ROUND 5 REVIEW

East Malvern 18.20 (128) def Chelsea Heights 4.6 (30)

The Panthers have claimed top spot on the SFNL ladder after a dominant 98-point thrashing of Chelsea Heights at Dunlop Reserve in what was the round's only blowout.

The hosts were too strong from the outset, booting five unanswered majors in the opening stanza to set the tone for the day, before finishing the game with another eight final-term goals to blow the Heighsters out of the water.

Ben Timms put in a tremendous performance to be named best on for the winners, with Xavier Linton, Lachie Dowling and Jack Hammond contributing 10 goals between them.

Harry Czarnecki was again a pillar of strength down back for Chelsea Heights, while Phil Matheson and Ryan Archer also excelled.

Port Melbourne Colts 10.6 (66) def by Cheltenham 9.14 (68)

The Rosellas have claimed their first victory of the year, holding on in a two-point thriller at JL Murphy Reserve.

After an even first term, the Colts booted four goals in the second quarter to skip away to an 11-point half time lead.

The visitors lifted after the break and used the strong wind at their backs to their advantage, booting three telling goals to enter the final change eight points to the good.

But the game was far from done, as the Colts, with the aid of the breeze, made a strong challenge for the lead. The Rosellas, however, refused to relinquish their advantage and fought hard to hold out the home side to in a pulsating final quarter.

Conrad Hudghton, Drew Kelly and Jarryd Blook all found plenty of the footy for Cheltenham, but it was 2017 Sparrow Medallist Anthony Malamas that impressed most, booting three goals in a sparkling senior debut.

The Colts were well served by Torrent Bonnett and the consistent Lew Mildenhall.

St Kilda City 7.10 (52) def by Mordialloc 11.12 (78)

St Kilda City have suffered their first defeat of season 2018, beaten by Mordialloc to the tune of 26 points at the Peanut Farm.

The win is Mordi's third in succession after back-to-back losses to start the season.

Although the Saints booted four goals with the wind in the opening stanza and led at the first change, Mordi booted three majors into it to enter the second term full of confidence.

From their the Bloods were able to gain the upper hand on the scoreboard and maintain their ascendancy for the remainder of the day in what was a hard-fought contest.

A seven-point three quarter time lead then blew out to 26 by the final siren with the visitors hammering home three unanswered goals in the last quarter.

Mordi big man Justin Summons proved an imposing presence around the ground, Lachlan Bull had the ball on a string and Matt Moore played his best game in the red and white stripes.

Troy Parker booted three goals for the Saints to be named their best player ahead of Nick Perry and Will De Bruin.

Oakleigh District 12.6 (78) def St Pauls 10.13 (73)

The Oaks have pulled off one of the boilevers of the season, pipping a fast-finishing St Pauls by less than a kick in an absolute cracker at Princes Highway Reserve.

The previously unbeaten Dogs started brightly and found themselves three goals up within the first eight minutes of the match. But the Districts then upped the pressure gauge in the heavy conditions and put the clamps on their opponents, denying them the chance to run and spread.

As a result, Oakleigh booted nine of the next 10 goals – including five

unanswered in the second term – to streak to a match-winning 24-point advantage at the final change.

As the game opened up in the last, the Dogs lifted, booting six goals to storm back into contention. However, the three goals scored up the other end saw the Oaks steady and hold on for a memorable, and possibly season-defining five-point win.

Oaks stars Simon Black and Brody Hodic were influential in the defensive half, while Mitchell Pierce starred with four goals in attack.

For St Pauls, Curtis Murfett was again in the thick of the action, while Matt Kreymborg and Paul Booth also made an impact.

Dingley 6.8 (44) def by Bentleigh 6.11 (47)

Bentleigh has recorded one of the most stirring wins in the club's recent history, knocking off bogey side Dingley by three points in a cliff-hanger at Souter Oval.

The Dingoos went into the clash having won nine of their past 10 head to head encounters, but it was the Demons that dominated the play early.

Bentleigh coach Pete Pirera would have been thrilled to have kept Dingley to just one goal at the half, however, his charges were unable to capitalise on the scoreboard in the early stages, with a wasteful 1.7 in the first term keeping the reigning premiers in the contest.

