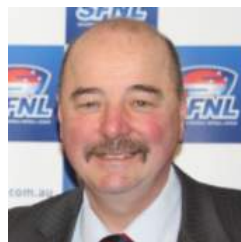

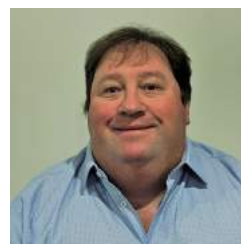

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

MARC GAUCI CHAIRMAN

It is with great pleasure that I present my 2021 annual report to the Southern Football Netball League (SFNL) members and stakeholders in what has been yet another challenging year, but as you will also hear a quite a rewarding year for us all.

This is my 13th year on the Board and 4th year as League Chair and I have 2 years left in my current tenure.

In our 29th year, it was a great challenge for us all at the League to work efficiently with our 37 clubs plus our Umpires, approximately 6000 participants (Senior Men, Under 19 and Women's Football and Netball and our 450 umpires), AFL Victoria, our RSEA Park Co-tenants and our 11 Local Government Authorities (LGAs) to produce what in the end was one of our best seasons ever despite only playing two-thirds of the season.

We should all be very proud of our continued collaborative and collegiate approach and I feel we gained a much greater respect for each other as a result.

Next year we have the great privilege to collaborate with you to celebrate our 30th year as the SFNL and our 10th year of operating Netball.



Living our Values

Living through our values continues to be the constant thought in all our actions and we call upon these values in our decision making.

We hold ourselves and the League accountable to the values of

- Trust
- Accountability
- Inclusiveness
- Innovation

Stand out achievements for 2021

- We have re-contracted our CEO for a further 3 years.
- Transport Accident Commission's (TAC) Club Rewards Program – Total grants of \$139,500 achieved through partnership for 20 of our clubs – the highest engagement rate by any Victorian League
- We successfully managed our Staff / Clubs through all COVID issues
- We dramatically reduced Club debt – reduced by approx. 60% from 2020
- We have two new clubs for 2022– Doveton Doves (38th) Cranbourne Eagles (39th)
- We started the SFNL Development Squad with St Kilda Football Club in May 2021 - a 10-week program for male and female football players aged from 18-22. It's aimed at helping the players develop their skills, fitness and education.
- We engaged Travis Switzer for the Club Development Program – Club Health check interviews which every Club participated in.
- We held our first ever off-site board meeting and strategy day in July at the Cerberus Naval Base
- PlayHQ /GameDay – we remained with GameDay for 2022 after consultation with the 6 other Metro Leagues
- We negotiated RSEA stage 2 design to meet our requirements (Storage and Canteen)
- We successfully applied for \$114K government grants (JobKeeper & Business grants)
- We gained agreement to manage the Springvale District Netball Association (SDNA) for 2022+ (2+2 years)
- We carried out 5 club Salary Cap Audits (a first for this League)

Achievements against our strategic plan 2020-2022

The four pillars of the current Strategic plan are:

- League and Club Sustainability
- Participation
- Facilities
- Governance and Our People

We will always remain focused on delivery of our core promise - having the most inclusive competitive and fair football and netball participation in the Southern community and in 2021 we have particularly focussed positive efforts on our other pillars of League and Club sustainability and Governance and Our People.

I would like at this point to make a particular call out to our League CEO Lee Hartman and staff on their leadership and resilience in very trying conditions. In particular, Lee has always maintained a proactive positive engagement with all Clubs and his team and also spent an inordinate amount of time in talking with all our stakeholders to update and keep them focused on finding the positives out of the challenges being presented due to Covid19.

