**ROUND 4 REVIEW**

The high-flying Doveton Eagles and Keysborough remain the only undefeated teams within Division 2 of the Southern Football Netball League after Round 4.

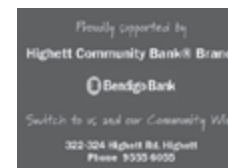

# COMMUNITY UMPIRING ROUND / PETE MARSHALL

This week we celebrate Community Umpiring Round and recognise the essential role that umpires play in both netball and Aussie Rules. Without our match officials, there would be no games each weekend. A quick "Thanks, ump, you're doing a great job" comment to our umpires will be very much appreciated this week (and even more so if it happens each week).

Our umpires are the League's 37th and largest club, with over 300 active participants on the football field every weekend and many more in action at our netball games. Seventy of our squad are in their first year of umpiring and it is important that the other 36 clubs create an atmosphere that is welcoming so that these new umpires are encouraged to be involved in the sport long-term. The SMJFL continue to be a great recruiting ground and we must cherish and grow that relationship. We have some of our more experienced umpires mentoring their younger colleagues each Sunday, while these SMJFL umpires get opportunities to run some matches with us to get a taste of senior football.

Last Tuesday, six of our up-and-coming umpires trained with the AFL Umpires, while five AFL umpires trained with us at Bricker Reserve. The previous Tuesday, I joined three of our young guns, Chris Menera, Campbell James and Nick Ritchie with their dads at Ikon Park for a dinner celebrating the AFL Mates program, where the boys will be mentored by Rob O'Gorman (AFL Field Umpire number 10) for the season.

On a bright note, Luke Walker, former AFL Goal Umpire of over 260 games and seven Grand Finals, has debuted on the field and last Saturday officiated the Dingley V Cheltenham Division 1 Senior match, much to delight of his former AFL goal umpiring colleagues.

I hope that, within our football community, there is respect for the job that our umpires do week in week out through rain, hail or shine, and that Community Umpiring Round merely highlights this.

## ROUND 4 REVIEW

### Lyndale 11.8 (74) def by Cerberus 11.9 (75)

Cerberus have registered their first win of the season in an absolute heart stopper against Lyndale at Barry Powell Reserve. This was a cracking contest right from the first bounce, with both teams locked in a fierce battle that went right down to the wire. Neither side could be separated from each other all game, with the margin never exceeding six points during the first three breaks.

Holding a one goal lead on their home turf at the final change, the Pumas were going to be tough to beat but the Dogs would not rollover quietly. What transpired in the final term was arguably the most intense and nail-biting action seen from the season thus far. Both sides put their bodies on the line and attacked the footy hard, with every possession earned.

Cerberus threw everything at the home side and were rewarded with the crucial and only goal of the final term. Combined with their desperate defence, in which they only conceded two points, the Dogs came up victorious by the smallest possible margin come the final siren.

It was a great display of resilience and determination by the Dogs, who had found themselves just behind for most of the game before they finally hit the front when it mattered most. The defeat leaves the Pumas at 2-2 but there are still some positives to take from the game. Trevor Kumetaitis continued his strong form with another bag of five goals and Alex Kerr has been solid the past two weeks.

### Sandown 10.6 (66) def Dandenong 9.6 (60)

Keeping in the spirit of thrilling games, Sandown have also recorded their first victory of the year overcoming Dandenong by a solitary goal at Edinburgh Reserve. In a tight tussle between two evenly matched teams, the Cobras and Redlegs could barely be separated at the final change with the visitors leading by a point with a huge last quarter to follow.

Dandenong had done well to snatch the lead, having trailed at quarter time with some inaccurate kicking costing them dearly. An improved second term saw them cut the margin to five points as the match started to heat up. The third quarter was highly entertaining as the game opened up somewhat with nine goals scored between the teams, the Redlegs taking the lead and seemingly the momentum with them.

However Sandown found another gear in the final term and in a quarter were goals were like gold, the Cobras were able to unearth two of them and run out six point winners. The hard-fought victory gives Sandown their first four points of the season and lifts them from the bottom of the table. Shane Cosstick was the best player on the ground with five majors while Nathan Isles was also prominent for the home side.

Dandenong are now the only winless side of the competition and will be devastated to let this one slip from their grasp. Jayke Hopkins was sensational, as he has been all year for the Redlegs while David Barrie continues to add to his goal tally. Although the wins aren't there just yet, Dandenong are not too far away from cracking open a game and getting a win on the board.

### Frankston Dolphins 12.8 (80) def by Carrum Patterson Lakes 12.11 (83)

The match of the round certainly lived up to its title, with Carrum Patterson Lakes' undefeated streak continuing in an unbelievable game of football against Frankston at Overport Park. Many predicted a tight and cracking contest heading into this game and those predictions were justified early on in the piece. The Dolphins had just come off a tight loss the week before and came out fired up on their home deck.