An 18-point advantage to the visitors at the final change – more than double the Dingoos' score to that point – was decisive in a tight, pressure-filled slugfest where goals were at a premium. But the Dingoos broke the shackles in the last quarter, booting four goals – including three from the boot of explosive onballer Rob Rusan – to give the Demons an almighty scare.

Despite the Dingley resurgence, Bentleigh held their nerve late to deny the hosts a remarkable-come-from behind victory.

Mitchell Smart was again sublime in the ruck for the winners, with Michael Rogers, Tom Backman and Jackson Meredith providing plenty of support around the ground. Nathan Staggs also earned plenty of kudos for his shut-down role on dangerous Dingo Lucas Walmsley.

For the Dingoos, it was the Ades boys – Danny and Jack – leading the fightback, while co-captains Trav La Rocca and Jackson Peet also starred.

ROUND 6 PREVIEW

Bentleigh V East Malvern (Bentleigh Reserve)

A massive battle is set to unfold at Arthur Street on Saturday with the all-conquering East Malvern taking on the in-form Bentleigh.

Remarkably, just one win separates the top-of-the-ladder Panthers and the sixth-placed Bentleigh, further highlighting the evenness of the Division 1 competition.

The Demons will be cock-a-hoop after their stirring victory over the reigning premiers a fortnight ago, and they will enter this clash confident they can knock over another premiership contender. However, they will need to increase its scoring output (its 300 points for in five games trails the five sides above it) if it is to best the highest scoring team in the competition.

East Malvern have been very impressive so far in 2018, with their disappointing loss to St Pauls in Round 3 the only blot on the copybook. Their top-end talent continues to lead the charge and get the job done, with Chris Carey and Luke Duffy among the best afield for Southern in last week's interleague victory over North Central.

If Bentleigh brings the same intensity at the contest it did last round, and convert its chances in front of goal, it is a big chance to win the game, however, the gut feel says East Malvern in a close one.

East Malvern by six points.

Cheltenham V Oakleigh District (Jack Barker Oval)

Cheltenham and Oakleigh District are two sides that have found the going tough early doors, but both are now on the board following last-start victories.

For the Rosellas it was sweet relief. Tipped by many as likely finalists in 2018,

they suffered some disappointing losses in the first four weeks, and they would be hoping their victory over Port Colts is the catalyst to turn their season around.

The Districts have had inconsistencies, both week to week and within games, as they look to blood kids into the senior side, however, their incredible victory over the previously unbeaten St Pauls is the sort of thing that can really galvanise a playing group.

If Cheltenham are fair dinkum about playing finals this season, then this is a game they simply cannot afford to lose. Oakleigh will no doubt give a good account of themselves, particularly if they can bring they same manic pressure as last week, but at home the Rosellas should be too good.

Cheltenham by 13 points.

St Pauls V Mordialloc (McKinnon Reserve)

After four impressive wins to start the year, St Pauls were brought back to earth with a shock loss to bottom-placed Oakleigh District. This is a loss the club would be desperate to put behind them and bounce back from.

Mordi, meanwhile, look as though they are finally beginning to gel, with their victory over the strong St Kilda City two weeks ago their best of the year to date.

St Pauls are one of the most dangerous teams in the League if they can get the game played on their terms and are able to run and spread. The Bloods, however, will look to take a leaf out of Oakleigh's book by bringing the defensive pressure and trying to lock the ball in at every opportunity, which will not only bring their big-bodied mids into the game but also restrict the space available for the Dogs.

Given their ability to run over the top of sides in the last quarter, if St Pauls are within a kick or two at the final change, you'd just about back them in the get the chocolates, however, I reckon Mordi will have done enough in the first half to hold on in a thriller.

Mordialloc by 10 points.

Dingley V St Kilda City (Souter Oval)

The Saints failed their biggest test last week, dropping their first game for the year on home soil against last year's runners-up, and the degree of difficulty is lifted again this week as they travel to the Village to take on the reigning premiers.

The Dingoos are also coming off a surprise home loss to Bentleigh, and you would have to go back a fair way to find the last time this side dropped two consecutive games at the Den. Expect there to be no complacency this week as they look to return to the winner's list.

City's form has certainly been a surprise this year, and a win here would establish Richard Houston's men as legitimate contenders, but it's tough to see them rolling the Dingoos on their home deck.

Dingley by 24 points.