With the benefit of the learnings from the Club Development Program, our Board will be well prepared in 2022 to;

- Have a deeper understanding of the business of the League.
- Gain a deeper appreciation of the value driven by League management and administration

We hold ourselves accountable

The key statistics we use to assess Board effectiveness is harmony, stakeholder satisfaction, making sure Board member skills match League requirements and all of this is underpinned by;

1. Achieving our Strategic plan – Currently from 2020 to 2022 and refreshed annually
2. Achieving our Budget – Annually
3. Living to our Values – Trust, Accountability, Inclusiveness, and Innovation
4. Empowering our CEO to achieve the annual KPIs
5. Board attendance rate - CY21 has full Board member attendance rate on 11 out of 13 occasions
6. Average Tenure of Board members - 6 years
7. Diversity – We will always work diligently to address more female participation on our Board and diversity across the whole organisation and League
8. League requirements vs Board member skills – Consistent review to ensure any current /future requirements are planned for

Themes we will follow to support our 2022 Goals

- Values – Trust, Accountability, Inclusiveness, and Innovation – These are being lived throughout every level of the League
- Point of Difference – We have established a clear point of difference which can easily be articulated and is understood by all, it drives attracting people and sponsors to the League (acquisition), retention, stability, sustainability, and growth
- Pathways for success – On and off field - Junior to Youth to Seniors, this underpins our future
- Environment – Set up for Success – Games which are competitive and fair, with welcoming Clubs and facilities across the entire League
- Structured for success – The now and the future - Board, Club Committees, structured for success and look to succession planning (consider a Graduate program for Clubs to gain potential committee people)
- Communicating with success – we know our fans, their ages, their likes and dislikes, preferred communication channels - we will do this in the most effective and efficient way
- Improved governance and reduced administration – via tools such as GameDay, PlayHQ, TeamApp
- Presidents drive our success and need to be empowered – Welcoming new Presidents – consider a President mentor group
- Volunteers and fans – they are the heart of our success
- History and heritage, and youth - an important part of our future – all of which guide our growth and should be celebrated

Club Development Program – Our focus areas for 2022

1. Junior Football Development - Boys and Girls – Pathways Auskick to Seniors
2. Planning - Strategic/Business/Financial/Constitutions/Committee and Meeting Structures
3. Volunteering - How to recruit and retain volunteers
4. Facility improvements - Ensuring each club has a plan and support to advocate for funding
5. Revenue Raising and Marketing/Communications Options

MarCom – Social Media review and outcomes planned for 2022

We are committed to continue to drive for a clear and demonstrable point of difference for our league over others

Noting that the journey has already started with

- Player Development Squad with St Kilda Football Club (only league doing this)
- Mental Health and Wellbeing pilot with VicHealth / Gamechanger (including funding)
- SFNL only league in Victoria chosen for 2021 pilot program by VicHealth
- League flexibility (can enter 1 team if desired) not compulsory to enter teams in all grades
- Offers participation at all senior levels with relevant competitive balance

We will promote Team App as the priority platform and aggregator of content as this utilises content from GameFace / Website / GameDay / GameDay Digital Record links in the background

We will have a clear MarCom, Communications and Social media strategy that can be easily understood by our Fans

We also have some very challenging universal “Inclusiveness” initiatives that we can take on the ownership to be able to explain and manage for our Clubs.

We have a very big year planned for 2022 and look forward to returning to the fields and courts in 2022 and delivering an even better result next year.

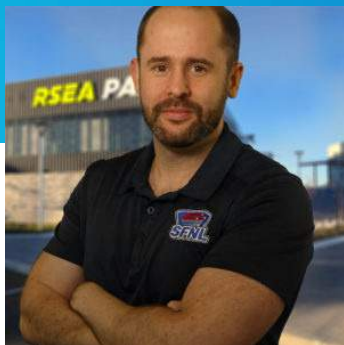
Thank you to Glenn Carter from GameFace and his team for looking after our media once again in 2021, a great job also in a challenging year.

FOOTBALL REPORT

DAVID JENNINGS

GENERAL MANAGER - OPERATIONS

The disappointment of a cancelled 2020 season was met with excitement as football returned to the Southern region for the first time since the 2019 Division 1 Grand Final. A total of 559 days had passed before season 2021 got underway with a number of teams participating in Good Friday matches.