An entertaining first half saw both teams trade goal for goal as the margin remained under a kick at both breaks in favour of the home side. However in the premiership quarter, CPL stepped it up another notch and started to take control of the contest, booting six majors to the home side's three. Trailing by 16 points with one quarter of footy left, the Dolphins responded as the match came down to a thrilling climax.

Luke Kirkland was central to the Dolphins fight back, soaring for huge marks and kicking crucial majors in the last term. Frankston gave everything they had left in the tank but the Lions were able to absorb their momentum for long enough to hang on for a three-point victory.

The win validates claims of CPL being the team to beat thus far, but the Dolphins will have lost few admirers for the way they went about it. The Lions will be building some genuine belief and confidence in their system as they continue to play a strong and successful brand of football. Rhys Graham was the best for the visitors with four goals but one player on the ground stood out above all.

As mentioned before Luke Kirkland was sensational for Frankston and almost dragged his side over the line with an eight-goal haul. The big bag ensures that Kirkland now leads the goal kicking in the competition with 18 majors from four games. His presence up front will provide his teammates with plenty of confidence when going forward for the rest of the season. Although they have endured back to back losses, the Dolphins should not be too concerned considering they have fallen just short of two of the better sides in the competition.

### Moorabbin 9.2 (56) def by Lyndhurst 15.15 (105)

Lyndhurst have completed a commanding away win against Moorabbin, putting in a scintillating display of football in the second half at Widdop Crescent Reserve. In a low scoring and evenly contested first half, it was the home side who went into the main break with a one point advantage. With only five majors scored between the two sides until this point it seemed as if the game was destined for a low scoring battle of attrition.

However from then on the Lightning sparked into action and in a great display of power, stacked on 13 goals after half time to run away with a 49 point victory. The Kangaroos had no answers as Lyndhurst's forward line got to work and showed why they are so dangerous as a unit. The Lightning finished with a vast contribution forward of centre with six players hitting the scoreboard more than once. Steven Nussbaum and Shaun Jackson were among the best and generated plenty of supply for their fellow forwards.

The second half fade out means the Kangaroos now have their first loss for the season. Their knack of dropping off alarmingly is not a new issue either, having endured a scare against Dandenong in the final two quarters a few weeks back. Eliminating these costly lapses will no doubt be the focus on the training track this week. Steven Nussbaum and Shaun Jackson were the best players in a dirty day for the home side.

### Cerberus V Dandenong (McAuliffe Oval)

The Dogs will head into this clash warm favourites after their upset win against Lyndale last weekend. **Round 3 2018**

A fascinating Round 3 of Division 1 netball gave us a first win for St Kilda City, a first loss for Mordialloc, a show of strength from the perennial powerhouses, and a competition leader that no-one would have predicted at the beginning of the season.

Heatherton faced Keysborough on a weekend in which they looked slightly vulnerable against a team whose results haven't reflected the threat that they have posed. After a cagey opening characterised by loose passes caused by mid-court pressure, it was Keysborough that landed the first three goals of the match. Heatherton had steadied by quarter time to lead by 11-8, and with makeshift shooting combination Leah Seeto and Bayley Mifsud to the fore they took control in the second quarter to lead by 10 at the main break. Keysborough worked hard to remain in the game after half time, with Amy Burns and Courtney Nash rotating through the centre to form a particular threat, but with wing attack Kristine Tilley starring it was Heatherton that did enough to secure a solid 43-30 win.

Dingley and Caulfield faced off in a battle that will bear little resemblance to clashes later in the season. Both Dingley's regular key defenders were missing, and with Caulfield depleted at both ends of the court the depth of both combatants was sorely tested. Both sides moved the ball well through the middle of the court but with Sarah Fischer and Laura Piper getting better as the match progressed, Dingley's shooters were able to outgun the Caulfield attack. Though Brodie Aumont's passing range looked particularly dangerous and the returning Alice Pohlner was strong in defence. Caulfield could not prevent Dingley from winning every quarter in a 48-21 victory.

St Kilda City and Hampton Park met in a match between two sides that had come close to victory without taking the points in their first two matches. This match began with a very measured and precise tempo as both sides looked to work the ball up the court in combinations, to give their shooters the best possible chances to score. There were never more than two or three goals between the sides at any stage of this match, although St Kilda City held sway at each change. Scores were level with just two minutes to play, but it was City that gained the definitive break to score a 37-34 triumph. Cloe Ballard controlled play well for the victors, whilst for the vanquished Megan Egbers contributed 26 goals to continue her fine start to the season.