Chelsea Heights V Port Melbourne Colts (Beazley Reserve)

This standalone Sunday match is not only an important clash for both Chelsea Heights and Port Colts, but it also has plenty of off-field significance.

The Heighsters will be hosting a Kick It for Cancer fundraiser in support of the Peter MacCallum Foundation, an initiative driven by Callum Dodson following his own personal cancer battle.

On the field, however, this one looms as an interesting battle between the last two Division 2 premiers. Both sides sit in the bottom four – they are two of the four sides with a 1-4 record – and the four points here would be very advantageous in the battle to avoid relegation.

The Colts will be competitive, but Chelsea Heights have proven a tough side to beat at Beazley Reserve, and this home ground advantage should see them over the line.

ROUND 5 REVIEW

Southern has claimed its third consecutive senior interleague title after seeing off a spirited fightback from North Central FL to run out winners by nine-points in an entertaining clash at Boort Park.

It was an entertaining, free-flowing contest from start to finish, with Southern leading from go to woah, despite North Central rallying late to ensure a thrilling finish.

The visitors grabbed the early ascendancy, booting seven of the first eight goals of the match, five of which came in a dominant opening term.

The pressure applied by the Southern boys was simply outstanding, not allowing the hosts any easy possessions and continually forcing them to cough the ball up.

North Central awoke halfway through the second term and began to capitalise on Southern skill errors, and the resulting five goals in 15 minutes helped them get back into the contest.

The third term was a bit of a grind with the defensive pressure lifting on both sides, but Southern broke through with two majors late in time on to push out to a 21-point advantage at the final change.

But the hosts weren't done and booted the first three goals of the last quarter to get back within one point at the 10-minute mark and send a scare through the Southern camp.

With the challenge laid down by the fast finishing North Central, Southern found another level. The industrious Luke Duffy slotted his second major of the day in the shadows of time on before Jordy Peryman ran into an open goal two minutes later to seal a memorable victory.

East Malvern ruckman Chris Carey was tremendous all day for the winners, working hard both in the air and around the ground to be a deserved winner of the Best on Ground medal.

Cheltenham spearhead Josh Fox staked his claims for the medal with a brilliant five-goal haul, while Dingley speedster Lucas Walmsley was a prolific ball winner. Fellow Dingo Jackson Peet, Panthers star Luke Duffy and Mordialloc veteran Clint Proctor also had a profound impact on the result.

Earlier, the Southern Under 19s succumbed to a late push by North Central, going down by eight points in a nail-biting curtain raiser.

There was little separating the two sides from much of the opening half, with North Central holding a three-point lead at the long break.

Southern managed to gain the ascendancy in the third term, booting three unanswered goals to take a 15-point lead into the final stanza.

But with their backs to the wall, North Central came out all guns blazing, booting 3.5 to 0.0 – including two goals in the final three minutes of the match – to steal victory at the 11th hour.

Oakleigh District's Gianluca Cappiello was an obvious winner of the Best on Ground medal with the hard-running midfielder showing his opponents a clean pair of heals all afternoon.

Dingley ruckman Josh Hicks also stood out, while St Kilda City's Taj Lewis and Parkmore / Springvale Districts Alan Suna were terrific in defence. Skipper Jacob Bakes was also among the better players.

NORTH CENTRAL 45 V SOUTHERN 35

It was with a great deal of excitement and optimism that the girls of the South boarded the Boort bound bus to play this year's Interleague fixture. Coach Mel Aitken had prepared the team well and they felt ready.

There was next to no knowledge of what North Central would throw up to play against it. Experience of Interleague battles past had led team management to think that they would probably be faced with a side taller than theirs, but the team decided to focus on their own strengths. Though short on height, the South were able to field a side that was fleet of foot and slick of ball movement.

As it happened the locals appeared to be more like the South than they had expected, meaning that the match would be a shootout between teams of similar styles. What ensued gave Southern a sense of satisfaction to know that they more than held their own, but disappointment in that a positive result was not forthcoming.

The first quarter was an even affair: Southern on the scoreboard first, North Central replying. The cut and thrust continued until North Central got the first small break in the middle of the quarter, with the local attack threatening to tear the game apart with their deadly shooting accuracy and nimble footwork. Southern restored parity late in the quarter at 9-9 as Leah Seeto started to find her range, but North Central proceeded to net the last four goals of the term to go to the first break 13-9 to the good.