One of the highlights of 2021 was the introduction of three new Member Clubs to the League. We welcomed the Casey Thunder in Division 1 and Division 2 Women's football, Narre South Saints to Division 3, Under 19's and Thirds competitions and South Mornington to Division 3. All Clubs hit the ground running in 2021 and have added to the fabric of the Southern Football Netball League.

This year was not without its challenges as we experienced an interrupted campaign with snap lockdowns throughout the season but still managed to complete two thirds of all fixtured football matches. With the last lockdown extending into September, we were unfortunately unable to deliver a Final Series. The early ending to our season was certainly not for a lack of trying.

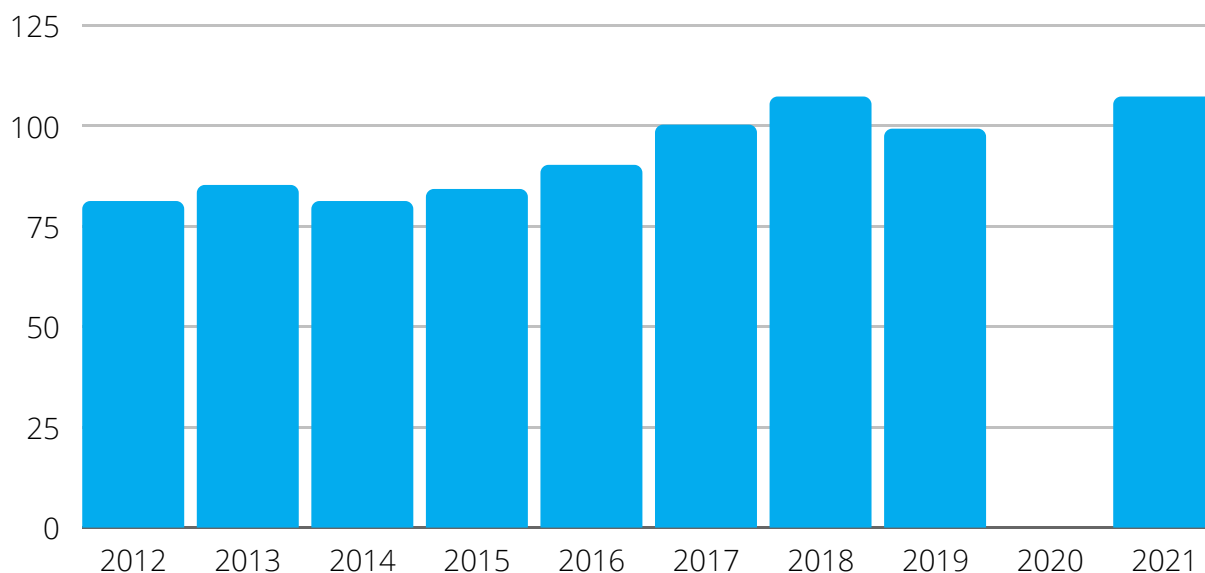
Thank you to all the wonderful people that make up our League. The team has greatly appreciated your support, patience and understanding whilst we worked through the challenges of COVID-19. The past eighteen months has only emphasised the importance of what local sport means to our Southern community. For everyone passionately involved in our game, your demonstrated resilience, desire and efforts to get your teams onto the field in a safe manner is greatly appreciated.

Competition Growth

The SFNL provided the opportunity for 4,125 registered participants to play in organised community football made up of 3,325 male players (to have played at least one game) from 37 clubs and 93 teams and 409 female players (to have played at least one game) from 12 clubs and 14 teams.

The League achieved an overall 8% increase in team numbers from 2019 with 107 teams being entered across 13 grades of football. An outstanding effort to our Member Clubs following the cancelled season which equalled our best result in 2018.

Tribunal and MRP

On-field behaviour this year has been outstanding. Whilst a couple of serious incidents had created headlines throughout the season, these incidents remain isolated.

The SFNL Independent Tribunal was Chaired by Andrew Lefebvre who was ably supported by nine panel members over the course of the season. Kim Brimelow returned as the League Prosecutor and continued to provide invaluable support in the prosecution of cases.

