in the red, white and blue. St Pauls finished last season with several positive displays, and it would not surprise to see more wins in store this year for this proud club.

The two new additions to Division 1 are the surprise packets of 2018. Hampton Park joins us from the SEFNL, where they last year finished just outside the finals in a strong A-grade competition. They will be keen to make their mark on our competition, and will see a genuine opportunity to secure a finals position in 2018. Little is known of the Redbacks but they will be confident that names such as Alisha Parissis and Khloe Weaver in defence, and Megan Egbers around the attacking goal circle will be household names by finals time.

Mordialloc come up from Division 2 with a new coach, Sophie Durnan; three others with current or past VNL experience in Caity deGaris, Emily Morris and Amy Gledhill; and as many as 22 more new players throughout their five teams. These along with an established base of players from last year mean that Mordialloc aren't in Division 1 to wait for the bus. They wish to make a mark in their first Division 1 season in five years, to annex some silverware for the first time in the SFNL netball competition, and to challenge for finals. Their squad strength suggests that this may not be beyond them.

The SFNL this year fields nine divisions, up from last year's eight. Division 2 also looks very competitive, with Murrumbeena and Cheltenham joining those looking to break the dominance that Heatherton have had. Heatherton and Dingley have also held a significant influence in the lower divisions, although Caulfield, Oakleigh Districts and Keysborough were able to win lower grade grand finals in 2017 and will be keen to continue their development. It all adds up to a fascinating season which begins this Saturday.

In a recruiting coup, Luke Walker, who has goal umpired in SEVEN AFL Grand Finals (equalling the record) and 37 AFL finals all-up, as well as being All-Australian Goal Umpire on five occasions, is joining our ranks both as a field umpire and to run a mentor program for our younger umpires who wish to head to the VFL/AFL. Luke will assist our young guns with match preparation, diet, time management, goal

setting and fitness requirements, as he helps them navigate the pathways that lead to umpiring at the highest level. He will assist them both at training and on match days providing written and verbal feedback. Marshie is very passionate about supporting our umpiring group and was prepared to debate a former Irish Kick-boxing Champion about the importance of Bricker Reserve as our training facility recently. Chris Hughes is another umpire with an interest in martial arts, and, on a recent trip to Thailand, with his judgement clouded by medications, he entered the MMA ring at a local pub to demonstrate his MMA skills against an opponent nearly twice his size. Fortunately, he lived to tell the tale.

At Committee level, Alan Manning continues as President, with Rodd Johnson as Secretary, John Borg as Treasurer and Kevin Mitchell as Property Steward. Other committee members are Paul Creedon, Hannah Faulkes, Thomas Grundy, Kaye Johnson, Tony Levitt, Kevin Mitchell and Anthony Steward.

There are no changes to rule interpretations in the SFNL this year. The deliberate rushed behind is NOT paid in the SFNL. However, deliberate out of bounds IS paid.

Once the goal umpire has been given the all clear and signalled the decision (but before the flag is waved), the defender may bring the ball back into play.

If a player knocks a ball out of play on the full after a ball up or throw in the free kick shall be awarded to the opposition. This includes if the ball hits the point post on the full.

In ruck contests, the Third Man Up rule applies. However, a poor throw in by the boundary umpire will result in a throw up by field umpire 10m to 15m inside the boundary line. Deliberate interference by a player other than the nominated ruckman will result in free kick awarded against offending player in both ball ups and throw ins. There must be at least a one metre separation between the nominated ruckman until the ball leaves the umpire's hands.

A free kick may be paid against the coaches box for abuse. The free kick will be awarded against the offending team where play is stopped or, after a goal, in the centre instead of a ball up.

Our commitment night ten days ago was well attended and our umpires got the Division 2 and 4 seasons off to a great start last week. Thank you to all the umpires who are doubling up this weekend, with many of our members out of town on school holidays. Hopefully, we won't need too many double ups for the remainder of the year.

This Thursday, April 12, all umpires are expected to attend our season opening First Supper which will be held after training at Bricker Reserve. The cost of the night is included in your membership fee, which will be deducted from your first on-line match payment.