Two moves were made at the first change which led to Southern's best spell of the match. Britt Goldsmith was asked to play off the body of the local goal shooter to counteract her tricky foot movement, and Katie Lindqvist was introduced to the game in the hope that her strength and presence would nullify the North Central wing attack. Both moves worked. North Central were denied the outlet that had served them so well in the first quarter, and as a result the Southern mid-court pulled down intercept after intercept. With Domicia Wescombe running riot at wing attack, the South scored the first 10 goals of the second quarter to thrill the small but enthusiastic travelling support. North Central steadied to a degree in the latter part of the term, but it was the South that went to oranges with a 21-17 advantage.

Whatever was in the locals' Gatorade at half time certainly had an effect. North Central immediately began to run harder than they had in the quarter before, and caught Southern unawares, taking the momentum back from the start and the lead back midway through the third term. North Central's goal shooter was their League's best and fairest last season and she showed that this didn't happen without reason as she shot regularly and missed rarely, while the move of their goal keeper into wing defence immediately bore fruit in providing increased drive from deep in their middle third. Southern appeared to panic and began to push passes that weren't there to push, and it was North Central that began to intercept regularly to create enough chances to go to the last change ahead by 30-26.

With the game on the line it was vital that the South began the quarter well to give themselves any chance of taking the Cup back to Moorabbin. Two more unfortunate turnovers in the opening minutes however led to the margin blowing out to six, and Southern were never able to wrest back the momentum. The South had their moments – nine goals of their own in the last quarter told that story as the players tired and the game began to open up – but in the end the North Central shooters were too adept at taking their opportunities for the South to hold them to a losing total. A late flurry from the Northerners gave the scoreboard a look that belied the efforts that Southern gave to this fixture, a final result of 45-35 not being reflective of the overall pattern of play.

Make no mistake about it; the girls from the South matched North Central in most facets of the game. Domicia Wescombe was rightly adjudged our best player on the day, but all who donned the white, red and blue can hold their heads high. After the race had been run and won, several of the North Central girls remarked that this was the hardest game of netball that they had ever been involved in. That in itself is cause for great satisfaction for the South, and optimism going forward. One more tall option at either end of the court could have made all the difference. There is one thing though that all that saw the game could agree upon; that our League has come a long way in seven years and will only grow in strength as further time passes.

ROUND 6 REVIEW

Cerberus 8.13 (61) def Sandown 5.10 (40)

Cerberus' winning streak has continued on the weekend, overcoming Sandown by 21 points in a game marred by inaccuracy at McAuliffe Oval. Looking for their third win in a row, the Dogs started rather slowly as Sandown jumped out of the blocks to take a 17-point lead at the first change. The scoreboard damage was limited somewhat by Sandown's poor conversion rate, the Cobras spraying their chances to register 2.6 for the term.

A quarter time pep talk allowed the Dogs to regroup and after splitting from the huddle, the home side completely flipped the script. Cerberus started to get the game on their terms, slotting five majors whilst holding Sandown to a solitary point. But once again the team dominating play was unable to fully capitalise, with the Dogs also scoring a wasteful nine behinds for the term. Nevertheless the Dogs went into the main change with a solid buffer having arrested the momentum.

The Cobras wouldn't go away though and after the break fought back to match the Dogs bite. Kicking to the scoring end, Sandown created four scoring chances in the quarter for an improved return of two goals. Crucially the Cobras were also able to restrict the Dogs scoring, with the home side clinging onto a nine point lead at the final break.

Although Sandown were only nine points down, neither side had managed to kick a single goal at their end of the ground for the entire day. And the heavy scoring at one end continued, Cerberus finally shrugging off their plucky opponents with a three goal to one final term. The cosy 21 point victory makes it three wins on the trot for the Dogs and remarkably pushes them into 4th place, edging out Moorabbin on superior percentage.

Cerberus still need to clean up a few areas of their game but the whole group can be pretty satisfied with their performance over the last few weeks. Lyndhurst have endured a scare, surviving a fast finishing Dandenong side by 14 points in an intriguing contest at Greaves Reserve. Heading into the clash against the second place Lightning, not many gave the Redlegs a chance but they came out with a point to prove. On their home deck Dandenong were up for the fight right from the word go, mixing it with the one of the better sides in an even first term.