The MRP also returned for its second season following its first introduction in 2019. The Panel reviewed incidents picked up by official League footage throughout the year and had the power, if deemed appropriate, to lay a charge to be heard by the Independent Tribunal or recommend a set penalty based on the Laws of Australian Rules.

The League would like to thank the entire Independent Tribunal, Kim Brimelow and the MRP for their commitment and dedication to the League.

Independent Tribunal and MRP Summary.

- A total of 16 Tribunal hearings were held in season 2021.
- There were 44 reports this season with a total of 109 weeks of suspensions handed down to 40 players.
- 33 reports were made by the officiating Umpire(s) and 11 came via the Match Review Panel.
- A total of 33 Set penalties were accepted by players coming from 18 Umpire Reports and 13 MRP reports.

Club Sustainability Program

The 2021 season marked the sixth year of the state-wide Community Club Sustainability Program (CCSP) with the enforcement of both the Player Points System (PPS) and Player Payment Rules for all senior men's football competitions.

2021 SFNL Player Points Allocation

The League assessed a total of 3,628 male participants and allocated a player points value between one and six which is determined by the level of football that player has played over the current and previous three seasons. Each senior team in the SFNL were allocated a maximum player points cap of 47 per match for the season which remains unchanged from 2018.

The below table outlined the averages for all senior men's teams by division and final ladder positions for the 2021 season.

2021 SFNL Player Payment Allowance (Salary Cap).

In line with the initiatives of the AFL Victoria Community Club Sustainability Program, and with the support from Member Clubs, there was an average 38% reduction to the Player Payment Allowance for football across all divisions for season 2021. This is outlined in the table on the right.

As per the AFL Victoria Player Payment Rules, should a round be abandoned, then the Allowable Player Payment Caps shall immediately be calculated on a pro rata of games played'. Therefore, the player payments had been pro-rated for the 12 games played in season 2021. The final Player Payment Allowance is outlined for all respective grades in the table below.

NETBALL OPERATIONS COORDINATOR

After several false starts in 2020, with no games being played at all, it was fantastic to get back on the courts in 2021.

Due to the break in our lives, there were some new Clubs that weren't able to get up and running in time for the season opener.

However, we welcomed Port Melbourne Colts FNC with 3 teams. Springvale Districts FNC entered a mammoth 8 teams in 2021 and congratulations must go to Marjorie Quiamboia and Deborah Thompson for all their hard work in managing this number of girls and getting coaches for all their teams. 29 clubs were represented on the netball courts with 87 teams, down from 100 in 2019. This was still enough to have 10 separate divisions.

The season commenced earlier in March where 2 weekends were dedicated to grading in the form of a round robin. This trial operated as shortened 15-minute games where clubs got to play 8 other teams. Once results were analysed the grades were established and Round 1 started the same day as the football, after Easter on 10th April.



There were many rescheduled matches throughout the season, through the co-operation between clubs, to allow those with home courts to play alongside their football teams. The 2 new netball courts at Ben Kavanagh Reserve, Mordialloc got a good work out.

Rowan Rd Dingley courts also played host to several mid-week games under lights. Thanks must go to the Springvale & District Netball Association committee to support these games. Julie Pool, Shannon Fox and Claire Houben offered their time to open the clubrooms and set up the lights and were there to pack up when the games finished.

South Yarra FNC was host for the Pride Cup in 2021 and their senior netball team, in A2 grade, played a competitive game against Heatherton FNC at the Rowan Rd courts. The trophy was presented to the captain of Heatherton, Ruby Farthing, and her team by Board member, Garry Cranny.

The League introduced a membership fee to help develop our coach and umpiring programs. At the start of the season less than 50% of our nominated coaches had any formal accreditation or their level had expired over the years.

We were able to get 100% of our coaches updated or re-accredited through online training and running a face-to-face workshop at RSEA Park for our Development level coaches. Congratulations to Chris Dent, (Murrumbeena), Mel Quigley (Parkdale Vultures), Ua Houkamau (Port Melbourne Colts), Don Tulley (Cheltenham) and Barb Traeger, Tanya Hiscock, Julie Masterton, Bella Whitton (Caulfield Bears) for their achievement in 2021.