St Pauls retained their undefeated record and left round three as competition leaders in a pulsating, free-flowing clash with Mordialloc. Mordialloc provided the greater number of opportunities for their shooters to tally a winning score, but it was the efficiency of Grace Healey (36 goals), and her excellent sidekick Zoe Lythgo that told the tale of the tape. Mordialloc took a two-goal lead into the first change but this margin was reversed at the half with Ann Cooper and Kate Newey making life difficult for the opposition shooters. St Pauls extended the lead to three at the final break but with Sophie Durnan and Amy Gledhill in particular working well for Mordialloc, they were able to level scores at 38-38 deep

into the last stanza. It was here that Claire Stratton made a key interception to turn a Mordialloc attack into a St Pauls goal, and with St Pauls going on to post the last five goals of the match the Saints closed out a 43-38 success.

Three Division 2 teams posted their second win from as many starts this week. Cheltenham took the lead early in the match against Bentleigh, then held them at arm's length for much of the day before pulling clear in the last quarter to win 44-35. Caulfield beat Dingley Red in a match where the lead changed at each quarter break. The move of Amy Swift into goal shooter in the last term was pivotal in Caulfield's 36-34 victory. Keysborough spent the match trying to peg back Murrumbeena's six goal quarter time lead. They were still knocking at the door late into the last quarter, but it was the Lionesses that held their nerve to win 35-33 and retain their unbeaten record. South Yarra scored their first win, an early lead proving decisive as they beat Clayton 30-27, and Dingley Gold's 30-27 win over Heatherton in a see-sawing clash gets them off the mark in 2018.

The margins weren't as close in Division 3. Heatherton were always in control against Lyndale, doubling their score in a 46-23 win. Caulfield won the last quarter against St Kilda City but it was too little, too late as City won by 39-28. Dingley shared the goals around four shooters in a 73-23 whitewash of Hampton Park, for whom Krystyna Gabell scored 20 of their tally of 23. And Mordialloc took a three-goal lead into quarter time, but it was all Black Rock from there with the Jetballers winning by 43-28.

Caulfield Yellow turned a quarter time deficit into a five-goal half time lead, a lead they held in beating St Kilda City by 40-35 in Division 4. Dingley took their time overcoming Heatherton White but were triumphant by 49-26. CPL dominated the second half in beating Black Rock by 42-16, while Cheltenham lead all day against South Yarra, 40-13 being the final margin. Heatherton Black defeated Springvale Districts 54-26 after a tight first half, with a 20 goal to five third term doing the damage. Finally, Keysborough came back from a ten-goal half time deficit to level the scores at the last change, but Caulfield Blue were in front when it mattered, winning by the barest of margins, 36-35.

Division 5 saw several huge scores registered. St Pauls led all day in beating Bentleigh 42-12. Lyndhurst led by twelve at quarter time and increased the margin steadily before beating St Kilda City 53-25. Jarrah Thompson scored 46 goals for a dominant Murrumbeena as they beat Dingley Red by 78-23, while Nicole Carmeni managed 61 of Dingley Gold's 70 against Caulfield, who only scored 16 goals of their own. Hightt gradually built on their early dominance before beating Heatherton 53-35, while East Brighton came from behind to beat Cheltenham by 33-24.

Lyndale were strong early and won every quarter bar the last in beating St Kilda City 38-19 in Division 6. Keysborough were in control all day in their 38-18 win over Dingley. Mordialloc only allowed Hallam six goals in the first half, and 20 overall while scoring 31 of their own. Ashleigh Johnson scored 31 goals from wing attack in three quarters as Aspendale beat

Doveton Eagles 50-23. South Yarra and East Brighton were level at three quarter time, but Emily Bacon's 12 last quarter goals were decisive as South Yarra won by 40-31, while Oakleigh District prevailed after an even first quarter by 39-16 over Clayton.

Lyndhurst won every quarter in defeating Mount Waverley 40-23 in Division 7. Aspendale overturned an early deficit before pulling away in the last term in beating CPL by 47-25. Heatherton broke the game against Cheltenham open in the third quarter before outlasting the Rosellas in winning 37-29. Murrumbeena's 55-12 win over Hallam was eclipsed by Mordialloc's 88-16 demolition of Springvale Districts, Touri Bowtell scoring 50 for the ladies in red. Hampton dominated the second half to beat Doveton Eagles 31-20.

Lyndale converted an eight-goal opening quarter break into a 31-21 win over Keysborough in Division 8. Lyndhurst and Oakleigh District were all square in the first and last quarters, but the Lightning dominated the middle stanzas in winning 37-30. Hightt's early lead over Hallam had evaporated by three quarter time before they kicked again to win 26-22, and Rach Nicholls' 37 goals allowed Dingley to dominate over Springvale Districts, the final margin being 57-13.

Division 9 showed Lyndhurst leading Dingley 10-2 at quarter time and holding them at bay from there to win 29-22. Black Rock led South Yarra by 19 at half time, and the Yarras never recovered in losing by 41-19, while Heatherton were dominant all day in beating Clayton 49-13.