Two goals apiece for both teams saw the visitors take a slender four point lead with plenty to think about at the quarter time siren. Realising that the Redlegs were going to provide a tough challenge, Lyndhurst switched it up a gear in the second term and dobed four goals to one, taking a 27 point cushion with them. Dandenong continued to fight in the second half but Lyndhurst's class was beginning to shine through as they continued to build on their lead. Coming off an absolute drubbing at the hands of CPL last weekend, the Kangaroos needed to respond and earn back some respect. They started poorly once again with the Dolphins booting six first quarter goals and raising fears of another lacklustre showing. However the Roos got their act together in the second term and started to get into the game.

Moorabbin found plenty of scoring opportunities but squandered many of them, registering 4.7 for the term. Regardless the Roos were right back in the match and crucially seemed to have regained some confidence. All their good work seemed to be undone in the third term though, as Frankston registered three crucial goals to take the momentum with them. The theme of away sides dominating the round continued, with Carrum Patterson Lakes notching up a comfortable 49 point win over Lyndale at Barry Powell Reserve. This was a huge game for the Pumas as a win would have kept them right in contention and possibly pushed them into the top four. Their first quarter suggested that they knew this too, as they came out with purpose and intent to take the early lead over the Lions. In a low scoring scrap, Lyndale's game style was standing up to the best of the best, as both sides locked in a fierce and dour battle.

The main break saw both teams equal on 3.4, with neither side able to wrestle away a solid lead. However all that changed in the premierships quarter as CPL showed their power, blowing away Lyndale with a five goal term whilst restricting the Pumas to a paltry behind. ROUND 7 PREVIEW

Sandown V Moorabbin Kangaroos (Edinburgh Reserve)

The Cobras play host to the Kangaroos when they travel to Edinburgh Reserve on Saturday afternoon. Both sides are coming off losses last round and this game shapes as an interesting contest. Sandown started brightly in their clash against Cerberus but fell away with inaccurate conversion costing them big time. They will be determined to clean up this area of their game if they are to challenge the Roos.

Moorabbin responded somewhat last round, putting in a decent three quarters against the Dolphins to go down in a competitive 16-point loss. Nonetheless that's three losses in a row for the Roos, all to the top three teams, showing the gap in class between them and the better sides. After starting the season 3-0, the Kangaroos now find themselves out of the top four with a weak percentage of 70.61. A win here is crucial for the away side to get their season back on track.

On their home deck, Sandown will provide a good challenge for the Roos. The Cobras have been competitive right throughout the season and are somewhat unfortunate to only have the one win to their name. One of these weeks they are going to pinch a game against a more fancied opposition and this match certainly provides them with a great opportunity. However, the Cobras should be wary of Dylan Bone who returned to form last weekend with a bag of six goals, his third haul of six this year.

Lyndhurst V Cerberus (Marriott Waters Reserve)

Lyndhurst returns to their home fortress to face Cerberus who have some winning momentum behind them. The Lightning are yet to lose a game at home this season with the average winning margin consisting of 46 points. They have been exceptionally impressive all year with the only loss to their name against the undefeated CPL. However, they did endure a scare last round, falling over the line against Dandenong by 14 points after a poor last quarter. With the week off to recharge, the Lightning will be determined to put their scratchy performance behind them and bring their best against the Dogs.

Cerberus are the surprise team of the competition at the moment, stitching together three wins in a row to remarkably put them inside the top four. However they must rise another level if they are to knock off Lyndhurst on their home turf. The Dogs also kicked more points than behinds in their victory over Sandown and can ill afford to waste their chances against the better sides. With the competition hotting up over the crucial fourth spot, expect the Dogs to come to play.

Lyndhurst's Hamish Browning currently sits in fifth place on the competition goal kicking table with 16 majors to his name. He has scored at least one goal in every game to be a consistent contributor all year. The Dogs will need to curb his influence and keep him quiet. Cerberus have no clear spearhead with Shannon Schonewille the clubs leading goal kicked with seven snags. The Dogs instead rely on several contributors to do the bulk of their scoring. They will need all 22 players on song if they are to produce a victory here.

Although the Dogs have won three on the trot, the Lightning are a strong side and will be even stronger on their beloved home deck.

Lyndhurst by 26 points.