Our umpiring program included inviting A grade level umpires to mentor our umpires wanting to advance their skills and badge levels. We had 3 young umpires achieve their C badges this year under the senior guidance of Jenny Thomas, Maree Danastasio and Amy Gifford. Congratulations to Caitlyn Van Elewoud (Dingley), Simone Genovese (South Yarra) and Sienna Quinn (Heatherton) who umpired every week to improve their experience and knowledge. This is a critical area that needs to be focused on for 2022, as over the past 2 years the volunteer umpiring numbers have reduced for various reasons.

As for playing the game of netball, we were lucky to get to play 12 out of the 16 fixtured games so 14 weeks all up. Due to the stop/start of the season a couple of times the fixtures had to be tweaked as we went. The first interruption meant that teams would miss out playing other teams in their grades altogether. We were able to move round 8 and 9 games to round 15 and 16 to solve this however there were still a couple of instances where teams didn't get to meet at all.



Everything was looking up for a bumper finals draw with many grades having all top 4 teams within a couple of points of each other. With the uncertainty as to when we would play, the finals were reduced from 3 weeks down to 2. Alas, the finals were cancelled altogether in the end so teams finishing at the top of the ladder at the end of the home and away season were acknowledged as Minor Premiers.

Whilst a disappointing end to the 2021 season a number of players were recognised for their outstanding skills. Best and Fairest votes from throughout the season resulted in medals winners being announced at our inaugural online Presentation Night. The concept was well accepted and we had 2100 views on the night.

In closing, I want to thank the great support from all the club volunteers in their communication to me and between each other to ensure that games went ahead every week. A special mention to Annaliese Neal, Black Rock FNC, who was awarded the SFNL Netball Administrator of the Year.

A special mention to the ladies that run the competition on a Saturday. Lyn Wilcosz in the office, on announcements and timing of the games, and Kim Pentreath who manages the umpires every week and is out on the courts supervising them, as well as monitoring the spectator behaviour. Both these ladies devote their time, and have since 2012, to the SFNL netball competition and I couldn't do it without them.

Looking forward to a special 2022 netball season and what that may look like.



UMPIRING REPORT

As Season 2021, ended abruptly after such a promising rebound from no footy in 2020, there was still a lot to like from an Umpiring perspective.

Numbers and filling appointments was always going to be a crucial area to address and with no footy the previous year our retention rate was tested. Like all competitions, Umpire numbers were down and although we recovered from a slow start in Feb when we returned to training, our ability to cover all games was truly challenged. By the close of the year, we had 270 umpires on our books and moving forward will need to increase our pool of Field and Boundary Umpires by 30% respectively.

Pleasing was the adaptation of all members to help out and albeit 1 or 2 fixtures were covered, a far better result than many other competitions.

We saw Div 3 and 4 Reserve Football play without Boundary Umpires and this may become the norm moving forward as logistically and demographically our pool is stretched. One huge upside was our continual relationship with the SMJFL and their Umpiring body which forms a pathway for aspiring young umpires to move into Senior football whilst we as a Senior body provide the bulk of their coaches and mentors.

I was able to retain and grow our coaching team and to all those people, well done on a difficult year and your support was much appreciated. The front office was again supportive of all Umpiring issues and with new Chum Luke Henry on board did a great job week in week out.



Lee and David strongly demanded Respect and Zero tolerance to abuse to Umpires and although we had 1 or 2 incidents thru out the season, overall the wider Football Community within the SFNL have acknowledged we must support Umpiring more and that was evident with Tribunal Support and as I moved around on Match day I feel we are getting there. Moorleigh Reserve proved to be a wonderful training facility and can only be better once Covid restrictions are lifted for 2022.

We had good support from The SFNLUA led by Travis Thompson and we actively participated with all AFL Vic programs and provide pathway opportunities for our younger members thru the Academy Program working closely with the Sandringham Dragons in the Nab League. So like the Clubs we need to take a deep breath, stay connected with our groups and look to retain firstly and then recruit heavily thru schools, junior competitions, target ex players and all other avenues like athletic clubs etc.

In closing, our group were prepared and ready to engage in the Final Series and I was more than confident we would have performed admirably.

I look forward to returning in 2022 and bounce back from a tough 2 years. Stay well and safe, don't give up, Footy will return

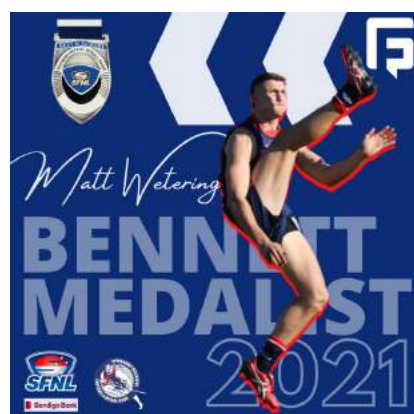

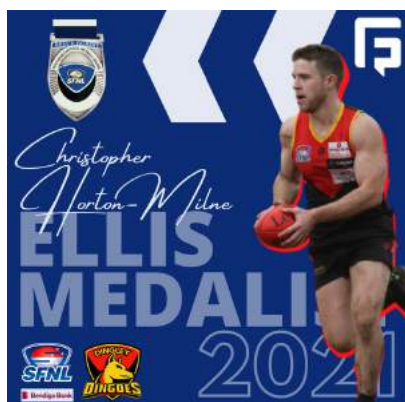

FINANCE REPORT

PAUL SHOEBRIDGE TREASURER

The SFNL 2021 financial results achieved a surplus of \$48,306 which was a significant turnaround from the deficit for 2020 of \$115,667 due to the cancellation of the 2020 season.

Highlights of our 2021 results are:

- Our turnover of \$1,416,940 was an increase of 125% from \$629,112 in 2020. In 2021 we were able to complete 12 out of 18 rounds of football in another difficult year dealing with the Covid 19 pandemic. We also had to cancel our finals series for the second year in a row.
- Government grants, AFL grants and Jobkeeper totalling \$184k in 2021 had a positive impact on our revenue for the year. This was \$64k lower than the important assistance we received in 2020 but was still significant this year.
- Media income decreased by \$30k from 2019 levels, the increase of 2 clubs was offset by the 6 rounds which were not played and the credits that were issued as a result.
- The margin for merchandise sales increased by \$36k from 2020 and was back in line with the 2019 result. This was aided by the increase in 2 clubs and a new women's football club.
- Umpiring income has fallen \$166k or 46% on 2019 levels due to the cancelled games in 2021 and lower umpire rates agreed with the umpire's association for 2021.
- Our sponsorship income increased by \$22k or 21% from 2019 due to the partnership with Bendigo Bank Bayside Cluster.

There was a corresponding increase in the League's expenses to \$1,368,634 in 2021 which was an increase of \$623,865 or 83% from 2020. Some of the items of note are:

- Umpiring, filming of games expenses, netball costs and other game costs moved in line with the related income reflecting the reduced number of rounds played in 2021.
- The cost of merchandise increased by \$45k in line with increased sales.
- Full Insurance costs of \$110k were paid this year despite the reduced number of games. This is an increase of \$13k or 14% over 2019 levels reflecting the increased participation in the number of clubs and teams in 2021.
- Administration costs increased \$52k or 11% from 2020 but were in line (1% higher) than 2019. This is mainly due to employee costs returning to normal levels for the year.

The Balance Sheet continues to demonstrate a strong net asset position in line with previous years. Our club receivables reduced to the lowest level in many years. This represents the great effort put in by our clubs during these last two difficult years to reduce their debt. We had several clubs who carried debt for the last few years who were able to clear that debt fully in 2021. Congratulations to those clubs that were able to improve their financial positions over the past year.