Frankston Dolphins V Lyndale (Overport Park)

Frankston will be looking to consolidate their position in the top four when they host Lyndale at Overport Park on Saturday. The Dolphins

have had a cracking start to their first season in the SFNL, sitting at 4-2 with some narrow losses the only minor glitches in their inaugural season.

The Dolphins are the most attacking team in the competition averaging 100.8 points a game. Their entertaining brand of footy has not affected their defensive efforts either, averaging only 55.6 points against. Luke Kirkland has been the standout player so far, comfortably leading the competition goal kicking tally with 30 majors. The Dolphins will be hopeful that his good form continues as they look to register their third win in a row.

In the opposition camp, Lyndale have had a disappointing start to the season. The Pumas sit at 2-4 with their two wins coming against the bottom two sides. They desperately need to claim a big scalp in order to push their finals credentials. Scoring hasn't been much of an issue for Lyndale, sitting fourth for most points scored in the competition with an average of 74.8 a game. However, their defence has leaked almost as many points, conceding an average of 74 a match. If the Pumas can tighten up their defensive structures they are every chance of kicking a winning score.

Lyndale has two players in the top six leading goal kickers in the league with Trevor Kumetaitis (17) and Shane Thomas (15) providing plenty of fire power up forward. For the Dolphins when Luke Kirkland isn't tearing games apart, Benjamin White has also played some consistent football to have 12 goals next to his name after six rounds.

This will be a good game of footy if Lyndale come to play. Frankston are a good football side however and should have too much class for the Pumas at home.

Frankston Dolphins by 20 points.

Carrum Patterson Lakes V Dandenong (Roy Dore Reserve)

This game shapes up as a mismatch on paper with the undefeated Lions hosting the winless Redlegs at Roy Dore Reserve. However, some newfound interest has been generated after Dandenong's gallant defeat to second placed Lyndhurst last round. The Redlegs will take plenty of confidence out of the clash, particularly their last term where they kicked four goals to zip, coming mighty close to running over the top of the Lightning. As daunting as facing the Lions on their home deck is, Dandenong will go in with nothing to lose and look to produce another fright.

CPL were challenged in the first half against the Pumas last round, but brushed them off with ease in the final two quarters to run out 49 point winners. The Lions defensive efforts have been first class this season, allowing only 252 points against at an average of 42 points per game. Round 5 2018

Round 5 in Division 1 gave us an upset result, an old favourite posting their first victory of the season, and the usual suspects flexing their muscle. Netball in the south never disappoints!

Heatherton took on Hampton Park, and this one was done as a contest by 12:15 as Heatherton went to the first break 19-3 to the good. Their height was too much for Hampton Park to counter, and with their mid-court taking complete control the Redbacks couldn't get any traction in this game at all. The lead was extended to 36-11 at the main break, and while Hampton Park hit the scoreboard with a bit more regularity in the second half they could not prevent the premiers from doing the same. Heatherton showed their class in coasting to a 68-32 victory.

Dingley were largely untroubled by a game St Kilda City outfit in scoring a 52-34 victory. The game took on a very Dingley-like pattern with the Dingoes establishing control in taking a six-goal lead at quarter time, and steadily increasing their advantage through the day. Natasha Turner and Rosie Augl posed a steady threat in the attacking goal circle but Dingley are adept at restricting the opportunities of their opponents whilst keeping their own score ticking over, and their lead was extended to fourteen at the main break. The Saints will be happy to have restricted Dingley to 21 goals in the second half while scoring 17 of their own, but the points were safe by this stage and Dingley maintained their position in the division's top echelon.

Keysborough had played a good brand of netball in the first month of the season while not being able to claim victory, but round five proved to be their time as they were too good for St Pauls. The win was based on a 12-3 first quarter as Keysborough settled the quickest, after the opening exchanges were typified by turnovers and missed opportunities. The standard improved in the second term but it was the Burras that rose to the occasion to go to half time in front by 25-12, and their lead was extended to 47-26 turning for home after a free-flowing third quarter. The St Pauls challenge was done by this stage and Keysborough were able to pull away to a convincing 63-35 win.

Mordialloc provided the shock of the round by toppling competition heavyweights Caulfield by 46-38. They established their position by coming out on top of an enthralling first quarter mid-court battle, and their shooters took advantage to the tune of 14-5 at quarter time. Caulfield steadied their ship in the second quarter after frustration had threatened to get the better of them, and won the term convincingly in cutting the deficit to one. This was also the case at the last change with the score at 31-30, but with Sophie Durman expertly creating space and Caity de Garis and Amy Gledhill impassable

in defence, Mordialloc were able to outlast Caulfield to claim a deserved eight goal win.

Dingley and Heatherton lead the pack on 16 points after five rounds, with Caulfield, Mordialloc and St Pauls a win further back on 12. St Kilda City are still well in touch on 8 points, Keysborough 4, and Hampton Park remain yet to open their account.

Caulfield and Cheltenham remain unbeaten leaders in Division 2 with both scoring wins, over Dingley Gold (44-30) and Keysborough (51-38) respectively. Murrumbeena took on South Yarra in the Division 2 match of the day, and their 46-44 victory puts them four points clear in third spot, but watch out for Heatherton. They started the season uncharacteristically slowly, but their 57-24 walloping of Clayton gives them their second straight win and fourth place. Dingley Red stayed in touch by beating Bentleigh by 49-36 in the other match.

Division 3 has started with the two Dingley sides in good shape, with Gold, having been promoted from Division 4, in top spot after their 45-23 win over Lyndale, and Red in third despite losing 41-32 to sixth-placed Black Rock. They are separated by still-undefeated St Kilda City, who beat Mordialloc by 46-33. Heatherton beat Cheltenham by 41-27 to take fourth spot, while Caulfield registered their second victory by 53-19 over Bentleigh.

Murrumbeena have been promoted from Division 5 in the regrading process, and they began their Division 4 campaign by beating Heatherton Black by 41-39 to take pole position and relegate Black to second. CPL and Caulfield Yellow are level with Heatherton Black, having beaten St Kilda City (44-35) and Caulfield Blue (44-26) respectively. Springvale Districts beat Mordialloc by 50-40; they are positioned one win further back with Caulfield Blue and South Yarra (51-26 victors over Caulfield White). Hampton Park meanwhile claimed their first win by beating Keysborough by 44-41.

Oakleigh District scored a commanding 67-25 win over Dingley Red in Division 5, having been promoted from the grade below. They share top billing with Dingley Gold (52-23 winners over Highett), and Aspendale (who beat St Kilda City by 49-25). Lyndhurst (58-22 victors over Cheltenham), and East Brighton (successful by 37-24 over Heatherton) are a win below on 14 points each, while Black Rock registered their first victory by 43-14 over St Pauls.

Mordialloc's Division 7 side move into Division 6 to be known as Mordialloc Red. The promotion evidently did them no harm as they defeated Hallam 52-14 to be perched at the top of the table on 18 points. Lyndale sit two points further back after their 60-17 demolition of winless Bentleigh, while Keysborough (31-19 winners over Caulfield) and Doveton Eagles (50-31 winners over South Yarra), sit another two points further adrift on 14.

Elsewhere Clayton beat Dingley by 36-14, and St Kilda City beat Mordialloc White by 24-21 to keep in touch with the top four.

Lyndhurst and Hampton set the early pace in Division 7. Lyndhurst made short work of Heatherton by 42-10, while Hampton also remained undefeated by beating Aspendale by 33-27. Dingley, who beat Mount Waverley by 48-34, and Murrumbeena, who were too good for Cheltenham by 41-27, make up the top four. CPL showed that they will be a threat to those above them in a comprehensive 46-20 win over Springvale Districts, while relegated East Brighton opened their account in fine style with a 70-36 win over Doveton Eagles.

Hallam Red lead the way in Division 8 after eclipsing Oakleigh District by 46-22. Their closest challengers,

Lyndhurst, had the bye, while Highett maintain the pressure by beating Lyndale by 30-27. Hallam Yellow joined the competition this week after being demoted from Division 7, and they kick-started their season by beating Keysborough by 47-19.

Heatherton 30 defeated Dingley 19 to go top of Division 9, with a two-point lead over Black Rock, who beat Clayton by 63-13, and Lyndhurst, who beat Springvale Districts Blue by 46-21. South Yarra complete the top four after beating Springvale Districts Red by 62-18.

The competition now takes a week off as our Interleague representatives travel to Boort to take on the North Central Netball League. Good luck to all players as we attempt to bring glory to the South.

UMPIRE'S CORNER / THE WHITE KNIGHT

Congratulations to the SFNL Interleague teams that travelled to Boort last week to play the North Central Football League, with our seniors winning and our Under 19s suffering a narrow defeat. The Interleague competition allows our best footballers to display their talents on a big stage, and our umpires also made the most of their opportunities last weekend with seven of our boundary umpires, six fieldies and three goalies in action at venues in Moe, Garfield, Punt Rd Richmond and even the hallowed turf of the MCG.

Five of our members headed to Beaconsfield where the Yarra Ranges FNL played the South East FNL. Tane Abbott, James Aitken and Tim Fierenzi ran in the seniors while Darcy Trewarn and Jacob Curry did the early game. Meanwhile, at Garfield, Mitch Lea ran the boundary in the seniors as the Maryborough-Castlemaine FNL took on the West Gippsland FNL, with Jake Rositani officiating in the curtain-raiser. At Moe, Jason McNiece fronted up for yet another Interleague appearance (it must be at least 20 years since Jason first achieved this honour) along with Jack Cannon (in his first appearance representing the SFNL at Interleague level) as the Murray FNL took on the Gippsland FL, with Nick Ritchie and Josh Mackie running in the early game. Nearer the city, Kaitlin Barr and Damon Kelly ran in the Under 19s at Punt Rd where the Ballarat FL met the Goulburn Valley FNL, while their seniors played next door at the MCG with Tom McGinley waving the flags at football's spiritual home!

Interleague appointments go to umpires who have delivered outstanding on-field performances and who have shown dedication and commitment to training. The same criteria, of course, apply to finals appointments. It is a great experience for our umpires to run with umpires from different leagues, and on different grounds including AFL/VFL venues.

Our umpiring group and the SMJFL umpires' group are continuing to work closely together with Cam Watts managing the SMJFL Umpiring Academy, Nathan Guy looking after the match appointments, Nick Bergman acting as Head Coach, and Courtney Stelling managing the boundary umpires. Other current or former SFNLUA members involved in the coaching panel include Glenn Emery & Matthew Mahoney who coach the more experienced umpires, and Hannah Bailes and Nathan Guy who work with the beginners.

The SMJFL is a great nursery for umpires and Nick Ritchie is a great example of a young umpire making his way up the umpiring pathway. Nick joined the SMJFL in 2015 and started running the boundary in the SFNL in 2016. He umpired the SMJFL Under 15 Div 4 Grand Final that year as well as running the boundary in our Under

19 Grand Final. Last year, he was selected as both a field and goal umpire for the SMJFL Interleague squad, as well as umpiring the SFNL Under 19 Grand Final, while this year, he has already achieved Interleague honours.

There are close to 50 umpires running games in both the SMJFL and SFNL, with many of them still in the early stages of their umpiring careers. First year umpires are closely mentored and gently eased into the dark arts of umpiring, and, if they have the interest and the ability, they can quickly progress from umpiring at Under 11 and 12 level through to the Under 17s. The SMJFL is very flexible with how it appoints umpires so that our younger umpires can both play and umpire on the same day.

If any senior umpires would like to help out by running with, and/or observing our young umpires of the future, Nick Bergman will be delighted to make appropriate arrangements with you. If you have young relatives, students or neighbours, why not suggest to them that they can earn good pocket money and get fit at the same time while umpiring in the SMJFL. The SMJFL umpires train at Moorleigh reserve on Monday and Wednesday evenings and at Elsternwick Park (field umpires only) on Monday evenings.

When umpiring junior matches, a wise umpire will be careful in what he or she says to the youngsters in case a comment is misinterpreted. Some years ago, the White Knight was umpiring an Under 14 game and said to a player creeping over the mark, "Come back a metre please, son". "I'm not your son," replied the lad. Quick as a flash I responded, "How do you know?", only to realise that I was standing about three metres inside the boundary fence and most of the players mothers were in earshot. The looks on their faces told me that I had made a minor error of judgement in my comment!

Two weeks ago, we participated in Community Umpiring Round, and, hopefully, consolidated our relationships with coaches and club officials. Umpires in senior games (and particularly field umpires) are very strongly encouraged to stay behind for at least one beverage (coffee, soft drink, or perhaps something stronger) and have a quiet chat with the coaches and/or players from the leadership groups of the competing clubs. The relationships that you form while socialising after a game will make umpiring those clubs much easier in the future, as players and coaches realise that umpires are actually real people too!
